Sweeney: New Jersey unlikely to extend property tax filing deadline

New Jersey is on the verge of moving its income tax filing deadline because of the coronavirus pandemic, but Senate President Steve Sweeney said today that homeowners shouldn't expect their May 1 property tax filing deadline to be pushed back.

"There's some challenges there ... that have to be looked at. But I don't see them deferring the property taxes," Sweeney said during a call with reporters.

Instead, Sweeney said he hopes towns — which depend on property taxes to fund schools and other services — will waive or reduce interest penalties for late property tax payments.

"Hopefully towns will invent a policy where if you can demonstrate you've been unemployed ... they reduce the interest or eliminate the interest," Sweeney said. "People like myself who continue to work or be paid by their employers, I've got to pay my taxes just like anyone else."

Gov. Phil Murphy has also been [hesitant](#) to delay the property tax filing deadline.

The Senate today passed a bill, [NJ S2338 \(20R\)](#), to delay the state's income tax filing deadline from April 15 to July 15, matching a postponement of federal taxes. It's scheduled for an Assembly vote later this afternoon. Murphy plans to sign the measure once it reaches his desk.

To deal with the fiscal crisis brought about by the coronavirus pandemic, the state also froze homestead property tax rebates.

Good evening, Senator Gopal.

I hope this message finds you and your family in good health.

I am writing to you out of extreme concern for our students and staff as they continue to grapple with the stress of teaching and learning during a global pandemic and State of Emergency.

Yesterday, the New Jersey Department of Education released a Broadcast containing details about dates and technical assistance sessions for Spring 2021 New Jersey Student Learning Assessments for both in-person and fully remote students. The broadcast can be accessed here: <https://www.nj.gov/education/broadcasts/2021/jan/27/Spring%202021%20NJSLA%20ELA%20Mathematics%20and%20Science%20Important%20Activities%20and%20Key%20Dates.pdf>

As an advocate for my students and my staff, I have to express my concerns and disappointment with the decision to move forward with State Assessments in Spring 2021. While I realize that there is state accountability to the federal government for funding that is related to annual state assessments, I know that we can do better than "business as usual" annual state assessments to answer questions regarding academic achievement during a pandemic.

While I know you are not the final decision-maker regarding state assessments, I am contacting you as someone who represents the students and staff of Colts Neck. As Superintendent, I would be happy to have a conversation with you to describe the good things that are happening in our district as well as how we are addressing areas of academic performance that are in need of support. I believe Monmouth County is filled with the best teachers, support staff, and administrators who, if given an opportunity, could provide better ways to use their time and resources to support students during this crisis than to prepare for the Spring 2021 NJSLA.

As always, I truly appreciate your time and I would welcome any opportunity to speak with you about this concern.

2) There was a 25 million dollar increase in the state budget for extraordinary special education funding for districts like Asbury Park

3) We introduced a bill today for a full review and update of S2. I have copied my policy director Aislinn, once we have the bill number we will share with you. Ais pls respond all when appropriate with details of the bill. Once the bill goes through, which we will push for it to happen quickly, we will get clarity on the status of any concerns related to S2.

4) Through the federal cares act, Asbury Park schools will get funding. The City of AP will get 10 million dollars which hopefully they will partner with the BOE on for shared expenses.

2) Fufill is available to help families in financial need right now. — [NJ A3095 \(20R\)](#): Provides county clerks with additional week to mail ballots for 2020 primary election;

— A3839: Makes supplemental appropriation of \$20 million from General Fund to DOE to support school facility cleaning and sanitization;

— A3840: Requires school districts to provide school meals or meal vouchers to students eligible for free and reduced price school meals during school closures due to Covid-19 epidemic;

— A3841: Extends time to file gross income tax or corporation business tax return by one month;

— A3843: Requires health insurance and Medicaid coverage for testing and treatment of the coronavirus disease 2019, and for telemedicine during the coronavirus disease 2019 state of emergency;

- A3844: Concerns business interruption insurance during the coronavirus disease 2019 state of emergency;
- A3846: Creates "Temporary Lost Wage Unemployment Program" to allow persons to claim for lost wages due to the coronavirus disease 2019;
- A3847: Provides paid leave without utilizing accumulated leave for local government employees under certain circumstances;
- A3848: Concerns time off from work in connection with infectious disease;
- A3849: Permits public agency to respond to request for government record within 21 calendar days during period of emergency or other exigency;
- A3850: Allows local government agencies to meet electronically during declared Public Health Emergency or State of Emergency;
- A3851: Extends deadlines for adoption of county and municipal budgets under certain circumstances;
- A3852: Allows conduct of state business and legislative sessions at locations other than Trenton during periods of emergency or other exigency, allows conduct of legislative business using electronic means;
- A3855: Requires food access information be displayed on websites of 2-1-1 system and executive branch departments during public health emergencies;
- A3859: Concerns prohibition of residential tenant eviction and eviction due to residential foreclosure during certain emergency circumstances;
- ACR165: Urges DHS to apply for federal waivers to facilitate and increase access to SNAP benefits during the coronavirus disease 2019 outbreak;
- AJR158: Urges FCC to take temporary measures to secure broadband access for those affected by Covid-19.

Human Services

The Department of Human Services sent to county and municipal welfare agencies guidance on enacting cautionary health and safety preventative measures in response to the Coronavirus disease (COVID-19), specifically as it relates to the temporary cessation of certain requirements for the Work First New Jersey (WFNJ) and New Jersey Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (NJ SNAP). The guidance is attached.

Labor

In accordance with Chief Justice Rabner's COVID-19 Notices to the Bar, and in consultation with Workers' Compensation Executive Committee of the NJ Bar Association, Chief Judge of Compensation Russell Wojtenko, Jr. has closed Workers' Compensation courts to the public in a similar fashion as all NJ Municipal Courts and Landlord Tenant Courts.

While those courts are closed for two weeks, operationally it is more efficient and convenient for all attorneys, litigants and court staff to adjourn all WC matters for three weeks as workers' compensation courts routinely operate in three week cycles. A three week adjournment in workers' compensation is a routine and frequent occurrence and will cause a minimal disruption to the WC system if any.

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MVC

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The Department of Human Services's Division of Family Development will implement the following policies, effective immediately:

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- Waive parents/caregivers' child care subsidy co-payments for parents who request it due to impacts from COVID-19;
- Provide child care providers who remain open during this critical time a differential of \$100 per child each month above the state reimbursed rate for children enrolled in the child care subsidy program;

Hi Senator Vin!

My apologies for not promptly responding to your inquiry about fees.

The assembly fees depend upon the number of presentations and the number of students. For Monmouth County schools, my assembly fees are \$750 for one 60-minute assembly; \$1000 for two back-to-back assemblies on the same day; and \$1250 for three assemblies on the same day. I am generally flexible with these fees and more than willing to negotiate, but I feel these are reasonable for a professional school speaker with 38 years of experience.

For those schools *without* auditoriums, where the assemblies need to be in the gym or cafeteria, the maximum number of students per assembly is 200. Any more than that, the speaker can lose control. If the school has a stage in an auditorium that could fit more students, I can have more students attending each program. A few times, I even had 1500 students in a huge auditorium for each of two assemblies — and received over 200 thank-you emails from students.

Schools in other counties require more driving time, so the assembly fees are slightly higher. Assembly fees range from \$850 (1), \$1200 (2), and \$1500 (3) on the same day, for example, at schools in Jersey City or in Bergen County districts. I have spoken at many Jersey City schools in the past, and have even spoken at alternative and vocational schools too.

To see me in action on the first day, I can suggest choosing middle or high schools in a local Monmouth County town, like those in Ocean Township, Red Bank, Long Branch, or Asbury Park, and have a day of my assemblies at schools. We could have a representative from the commissioner's office come to audit them, and send questionnaires to all teachers at the school to get reactions from students and staff within the few days after my visit. Commissioner Repollet looks over these reviews and then I could possibly come in for a prospective interview. I am still very eager to make the "statewide youth ambassador" idea a reality to instill hope, motivation, and inspiration in our students!

Senator Vin, thanks again for your serious consideration and assistance.

P.S. I have received thank-you messages from mothers of the trooper youth following my Wednesday program you attended with Sydney. The mothers reached out to me following the graduation ceremony, and said that, of all the events at the Academy during trooper youth week, their kids could not stop talking about the stories I shared with them!! It's so rewarding to see high school seniors get so excited — not about me — but about themselves and their dreams.

'It is unacceptable for any school district to be singled out for special treatment,' Monmouth Dem Senator says

State Sen. Vin Gopal (D-Long Branch) today blasted Gov. Phil Murphy for offering an additional \$15 million in school funding to Lakewood while cutting state dollars going to schools in his Monmouth County district.

"It is unacceptable for any school district to be singled out for special treatment," said Gopal. "The administration's apparent proposal to divert \$15 million in additional state funding to Lakewood's School District is unfair to the hundreds of municipalities across our State that are working hard to meet their commitments under the new school funding formula."

Lakewood school funding has become a political hot potato in recent years as candidates position themselves to win the endorsement of the Vaad, a council of rabbis and local business leaders with an ability to swing votes.

Gopal said that Eatontown, Freeholder Regional and Ocean Township are set to lose state funds following declines in enrollment.

"I would like to ask the administration to explain how these proposed funding increases for Lakewood were calculated, and work with the Legislature to ensure that our school funding system remains fair and equitable to all New Jersey school districts," Gopal said.

The majority of the 84 school districts in Monmouth and Ocean counties are bracing for a reduction in school funding next year, according to numbers released last week by the state Department of Education.

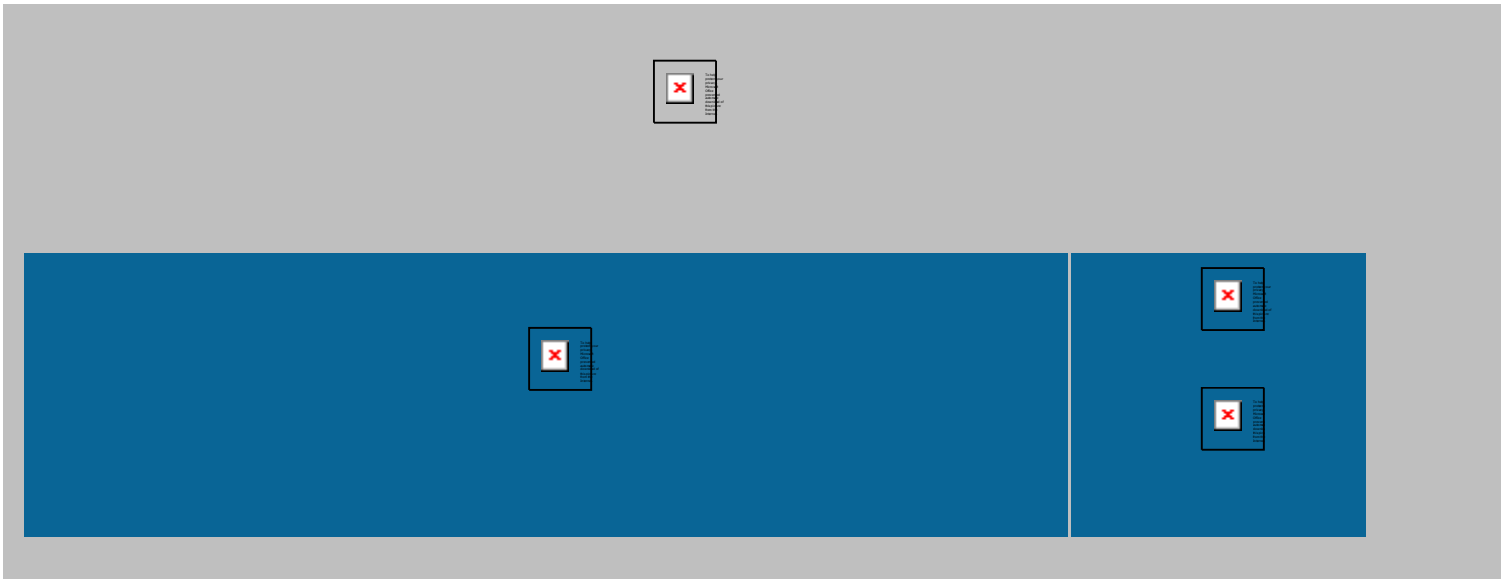
