Hi Vin,

I hope you are doing well. I have a concern regarding the NJDOE guidance document relative to virtual instruction. After surveying the community, I have about 8% who do not want to send their children back to school. The reasons vary, but some parents aren't comfortable doing so. I have the capacity to provide virtual instruction for that 8%, however the NJDOE has clearly stated that virtual instruction can only be provided to students who have underlying medical conditions or students who have family members at home who are

immunocompromised.

There are significant consequences to not providing virtual instruction to students whose parents aren't comfortable sending them to school. First, they will likely withdraw their children from the district and provide homeschooling. This will impact state aid as the register will be reduced. However, parents will send their children back to school when they feel comfortable and we will not be adequately funded to provide them FAPE. Additionally, when students who are homeschooled return, there may be gaps

in their attainment of the NJCCCS as there isn't consistency in the instruction they receive. SEL is a priority in the plan, and if students are not enrolled in the district we can't build relationships among them and monitor their wellness.

I know that several of my colleagues in Monmouth County share my concern that the NJDOE guidance prohibiting students from virtual learning without a medical condition is going to erode public education and negatively impact our children. I ask that this component of the guidance is reconsidered.
