The Township of Pennsauken received your Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request on January 22, 2019. I, as the records custodian received your OPRA request on January 22, 2019, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request was January 31, 2019. A response to your request was provided to you on the 7th business day after the custodian's receipt of said request. This response requested an extension until February 11, 2019. A response was provided on February 11, 2019 requesting an extension until February 21. A response was provided on February 21, 2019 requesting and extension until March 4, 2019. This response is being provided on March 4, 2019.

The attached records are being provided and are responsive to # 1 of your request. Be advised that redactions have been made pursuant to the following:

N.J.S.A.47:1A-1.1. (5)-Victims records.

N.J.S.A.47:1A-1.1. (17)(a)-Social Security numbers

N.J.S.A.47:1A-1.1. (17)(c)-phone numbers

N.J.S.A.47:1A-1.1. (17)(d)-drivers' license numbers

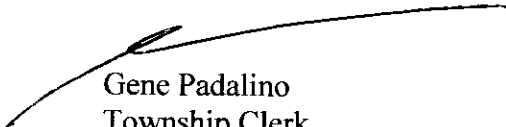
Also be advised that dates of birth have been redacted due to privacy concerns. In Merino v. Ho-Ho-Kus, GRC Complaint 2003-121 (Feb. 18, 2004), the Council addressed the citizen's reasonable expectation of privacy pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1 and found that the New Jersey Supreme Court, Appellate Division held that the GRC must enforce OPRA's declaration, in N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1, that "a public agency has a responsibility and an obligation to safeguard from public access a citizen's personal information with which it has been entrusted when disclosure thereof would violate the citizen's reasonable expectation of privacy." Serrano v. South Brunswick Twp., 358 N.J. Super. 352, 368-69 (App. Div. 2003). See also National Archives and Records Administration v. Favish, 541 U.S. 157, 124 S.Ct. 1570 (U.S. March 30, 2004) (personal privacy interests are protected under FOIA).

In addition, redactions are being made pursuant to Executive Order No. 26 (4) (McGreevey 2002)-“Information related to medical, psychiatric or psychological history, diagnosis, treatment or evaluation.”

2 of your request was previously responded to on February 11, 2019.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the Township of Pennsauken to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
