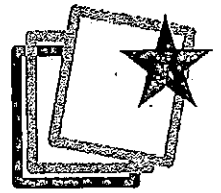

Burnett v. County of Bergen, 198 N.J. 408 (2009). Without ambiguity, the court held that the privacy provision "is neither a preface nor a preamble." Rather, "the very language expressed in the privacy clause reveals its substantive nature; it does not offer reasons why OPRA was adopted, as preambles typically do; instead, it focuses on the law's implementation." "Specifically, it imposes an obligation on public agencies to protect against disclosure of personal information which would run contrary to reasonable privacy interests."

Note that any challenge to a denial of a request for records under the common law cannot be made to the Government Records Council, as the Government Records Council only has jurisdiction to adjudicate challenges to denials of OPRA requests. A challenge to the denial of access under the common law can be made by filing an action in Superior Court.

1. All "government records" as defined in N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1 are subject to public access under the Open Public Records Act ("OPRA"), unless specifically exempt.
2. A request for access to a government record under OPRA must be in writing, hand-delivered, mailed, transmitted electronically, or otherwise conveyed to the appropriate custodian, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(g). In accordance with OPRA, custodians will generally have seven (7) business days to respond, unless:
 - The requestor seeks "immediate access" records as outlined in N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(e); where the custodian must respond "immediately" disclosing responsive records not to exceed twenty-four (24) months old.
 - The requestor seeks information required to be disclosed by N.J.S.A. 47:1A-3(b), where the custodian must respond disclosing the information within twenty-four (24) hours or as soon as practical;
 - The requestor is seeking records for a "commercial purpose" as defined in N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1, where the response time frame is fourteen (14) business days, but the custodian shall notify the requestor of the additional time within seven (7) business days, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(l). However, the response time frame can be reduced to seven (7) business days upon payment of no more than two times the cost to produce the responsive records.
 - The requestor is seeking records requiring review for compliance with "Daniel's Law" (N.J.S.A. 47:1B-1, et seq.), where the response time frame is fourteen (14) business days, but the custodian shall notify the requestor of the additional time within seven (7) business days, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(l).
 - Fire district employing one or fewer full-time employees serving as custodians may add seven (7) business days to the seven (7) or fourteen (14) business day response time frames.

The applicable response time does not commence until the custodian receives the request form, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(h). If you submit the request form to any other officer or employee, the recipient must either forward the request to the appropriate custodian or direct you to the appropriate custodian, Id.

3. Requestors are not required to use this OPRA request form; however, a written equivalent not containing the form requirements of N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(f) and N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(g) may be denied by a custodian.
4. Requestors may submit requests anonymously. A request submitted anonymously shall not be considered incomplete, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(f). If you elect not to identify yourself accurately or provide an accurate address, e-mail address, or telephone number, the custodian is not required to respond until you reappear before the custodian seeking a response to the original request. Further, anonymous requestors are prohibited from filing a complaint with either the GRC or the Courts, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-6.
5. The fees for duplication of a "government record" in printed form are listed on page 1 of this form. The custodian will notify you of any special service charges or other additional charges authorized by State law or regulation before processing your request. Payment shall be made by cash, check or money order payable to the responding agency.
6. You may be charged a prepayment or deposit when a request for copies exceeds \$5.00. The custodian will contact you and advise you of any deposit requirements. You agree to pay the balance due upon delivery of the records.
7. Under OPRA, a custodian must deny access to a person who has been convicted of an indictable offense in New Jersey, any other state, or the United States, and who is seeking government records containing personal information pertaining to the person's victim or the victim's family, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-2.2. This includes anonymous requests for said information.
8. By law, the responding agency must notify you that it grants or denies a request for access to government records within applicable response time frame after the custodian receives the request. If the record requested is in storage, the custodian will advise you within seven (7) or fourteen (14) business days after receipt of the request when the record can be made available and the estimated cost for reproduction within no more than twenty-one (21) business days from date of notification, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(l).
9. You may be denied access to a government record if your request would substantially disrupt agency operations and the custodian is unable to reach a reasonable solution with you, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(g).
10. If the custodian is unable to comply with your request for access to a government record, they will indicate the specific bases for denial on the request form or other written correspondence and send it to you.

Any and all body-worn camera (BWC) footage, dashcam footage, and audio recordings related to the arrest of a 23-year-old female driver for a DWI / DUI offense that occurred on or about October 22, 2023. The incident involved a black Mercedes-Benz striking a highway median/barrier in Middletown Township, followed by a motor vehicle stop and field sobriety tests administered by Middletown Township police officers. The associated police incident report, arrest report, and CAD (Computer-Aided Dispatch) logs for this specific incident, with appropriate redactions for personal private information as mandated by law.

Narrative

This incident was recorded on a body worn camera.

On 10/22/23 I, Ptl. Foy responded to a report of a black Mercedes Benz in the area of Care One at King James Lane, driving at high speeds that had crashed into the median and was continuing down Rt. 36 North. The caller advised they were following the accused vehicle and had observed it failing to obey a red light at Rt. 36 and Thompson Ave. The vehicle was still reported to be continuing down Rt. 36 North at high speeds.

County Advised that Atlantic Highlands PD had stopped the car at Rt. 36 North and Main St. (Belford). When I arrived on scene, Sgt. Mazza #306 and Atlantic Highlands units were out with the driver (Qingqing Yang). Ms. Yang reported that she and her friends were heading home from Sandy Hook where they had been drinking. Sgt. Mazza performed Field Sobriety Tests (FSTs) on Ms. Yang. Ms. Yang (Please see Sgt. Mazza's supplemental report). While performing the FSTs, Ms. Yang appeared to struggle to maintain her balance while attempting the tests. Ms. Yang failed to adequately pass the FSTs and appeared to be under the influence of alcohol.

Ms. Yang was placed in handcuffs, utilizing the double locking mechanism and placed in the back of my patrol car (Car 49). I transported Ms. Yang back to headquarters without incident.

At headquarters Ms. Yang was processed and was administered a breath test by Sgt. Mazza #306, resulting in a BAC of 0.126% (Please see Sgt. Mazza's supplemental report).

Ms. Yang was released to Xianneng Wu, who voluntarily signed a potential liability warning form.

Summons issued (3914-50, 3914-97).

This incident was captured on my body worn camera.

On 10-22-23, at approximately 0015, this officer (Sgt. F. Mazza #306), was patrolling district three, in the vicinity of Highway 36 East/Wilson Avenue. County Dispatch advised all patrol units of a traffic complaint coming out of Atlantic Highlands.

The suspect vehicle was described as a black Mercedes. It was reaching speeds of 100 miles per hour, and struck the median. The Mercedes also hit the callers vehicle. Finally, the vehicle almost lost control while negotiating a curve.

In the area of Highway 36 Westbound/East Road, this officer observed a black Mercedes that matched the callers description. The vehicle was being operated by a young female (as described by the caller), and had visible damage to the driver side door panel. In the area of Highway 36 West/Church Street, a motor vehicle stop was enacted.

Atlantic Highlands Police Department was also following the suspect vehicle, and was on scene with the motor vehicle stop. This officer approached the driver side of the black Mercedes, and met with the operator (Q. Yang). I immediately detected a pungent odor of alcoholic beverages emanating from the vehicles cabin. I further noted that the Mr. Yang's eyes were rather glassy.

As I engaged the operator in conversation, I noticed her voice was rather low, and monotone. I also advised Ms. Yang that this exchange was being recorded on my body worn camera. At this point, Patrol Officers Foy and Masiello arrived on scene as backup. Suspecting that the accused was possibly impaired due to alcoholic beverages, I requested that she vacate the vehicle to perform standardized field sobriety tests.

I observed the accused walk over to the roadside, and noted that she was staggering slightly. Once she was on a flat, dry piece of blacktop, testing commenced:

- 1) Alphabet test- Suspect unable to successfully complete the alphabet as directed. She did not recite each letter individually.
- 2) HGN- Horizontal gaze nystagmus. All six hits were observed.
- 3) One legged stand- Suspect was not even able to lift her right foot off the ground.
- 4) Walk and turn- Suspect was unable to maintain the starting position (heel to toe), and began the test without being told to do so. She also was unable to walk heel to toe, and turned improperly. Finally, she walked backwards, after the first nine steps.

At this point, the accused was placed under arrest for 39:4-50. She was handcuffed (double locked), and turned over to Ptl. Foy (403). The vehicle was towed as per Johns Law. Ms. Yang was transported back to MTPD headquarters, for processing.

This officer reported to headquarters to run the Alcotest. All electronic equipment was removed prior to entering the Alcotest room. I also ensured that no foreign objects were inside the suspects mouth cavity.

Ms. Yang was read the NY implied consent law, and verbally acknowledged same. Face to face observation commenced at 0100, and continued through both tests.

The first test was aborted due to mouth alcohol. A new twenty minute

observation period was conducted prior to the second test. Blood concentration registered at .126.

The accused was read the instructions prior to each blow into the machine. Furthermore, a fresh mouthpiece was utilized for each individual test. Face to face observation continued throughout both tests. After testing, Ms. Yang was turned back over to Ptl. Foy for processing. See investigation for further information.

No further action taken.
