Pursuant to the New Jersey Open Records statute, I would like to receive a copy of all formal communication from the Child Fatality and Near Fatality Review Board to the office of the state medical examiner's office, or any county medical examiner's office from 2005 through 2016.

The board discusses the existence of such letters in its annual reports as part of its standard procedures when it identifies issues with specific cases. Understanding that these letters may include identifying information about individuals, I'm perfectly fine with necessary redactions to eliminate such information, such as names, addresses or phone numbers connected to the case. Under the statute, this would not extend, however, to basic demographic information about individuals that may be included in the letters, such as age, gender and race.

Ideally, I'd like to receive copies of these letters in an electronic format (PDF), but will accept paper copies if this is for some reason not possible. I understand that the OPRA process is often a thankless task for those who fill them, so do not hesitate to contact me if there is anything I can do to expedite the process and make it less cumbersome.
