The Division of Housing and Community Resources of the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (Division) received your Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request on November 21, 2017. The original seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request was December 1, 2017, however that deadline was ultimately extended to December 15, 2017. The Division has redacted personal information including home addresses, personal email addresses, and home telephone numbers pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1, which obligates a public agency to safeguard from public access a citizen's personal information with which it has been



entrusted when disclosure thereof would violate a citizen's reasonable expectation of privacy. See also Wolosky v. Somerset County, A-1024-15T4 (App. Div. Mar. 30, 2017).

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law or any extensions thereto, you have a right to challenge the decision to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC). The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in that county.
