Dear Mr. Wronko,

This office received your records request dated May 6, 2019 via e-mail on May 6, 2019, 2019 and it was received by the records custodian on the same date. You requested the following:

Hello this is a public records request under opra and common law.

I would like a copy of all emails to or from JEN Coombs from January 1, 2018 through May 6, 2019 to or from the prosecutors office. Please search the subject, body of the emails and the sender/receiver.

Fighting corruption one OPRA request at a time.....

Enclosed please find e-mails that are responsive to your request. Not included are e-mails between this office and County Counsel (or Special County Counsel) in which County Counsel is providing legal advice and assistance to the Monmouth County Prosecutor's Office on legal matters. Confidential communications between a client and his attorney in the course of a professional relationship are privileged. N.J.S.A. 2A:84A-20; N.J.R.E. 504. The attorney-client privilege is a recognized privilege that may shield documents that otherwise meet the OPRA definition of government record from inspection or production. K.L. v. Evesham Twp. Bd. of Educ., 423 N.J.Super. 337, 352-53 (App.Div.2011), certif. denied, 210 N.J. 108 (2012); Gannett N.J. Partners, L.P. v. Cnty. of Middlesex, 379 N.J.Super. 205, 218 (App. Div. 2005). Materials that are deemed confidential in other areas of the law are not subject to production under OPRA. N.J.S.A. 47:1A-9(b).

In addition, not included are e-mails that are exempt due to them being advisory, consultative, and deliberative. N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1; Education Law Center v. N.J. Dept. of Ed. 198 N.J. 274 (2009); In re the Liquidation of Integrity Ins. Co., 165 N.J. 75, 84-85 (2000); Tractenberg v. Twp. Of West Orange, 416 N.J. Super. 354 (2010); Gannett New Jersey Partners, LP v. County Of Middlesex, 379 N.J. Super. 205 (App. Div. 2005). These are e-mails which include and contain opinions, recommendations, and/or advice pertaining to law enforcement action in response to various matters, which are exempt from production as advisory,

consultative or deliberative material. N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1; see In re Readoption with Amendments of Death Penalty Regulations N.J.A.C. 10A:23, by the N.J. Dep't of Corr., 367 N.J.Super. 61, 73-74 (App.Div.), certif. denied, 182 N.J. 149, 862 A.2d 57 (2004).

Under common law, a public record is: one required to be kept, or necessary to be kept in the discharge of a duty imposed by law, or directed by law to serve as a memorial and evidence of something written, said, or done, or a written memorial made by a public officer authorized to perform that function, or a writing filed in public office. The elements essential to constitute a public record are... that it be a written memorial, that it be made by a public officer, and that the officer be authorized by law to make it. Nero v. Hyland, 76 N.J. 213, 221-22 (1978).

Generally, the public's interest in nondisclosure is based on the need to keep the information confidential. Where a claim of confidentiality is asserted, the applicant's interest in disclosure is more closely scrutinized. In that context, courts consider whether the claim of confidentiality is "premised upon a purpose which tends to advance or further a wholesome public interest or a legitimate private interest." Loigman v. Kimmelman, 102 N.J. 98, 112 (1986) (quoting City of St. Matthews v. Voice of St. Matthews, Inc., 519 S.W.2d 811, 815 (Ky.1974)). However, where the interest in confidentiality is "slight or non-existent," standing alone will be sufficient to require disclosure to advance a legitimate private interest. Id. at 105; see also McClain, supra, 99 N.J. at 362.

Here, the Prosecutor's Office has determined that nondisclosure of certain e-mails outweighs the public's interest in unfettered access to the e-mails. In Lyndhurst, the Supreme Court considered the relevant common law claims of access, other materials relating to the incident, which were "distilled from factors that [it] identified in Loigman v. Kimmelman, 102 N.J. 98 (1986), and from the 'core concerns' arising from N.J.S.A. 47:1A-3(a)." North Jersey Media Group, Inc. v. Township of Lyndhurst, 229 N.J. 541, 579 (July 11, 2017).

We considered the six factors, espoused in Loigman v. Kimmelman, to balance the request for disclosure against the need for confidentiality. The factors are as following:

- (1) the extent to which disclosure will impede agency functions by discouraging citizens from providing information to the government;
- (2) the effect disclosure may have upon persons who have given such information, and whether they did so in reliance that their identities would not be disclosed;
- (3) the extent to which agency self-evaluation, program improvement, or other decision-making will be chilled by disclosure;
- (4) the degree to which the information sought includes factual data as opposed to evaluative reports of policymakers;
- (5) whether any findings of public misconduct have been insufficiently corrected by remedial measures instituted by the investigative agency; and
- (6) whether any agency disciplinary or investigatory proceedings have arisen that may circumscribe the individual's asserted need for the materials.

Loigman, supra, 102 N.J. at 113.

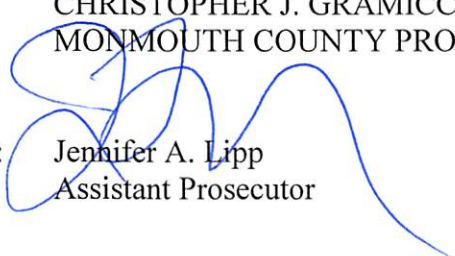
It should be noted that these six factors are neither exhaustive nor necessarily applicable to every analysis, but are merely suggestive and intended to guide a court's in camera review of documents to assist the court in determining whether documents can be either released or appropriately redacted for release. Id.

Distinct from Lyndhurst and Paff, the e-mails do not pertain to the use of force by law enforcement, excessive force allegations, or police shooting. There is no counter between the public and law enforcement that is "worthy of public scrutiny." Accordingly, as noted above, some e-mails are not being released for the reasons stated above.

In the event of a clarification or appeal, this office reserves the right to raise any other ground for denial not raised in this response. The failure of this office to assert an exception or privilege at this time does not act as a waiver of any grounds for denial.

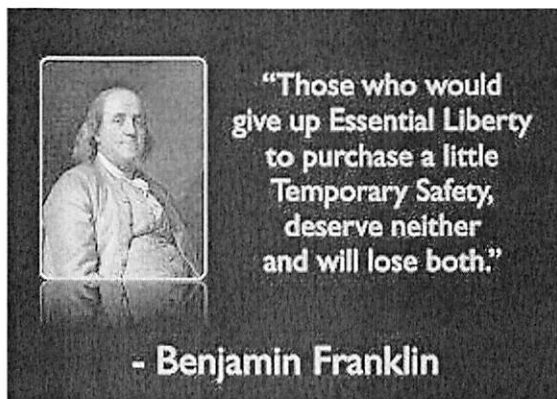

What constitutes a 'crude smile'...?! It wasn't a lawful order that Ptl. Austin gave to me. I wasn't being disorderly
 either. I'm not subject to the State of NJ/NCIC/CJIS policies especially when law enforcement have the
 information in plain view and/or ear shot of a citizen that is located within a public accessible area of a public
 building that is paid by the taxpayers. I was also threatened with 'arrest' for lawful and constitutional protected
 activity. I was very cooperative within the confines of the New Jersey OPRA Law while I attempted to obtain some
 paperwork for my OPRA request. I wasn't provoking law enforcement to unlawfully arrest me either.

Narrative: While clearing my shift for Friday, Feb 17th while standing in HTD dispatch, I observed a white female wearing glasses, later identified as Jennifer Coombs, w/o of Neptune City, NY walking around the lobby of police HQ holding a cellular phone in front of her, apparently recording various areas. Sgt. Austin, who was on light-duty waiting inside dispatch, politely asked Coombs if someone was helping her. She stated she was waiting for someone in records, then changed her story stating she was waiting for a supervisor. As she spoke, she walked up to the window although it was clear that she could hear Sgt. Austin speaking to her and she responded indicative of her hearing him properly. She then began to hold the phone directly in front of the window, which had where Det. Kubel was at dispatch position #7, which had various dispatch/NCIC screens facing the window. Sgt. Austin, recognizing this politely instructed Coombs to not record through the window several times. She replied that she was allowed, and then waved her phone back and forth several times while making a crude noise, clearly indicating she was refusing to abide from a lawful order made by a police officer. Seeing that she was being disorderly and refusing to abide by a lawful order, I entered the lobby (in full police uniform) and politely tried to explain to her that her recording through the window was a violation of several policies, most importantly the State of NJ/NCIC/CJIS policies. She refused to accept this and went on claiming that she could. She also asked and was given by name and badge number.

I tried to use some basic information to explain how innocent person's private information could be visible on the screens. It was clear that Ms. Coombs would not be persuaded, so I terminated the conversation with a clear warning that should she engage in that prohibited conduct she would be arrested. Sgt. Meg also spoke with her after I was done speaking with her as well and I briefed him as to my encounter with Ms. Coombs. MJM/317

Narrative: 02/17/2017 1657 Sgt. Thomas Weg

I responded to the police lobby after learning that there was a female in the lobby who was not happy with answers "records" personnel were giving her. Upon my arrival, Sgt. Martin was advising her that she cannot film the inside of the communications center for the obvious reasons he stated in this report. I reiterated this to her and finally got Coombs to explain her reason to the police department which was to get a copy of a report. She was uncooperative when attempts to explain to her what was needed for a police report; ID and date/time/location of the incident. Clearly she was attempting to provoke the police into arresting her. She insisted that she wanted a form but was told that she didn't need one if she was looking for a report that she was involved in. Ultimately, she was given a form knowing that she did not have to obtain one.

She remained in the lobby saying she could record where she wants in the police station lobby. I eliminated the privacy concerns by having the dispatch shade put down. Once this was done, she seemed no longer interested in filming the lobby. I went to court and advised those employees of Coombs

...ing in the lobby and she is allowed to do so. She eventually went by the court and continued her filming. A short time later she left the lobby.

It was learned that Coombs broadcasted this live through a FB feed known as Time to change Jersey Style.

I process the information in a different way but I still acquired the information at the end of the night though. I ask a lot of questions and like to pick apart people's minds because I want to learn about different things and etc. I like to observe different things too because that's another way to learn about anything and everything. I also like to watch different media videos and documentaries because I can go back to them and watch it a million times over.

Some people are accusing different law enforcement agencies and government officials of appeasing me when it comes to various things. They also stated that I lack funding, knowledge, and influence to accomplish anything positive and/or good within any community. I would like to see 'Results' instead of different people appeasing me if that's the case. In my opinion, it only takes one person to make a ripple effect across the board.

I have so many objectives and my media videos are multidimensional.
