The Borough of Seaside Park received your Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request on August 8, 2019.

- Narratives have been redacted, pursuant to Executive Order No. 26 (McGreevey 2002) exempts disclosure of information relating to medical, psychiatric or psychological history, diagnosis, treatment or evaluation, and NJSA 47:1A-9.
- Name and address of victims have been redacted pursuant to Paff v. Warren County Office of the Prosecutor, (GRC 2007-167), and Executive Order No. 26 (McGreevey 2002).
- Reporting witness name, address, and phone numbers have been redacted pursuant to Perino v. Borough of Haddon Heights, (GRC 2004-128), and Rivera v. Town of West New York, (GRC 2010-208).
- Social security numbers, drivers' license numbers, and unlisted telephone numbers have been redacted, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1; the reasonable expectation of privacy.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have the right to challenge the decision of the Seaside Park Borough Records Custodian to deny access. At your option, you may institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Superior Court Clerk located in your County (www.njcourts.gov).

Alternatively, you may file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing a Denial of Access Complaint Form in accordance with N.J.S.A. 47:1A-6. You may contact the GRC at its toll-free information telephone line at (866) 850-0511, by regular mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ 08625-0819, by e-mail at Government.Records@dca.nj.gov, or through the GRC website at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also respond to other questions about the OPRA law.

Females ex-boyfriend [REDACTED] reported that his ex girlfriend consumed a lot of alcohol the day prior with little water intake. The female was conscious upon my arrival and able to answer questions. She admitted to drinking alcohol the day prior until 0230hrs current date. Ex boyfriend stated she had been up on and off since 7am but was not having seizures until approximately 15 min prior to calling 911. [REDACTED] stated she also ingested a small amount of cocaine a few days prior and CBD.

According to [REDACTED] she had no medical history but did drink excessively. Triboro came to evaluate [REDACTED] and she began to suffer from a seizure in our presence. The seizure lasted a few second before [REDACTED] regained consciousness. Shortly after she had another seizure while medics were on scene. [REDACTED] was placed on a reeves stretcher and transported to CMC by Tri Boro first aid and medics. [REDACTED] never lost consciousness without a seizure following. No narcotic paraphernalia or alcohol was observed inside the residence.

On July 19th 2019 I was dispatched to the above location for an overdose, on arrival the female subject was alert and conscious laying down in the backseat of the vehicle. Vehicle identified with [REDACTED] Temporary Tag [REDACTED]. Myself and Officer Shiner assisted the victim with sitting up in the backseat of the vehicle. The victim exhibited slurred speech as we were trying to obtain information about what type of pills and alcohol she consumed. The victim stated that she had taken two Lorazepam capsules that were not prescribed to her from her father without him knowing, with unknown type of alcohol. The victim was unable to provide us with the time that she consumed the alcohol or the pills. Tri boro arrived on scene and began assessing the female, a rig then arrived from Toms River. She was then transported to Community Medical Center by Toms River Rig Number 514.
