On the above date and time I was dispatched to the area of Brighton Avenue and Central Avenue for a report of an unconscious male laying on the sidewalk who was allegedly snoring. I responded to the area in an emergent manner with my emergency lights activated. When arriving in the area I did not observe anyone on the sidewalk within the area and requested county dispatch to call back the caller. After doing so I observed a male waving me down later identified as Michael Connelly from within the driveway of 104 Brighton Avenue. I notified the officer in charge that day, Sgt. McKay, of my location who arrived on scene with me shortly after. Upon arrival I observed a male identified as [REDACTED] who I identified through the medical band around his wrist. [REDACTED] was laying face down in the driveway where blood was visible on his face and on the ground. Sgt. McKay and I rolled over [REDACTED] to lay him on his back to free his airway and further evaluate him. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] After making these observations I administered four MG of Naloxone into [REDACTED] left nostril. At this time TriBoro EMS arrived on scene and began to make their observations. Sgt. Fitzgerald and Ptl. Slickers also arrived on scene to assist. While TriBoro EMS were evaluating the patient, they advised me to administer another four MG of Naloxone which I did. TriBoro EMS and the arriving medics then took over the scene to transport [REDACTED] to the hospital to be further evaluated. The patient had woken up in the ambulance and notified the medics that he did not take anything besides alcohol. All Naloxone cartridges were collected and the necessary replacement forms were filled out and transported to Community Medical Center to be replaced. The OCP Naloxone Administration Form was filled out and faxed.

Detective Mantz was notified of the incident during the call who responded to 104 Brighton Avenue to speak with the caller. When speaking to the caller originally he stated that he had originally seen the male walking south on the sidewalk before he walked onto the driveway and fell face first onto the ground. Connelly then told Detective Mantz the two actually knew each other from prison and [REDACTED] may have "shot up" in his bathroom. Let it be noted that there were visible signs of blood on Connelly's boots and vomit on the one dining room table. Connelly also had just cleaned the floors and bathroom as it actively smelled like cleaning chemicals in his unit. Connelly gave me permission to check the bathroom for further items that [REDACTED] may have left behind where nothing was located. All Seaside Park units then cleared from the scene.

On the above date and time, I was dispatched to 1505 North Ocean Avenue for a report of an unconscious male in room 101. I responded to the Desert Palm in an emergent manner with my emergency lights activated. Upon arrival I was approached by Stan Kilmartin who stated "Do you have narkan". I observed a male later identified as [REDACTED] in the open door way of room 101 laying on his back face up on his bed. [REDACTED] was observed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] I then provided sternum rubs, and shouted to [REDACTED] which both were unsuccessful in waking [REDACTED] At this time, I proceeded to administer 4Mg of Naloxone into [REDACTED] left nostril. No change was observed in [REDACTED] condition and I then proceeded to administer another 4Mg of Naloxone into his right nostril. Tri-Boro EMS and Sgt. Konfederak provided [REDACTED] with oxygen. Shortly there after, [REDACTED] breathing appeared to become more normal and he was responsive to sternum rubs and eventually opened his eyes and sat upright on his bed. [REDACTED] appeared to be confused to why we were there, and stated that he has been clean from using Heroin for a very long time. I observed in the area an uncapped hypodermic needle and a black plastic spoon with a white solidified substance dried up on the spoon face laying on the top surface of table. The syringe and the black plastic spoon with a white solidified substance dried up on the spoon face were recovered and placed into an evidence bag. The black plastic spoon with a white solidified substance dried up on the spoon face was logged into Temporary Evidence locker #3. The syringe was placed into a safety tube, sealed, and placed into the syringe tub for disposal. Sgt. Konfederak then asked [REDACTED] if he was a diabetic due to all the sealed hypodermic needles laying on his bed, to which [REDACTED] replied yes and offered to show his insulin medication which he requires.

Tri-Boro EMS then evaluated [REDACTED] and asked him if he would like to go to the hospital, to which he refused. All Naloxone cartridges were collected and the replenishment and naloxone forms were completed. Empty Naloxone cartridge's were transported to Community Medical Center for replacement. The Naloxone administration reporting form was faxed to OCPO.

3/31/2021 18:54:11

On the above date and time I was dispatched to the Desert Palm room 102 for a welfare check on a [REDACTED]. Upon arrival PTL DelConte and I tried to make contact with [REDACTED] but were unsuccessful, PTL DelConte was able to get the door to open slightly where we had observed [REDACTED] laying face down on the bed.

[REDACTED] did not answer when we had called to her to see if she was okay, at this time the deadbolt on the door was preventing us from gaining access into the room and was only accessible from inside. I then broke the door to gain access to the room, and attempted to wake [REDACTED]. When I had touched her she was cold to the touch, stiff and seemed to be deceased. County dispatch was notified that the female was going to be DOA, PTL Casole, DelConte and I stood by on scene and checked the room.

Sgt. Carrol from OCPO was also notified and did advise that they would not be coming out. after looking through the room I had observed a pipe containing green vegetative matter on the night table next to the bed, one hypodermic needle near the bottom of the bed where [REDACTED] was laying and multiple prescription pills. The caller Dana Baffa was visibly upset and stated the last time she had seen [REDACTED] was yesterday between 9-10 pm.

Baffa also noted that she believes [REDACTED] had headed to the Offshore Motel in Seaside Heights the night before to buy narcotics. At this time detective Mantz was contacted and had then arrived on scene to investigate along with Major Crimes, CSI. Paramedics on scene Keene and Garcia had contacted Dr. Scheth of Newark Beth Israel who had pronounced her dead at 19:41. Kedz funeral home arrived on scene and transported the body to Kedz funeral home. All units then cleared from scene.
