On 1.2.19, I, PO Greenan, along with PO Capoano and PO Fennessy, responded to the Pt. Pleasant Inn, room [REDACTED] for a first aid call. Caller/father [REDACTED] reported an unconscious but breathing [REDACTED] year old male and a [REDACTED] year old female possibly having a seizure.

On arrival, [REDACTED] directed PO Capoano and myself to his son, [REDACTED] and a female companion, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was laying on the bed unconscious while [REDACTED] was unconscious, partially upright and leaning to her left side. Her right hand was curled up and pupils were neither pin-points nor a normal size for daylight. The room was heavily packed with discarded personal items and no obvious drug paraphernalia was visible. PO Capoano focused on [REDACTED] while I turned my attention on [REDACTED]. Neither responded to stimuli and PO Capoano administered [REDACTED] first dose of Narcan while I administered [REDACTED] only dose of Narcan; dispatch was advised of same.

In the proceeding minutes, [REDACTED] explained that [REDACTED] is prescribed [REDACTED] for his opiate addiction and [REDACTED] mother told him to leave her Bayville home days earlier after finding syringes. [REDACTED] knew little about [REDACTED] saying he met her two weeks prior and she and [REDACTED] have been an item of sorts approximately eight weeks. They went to Asbury Park New Years Eve, then again New Years Day evening. [REDACTED] estimated they returned 22:30 hours and appeared 'drunk' so he provided them with snacks before they went to bed. He estimated they were asleep by 00:30 hrs and allowed them to sleep in his bed while he slept on the floor. [REDACTED] awoke to [REDACTED] alarm clock as he did not rouse to disable it, then heard [REDACTED] make an unusual sound before she fell from the bed onto the floor. Fully awake, [REDACTED] got up to check on her; he estimated the time was 07:15-07:30 hrs. Suspecting she was having a seizure, [REDACTED] tried to awake his son. [REDACTED] spit up following [REDACTED] attempt to awake him, prompting [REDACTED] to dial 911.

Neither [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] responded to the first dose of Narcan or stimuli and PO Fennessy's Narcan was used to administer [REDACTED] second dose. Shortly after, Medics and First Aid responded and took over care for the patients. Lt. Downs also responded and contacted Det/ Lt. Picca from the scene.

I looked through [REDACTED] purse and found two medications prescribed to her: [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] also provided both victim's cell phones; Property Receipts were completed and the phones were later given to Det/Lt. Picca at headquarters. After Medics and First Aid transported both still unresponsive victims to Brick Hospital, all officers also left room [REDACTED].

I completed the Narcan Replenishment forms for the three used doses and Brick Hospital provided replacements. Nalaxone Administration Reporting forms were completed for both victims and were faxed accordingly.

Investigation turned over to the Detective Bureau.

On 1/10/19 at 1:54 a.m Sgt. Miller, P.O. Gunnell, P.O. Popiel, P.O. Mergner and I responded for a [REDACTED] year old female with C.P.R in progress. P.O. Gunnell arrived on location first and located the victim, [REDACTED] on the floor just outside the upstairs bathroom. [REDACTED] mother was performing chest compression as Scott Francis was standing at the top on the stairs. P.O. Gunnell took over chest compressions while I administered a dose of Narcan because of [REDACTED] past drug history provided by [REDACTED]. I then completed rescue breathing while P.O. Gunnell continued chest compressions. [REDACTED] was connected to the defibrillator after approximately 2 rounds of C.P.R with no shock advised. C.P.R was continued and a second dose of Narcan was administered. [REDACTED] did not respond to either dose of Narcan. [REDACTED] was moved from the hallway to the floor in her bedroom to make more room for treatment. [REDACTED] bedroom was directly next to the bathroom and did not have a door. Point Pleasant First Aid and Medics arrived and took over treatment. [REDACTED] regained a pulse after approximately 20 minutes. [REDACTED] was transported to Brick Hospital by first aid.

Located on the table inside [REDACTED] bedroom was an uncapped needle and a opened wax fold typically used for packaging heroin. Approximately 6 wax folds were located on the floor just beneath the table. The wax folds had a stamp with the Nike emblem in a purplish/redish color. An exact count of the wax folds and whether they had been used was not done for safety purposes. The scene was secured by an officer until Det. Hynes and Sheriff's officer Senger arrived.

I spoke with Francis who stated that he arrived at the residence at approximately 1:40 a.m and observed [REDACTED] in the bathroom unresponsive wedged against the sink. [REDACTED] was moved to the floor just outside the bedroom where he and [REDACTED] started to provide [REDACTED] with first aid. Francis stated he received a text from [REDACTED] at 12:22 a.m. while at work. He called [REDACTED] at 1:22 a.m and she did not answer. Francis stated that [REDACTED] had gone out earlier with a Lenan Freed who lives in Brick. [REDACTED] became friends with Freed through Narcotics anonymous meetings and he could not provide any more detailed information on him.

I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated she was sleeping on the couch and was briefly woken up by what she assumes was [REDACTED] coming home some time after 12 a.m. [REDACTED] did not hear anything unusual until she was woke up by Francis. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] left earlier in the night and left the house without saying goodbye. [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] to see what she was doing because she just left a drug rehabilitation facility on Saturday. [REDACTED] stated she was going to the movies with friends. [REDACTED] stated she could hear a male voice in the background and assumed it was Freed.

[REDACTED] was inside the residence and was woke up during the incident.

Sgt. Miller contacted Det. Lt. Picca and advised him of the incident. Det. Lt. Picca advised that Det. Hynes would be responding. The Ocean County Radio Room was contacted by headquarters and requested C.S.I. and to see if the prosecutors office would be responding. The radio room stated the Prosecutors Office would not be responding but C.S.I would respond.

Det Hynes responded and took over the investigation. S.O. Senger from C.S.I photographed the scene and took custody of the wax folds. I took custody of the needle which was placed in a sharps container, entered into the B.E.A.S.T evidence system then tagged and placed in evidence.

A Narcan Deployment form was completed and Faxed to the O.C.P.O and the N.J.R.O.I.C. I responded to Brick Hospital where the Narcan was replaced by hospital staff.

On 01/25/2019 at 1624 hours, Sgt. Leonhardt, PO Popiel and I, PO M. Nickerson responded to the Stop & Shop parking lot (3208 Bridge Avenue) for a report of a male subject in his forties who was passed out behind the wheel of a running motor vehicle. The vehicle was reported to be parked along Bridge Avenue and the caller was unsuccessful in trying to wake the male subject.

Upon arrival, I positioned my vehicle in the eastbound shoulder of Bridge Avenue, across from M&M Auto Service (3221 Bridge Avenue). I was immediately approached by the caller, later identified as Martin Cawley, who asked if I had Narcan. I retrieved my Narcan kit and approached the vehicle. The vehicle, NJ-B18CJK, was parked in the east part of the parking lot and was facing east. I could observe a white male slumped over to his right, sitting in the driver seat.

I was able to open the unlocked driver side door and begin to shake and yell at the unconscious male, in an effort to wake him, but I was unsuccessful. I made contact with the male, whose face was observed to be blue/purple. I prepared the Narcan kit and administered one dose through the male's left nostril. Also, I removed a capped oral syringe from the male's lap, later identified as liquid Oxycodone. Pt Boro First Aid arrived on scene almost simultaneously and took over care of the male. As I move the Narcan kit and syringe away from the vehicle, PO Popiel assisted First Aid members and removed the male from the vehicle and immediately began performing Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on him next to the vehicle. Sgt. Leonhardt was on scene assisting. While securing the oral syringe in a Sharps container, I observe it to have Oxycodone written on a label, which was wrapped around the syringe. Also, what appeared to be a bar code. I observed the syringe to be one that could be found at a medical facility or hospital.

I made contact with the caller, Martin Cawley, who was standing near my vehicle. He stated he arrived at the store with the intentions of purchasing food. After parking and exiting his vehicle (NJ-FD1412) in the east part of the parking lot, he exited and noticed the male, who appeared to be looking down in the vehicle which was parked next to his. Mr. Cawley did not think anything about it, until he returned to his vehicle from the store. When he returned, he again noticed the male and now he appeared to be slumped over. He knocked on the window several times, but was unable to wake the male. He then dialed 911 to report the unconscious subject.

As Pt Boro F/A continued to assess and treat the male, I made contact with a female, who was on scene when I arrived. I identified her as Leah Schaefer and she stated she was the male's girlfriend. She stated her boyfriend, identified as [REDACTED], came to get items at the Stop & Shop. She stated the two had been arguing during the day because she found out [REDACTED] had gotten 3 Morphine pills from a male named, "Adam". The last text message she received from [REDACTED] was at 1713 hours in which he says he thought he could trust her when it came to the Morphine pills. She continued to message him, but she never received a response back, so she came to the Stop & Shop looking for him. Ms. Schaefer stated the past couple of days, she observed her boyfriend nodding off several times, but he would get angry at her and dismiss his behavior on being tired. Ms. Schaefer stated [REDACTED] sometimes works at the Jackson Auto/Collision and believes the owner is named, "Vince". She stated she believes this male would know who, "Adam" is. She stated [REDACTED] is only prescribed 10 mg of Oxycodone and she did not believe he abused any other type of medicine/narcotic. The vehicle [REDACTED] was in is registered to Ms. Schaefer's father, Joseph Zavacki. I spoke with him on scene and he stated [REDACTED] regularly uses the vehicle, it is just registered in his name.

I made contact with [REDACTED] and F/A members in the ambulance. Also, Medic 205

(Macclemmy/Bowers) was assessing [REDACTED] I was advised he was going to be transported to Brick ER for pronouncement. After he was transported, Ms. Schaefer was told of the transport and where [REDACTED] was going. It was later confirmed that [REDACTED] was pronounced at Brick Hospital.

PO Popiel and K9 Juno assisted on scene. An open air sniff of NJ-B18CJK was conducted by K9 Juno, but no indication of narcotics was given by K9 Juno. During the incident, two more oral syringes containing liquid Oxycodone, packaged the same as the first syringe I found on [REDACTED] lap, and an empty cigarette pack containing 5 white oval pills and 1 yellow oval pill were located. The two syringes were inside a clear plastic bag with a labeling from a medical facility in Tampa, Florida. The lettering was faded and difficult to decipher the exact address of the medical facility. Lt. Radsniak, Sgt. Leonhardt and I secured the scene/vehicle and I contacted the Ocean County Radio Room, requesting the Ocean County Prosecutor's and CSI to be notified and to respond. Also, Det. Hill was notified and responded.

S/O Chester and S/O Laudicina from CSI, Det. Laraia from the OCPO and Det. Hill arrived and the scene and assessed the vehicle. S/O Chester and S/O Laudicina inspected the evidence that was located in the vehicle and took custody of the evidence from myself to be processed at their facility. Joseph Zavacki gave consent to Det. Hill to search his vehicle (NJ-B18CJK) and a search was conducted on the vehicle by Det. Hill. After the search, I prepared a property receipt for Mr. Zavacki and the vehicle was released to him. See follow up report by Det. Hill.

John said he tried to secure the crystalized rock in a small plastic bag, but it broke apart in his hand, then he dropped it in a crack on the driveway. John was able to salvage a tiny amount of the substance, which he secured in a small plastic Walgreen's bag.

John said he dropped off the items at Police Headquarters because he was not sure if they were related to the overdose death of [REDACTED] last night.

I entered the items in the BEAST database. I secured the items in temporary storage locker three. Detective Michelle Hill was notified via email.

Lieutenant Radsniak was advised of my findings.
