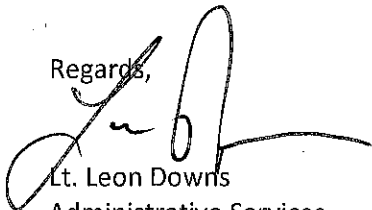

I responded to the lobby of Police Headquarters and met with
[REDACTED], who was accompanied by his friend, [REDACTED].
[REDACTED] said she drove [REDACTED] to Police
Headquarters so he could be entered into the Blue Hart
Program.

[REDACTED] admitted that he wanted to be placed in the Blue
Hart Program as a result of his heroin addiction. While
speaking with [REDACTED], he admitted to injecting 13 waxfolds
of heroin at approximately 1630 hours. [REDACTED] was
lethargic and his skin was extremely pale. [REDACTED] kept
falling asleep while I was talking to him.

It should be noted, [REDACTED] was unable to apply for Blue
Hart because it was outside of intake hours (9am - 5pm).

Point Boro First Aid Squad 35 responded to Police
Headquarters to assess [REDACTED] physical condition. Squad
35 transported [REDACTED] to Hackensack Meridian Ocean Medical
Center for further treatment.

I advised [REDACTED] that Manchester Police
Department performs Blue Hart intake on Wednesdays from 9am
to 3pm. [REDACTED] were both thankful for my
assistance.

Sergeant Leonhardt was advised of the incident.

I responded to 3136 Powhatan Ave for a possible female overdose. The call was reported via Ocean County 911. Upon arrival, I met with the victim, [REDACTED] inside the residence. She was alert and conscious. [REDACTED] was accompanied by her roommate, [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] exhibited altered mental status. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] has been acting weird the past two days and she planned on driving her to behavioral health for an evaluation. [REDACTED] also said she took one pill of Ritalin and it made her feel funny.

Point Boro First Aid Squad 35 arrived on scene and took over care. [REDACTED] was transported to Hackensack Meridian Ocean Medical Center in Brick, NJ for further treatment.

At HQ, I called Ocean Medical Center and advised the Behavioral Health Unit that [REDACTED] should be evaluated after she is cleared medically.

On 03/01/2019 at 15:32 hours, I responded to 620 Rt.88 Rm.107 regarding a elderly male with chest pain. Upon my arrival, I met with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated that he has sharp chest pain in the center of his chest that radiates to his back. [REDACTED] stated that he has congestive heart failure and a extensive medical history. [REDACTED] then provided me with a folder with all his medications listed. I then handed that folder to a first aid member that was assisting me on scene. At this point, I applied 4 liters of oxygen via nasal canal. [REDACTED] appeared to be having respiratory distress due to the chest pain.

Shortly after, First Aid and medics arrived. First Aid began to treat [REDACTED] as I spoke with Paramedic [REDACTED]. Paramedic [REDACTED] advised me that [REDACTED] has a history of abusing the system. Paramedic [REDACTED] added that at the first of the month he goes to the hospital to acquire pain medication. Paramedic [REDACTED] added that he was last in the hospital on 02/28/2019 and was released due to non compliment with medication regiment.

Shortly after, I received a phone call from Captain [REDACTED] from the First Aid Squad. Captain [REDACTED] advised me that while in route to the hospital, Paramedic [REDACTED] determined that Mr. [REDACTED] was overdosing from his medication specifically Oxycodone. Captain [REDACTED] stated that Mr. [REDACTED] condition is critical due to being on unconscious. I then contacted Paramedic [REDACTED] via cell phone. Paramedic [REDACTED] stated that she observed Mr. [REDACTED] to be nodding off in route to the hospital. Paramedic [REDACTED] added that as she continued to assess Mr. [REDACTED] condition, she determined that Mr. [REDACTED] was overdosing on some kind of medication. Paramedic [REDACTED] stated that she administered Narcan at which point [REDACTED] regained responsiveness. Paramedic [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] advised her that he took all his Oxycodone medication with alcohol today. Paramedic Connellan added that [REDACTED] did not give any additional information and went unconscious before arriving at the hospital. Paramedic [REDACTED] stated that she then turned over care to the hospital staff. [REDACTED] was advised of my findings.
