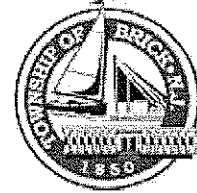

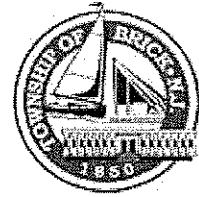

On 4/1/19 Sgt. Matthews # 210, Ptl. Fogarty # 211, Ptl. Zurica # 242 and I responded to [REDACTED] Dogwood Drive in response to a possible heroin overdose. Upon arrival I spoke to [REDACTED] who advised that he found [REDACTED] unconscious and unresponsive in the bathroom of the residence. [REDACTED] contacted 911 to advise of the situation and then administered three (3) nasal narkan deployments until [REDACTED] became conscious. It should be noted that [REDACTED] was alert and conscious upon Police and EMS arrival. [REDACTED] refused to provide information regarding how much heroin he used or where he obtained the heroin from. A search of the area revealed a used hypodermic needle however no used wax folds of heroin were recovered. [REDACTED] was transported to OMC for further medical treatment without incident. DEU Detective Mauro # 207 was contacted and advised of the incident.

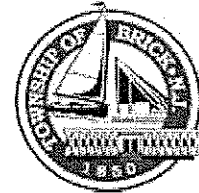

On 04/14/2019 at 0242hrs Ptl. Oliverio #286, Ptl. Patrick #296, and I, Ptl. Bailey #293, responded to [REDACTED] Sawmill Road in reference to a male overdosing. Dispatch advised the male was in the bathroom nodding in out of unconscious.

Upon my arrival I was met by [REDACTED] (brother) and [REDACTED] (mother). They advised the suspect, [REDACTED], was no longer on location and had left prior to my arrival.

[REDACTED] stated the following: He found [REDACTED] in the bathroom semi-conscious. [REDACTED] found six wax folds, three needles, two needle plungers and a bottle cap next to [REDACTED]. When [REDACTED] was confronted about his drug use he started arguing with [REDACTED] waking up [REDACTED]. The arguing kept going on while [REDACTED] slipped in and out of consciousness [REDACTED] then called EMS thinking [REDACTED] was overdosing. Once [REDACTED] realized police were on there way he ran out the back of the residence.

While speaking with [REDACTED] she corroborated [REDACTED] account of the incident.

Ptl. Oliverio, Ptl. Patrick, and I canvassed the area looking for [REDACTED] which yielded negative results.

The items found in the bathroom by [REDACTED] were turned over and later placed into property for destruction.

Later this same date at approximately 0415hrs, [REDACTED] came back to the residence. Dispatch advised [REDACTED] was being combative and yelling before running out the backdoor again and leaving the scene.

Sgt. Dierking #204, Ptl. Hentges #288, and Ptl. Mesmer #292, arrived on scene to assist.

While speaking with [REDACTED] he advised the following: [REDACTED] came back shortly after we had left earlier knocking on the backdoor. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] decided to let him back in if he would just get some sleep to which he agreed. Once inside [REDACTED] started yelling and calling them both liars for calling the police. [REDACTED] stated "you wont call them back again". [REDACTED] locked himself in his bedroom and called the police. [REDACTED] then grabbed some water, snacks and some clothes and left out the backdoor again.

[REDACTED] again corroborated [REDACTED] account of the incident.

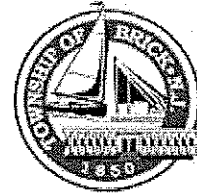
All units checked the area and [REDACTED] was unable to be located.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] did not wish to have [REDACTED] entered missing at this time and did not believe he was in any danger. They just wanted him to leave the residence for now.

DEU Det. Puccio #259 was notified of the incident. No further information to report at this time.

On 04/15/2019 at 2330hrs Sgt. Dierking #204, Ptl. Prendeville #223, and I, Ptl. Bailey #293, responded to [REDACTED] Roosevelt Dr in reference to an unconscious male. Dispatch advised the male was breathing but not responding.

Upon my arrival I was met by the caller, identified as [REDACTED], who was yelling from upstairs. I entered the bedroom and observed a male, identified as [REDACTED], on the bed not responding and shallow breathing. He was blue in the face and he had a pulse. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] had a history of asthma. I used my oxygen to help aid with his breathing.

Brick EMS arrived on scene to assist. EMS advised he was possibly overdosing and administered the first dose of NARCAN. MONOC Medics arrived on scene to assist. Medics administered a second dose of NARCAN and [REDACTED] slowly regained consciousness.

[REDACTED] stated the following [REDACTED] usually gets home from work everyday at 1700hrs, but tonight he went to the Arrowhead INN bar after work. [REDACTED] was there from 1700-1900hrs and then came home to eat dinner. After eating dinner [REDACTED] went out to get cigarettes. Once home he had a smoke and a drink of the porch. He was outside on the porch for about 15-20 minutes. While walking up the stairs to bed he fell and hit his head. He then got in bed and fell asleep immediately. While he was asleep he started not breathing/coughing. This not being normal and seeing his face being blue [REDACTED] called 911.

[REDACTED] advised her husband had used Oxycodone in the past.

I did not find any drugs or drug paraphernalia on scene.

[REDACTED] was transported to Ocean Medical Center by Brick EMS without incident. [REDACTED] was alert and conscious at the hospital. I tried to ask him questions about tonight and he refused to answer.

DEU Det. Alavardo # was notified of the incident.

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On 4/22/19 at 1721 hours I was dispatched to Ocean Medical Center in reference to a possible overdose. Dispatch advised the county received a 911 call from a [REDACTED] claiming her twenty seven (27) year old son was overdosing. She refused to pull over to await help and advised she was heading straight to the hospital. Dispatch made contact with Ocean Medical Center and they confirmed someone matching our information had just arrived there.

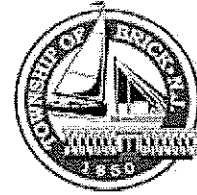
I responded to the hospital and spoke with staff. They confirmed they had just treated an overdose patient with Narcan and he was in room 31. Upon entering the room I was met by [REDACTED] and her son [REDACTED] who confirmed they had placed the 911 call. In speaking with [REDACTED] who was conscious upon my arrival, he advised he had snorted three (3) bags of heroin and believes he had a bad reaction. He informed me he had arrived home from work at approximately 1630 hours. He decided he was not going to the gym today so he would use the bags of heroin he had sitting in his drawer that were left over from a few weeks ago. He claimed to have received them at a party, but would not advise from who and was unsure of any stamps or markings on the bags. After using the heroin his mother drove him to Four Boys pizza in Ramtown to get food. After they returned to the vehicle he remembered not feeling well and then waking up in the hospital.

[REDACTED] advised after he returned to the car from the pizza place he began rubbing his head and scratching all over. He would not respond to her and then started to nod in and out of consciousness. [REDACTED] immediately left the parking lot and began driving to the hospital. While en route he stopped breathing and turned blue. This is when she called 911. She finally arrived at the hospital where staff on scene immediately began treating him. No drugs or paraphernalia were found by hospital staff.

The on call detective, Sgt Petrola #201, for DEU was contacted and notified of this incident. [REDACTED] was advised of the Blue Hart Program and provided with a magnet.

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On 04/22/2019 at 1836 hours Sgt. Shepherd #167, Ptl. Lardieri #251, Ptl. Stephenson #278, Ptl. Firreno #283 and I, Ptl. Docherty #275 were dispatched to [REDACTED] Manasquan Court for a report of an overdose.

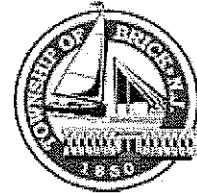
Upon arrival, I observed Ptl. Stephenson and Brick Medical Unit #533 administering first aid to the victim, who was identified as [REDACTED]. She was unconscious, lying face up on the kitchen floor and had agonal breathing. The caller [REDACTED] further advised that [REDACTED] had a history of drug use and abuse. Specifically, she has used heroin in the past. Ptl. Stephenson then administered one dose of Narcan. After doing so, [REDACTED] was still unresponsive as her condition did not change. Brick Medical Unit then administered a second dose of Narcan and [REDACTED] began to recover as her eyes opened and her breathing stabilized. As [REDACTED] gained consciousness, she was able to answer our questions. We asked her if she had consumed any narcotics today and she stated "It's a real possibility". [REDACTED] then denied all narcotic use and stated she did not use any heroin today.

While on scene, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] who is the boyfriend of [REDACTED] voluntarily escorted us through the residence to look for signs of narcotic use. We were unable to locate any CDS (controlled dangerous substances) or drug paraphernalia at the scene. [REDACTED] was then transported to the Ocean Medical Center hospital for further medical treatment. Prior to leaving the scene, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were advised of the Blue Hart program and were provided with a department issued informative magnet.

*Sgt. Petrola #201 of the Drug Enforcement Unit was contacted and advised of the incident as per departmental policy.

On 4/24/2019 at 1936 hours, Ptl. Fogarty #211, DEU Det. Alvarado #221, Ptl. Theibault #258, and I (Ptl. Oliverio #286) responded to [REDACTED] Primrose Ln in reference to a reported overdose. Dispatch advised the caller, [REDACTED], stated he found her sister on the bathroom floor and was suffering from an apparent overdose.

Upon arrival, Brick EMS #536 was already on location. The overdose victim [REDACTED] was laying on the kitchen floor, unconscious but breathing. Her eyes were pinpoint and I observed a white powder around her nostril (suspect heroin). Brick EMS administered one dose of 4mg Narcan to [REDACTED] who then regained consciousness.

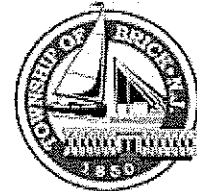
I then spoke with [REDACTED] who stated the following: at approximately 1930 hours, she heard a loud bang come from inside of her bathroom. When she opened the door she observed her sister unconscious on the floor. She dragged her into the kitchen and then contacted 911. Her sister has a history of drug abuse and was recently visiting her for the holidays.

[REDACTED] was transported to Ocean Medical Center, for further treatment without incident.

On scene I located one (1) green straw, with a unknown white powder (suspect heroin) located in a shirt pocket that [REDACTED] was wearing prior to our arrival. It was secured in a department issued evidence bag and placed into property.

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On April 25, 2019, at approximately 1341 hours, Sgt. Pacitti #238, Ptl. Lambert #152, and I, were dispatched to [REDACTED] Valhalla Drive for the report of a male possibly overdosing inside. We were advised by Dispatch that [REDACTED] called stating she was on the phone with her 37 year old son, [REDACTED], when it sounded like he collapsed and would no longer speak to her. She stated he has a history of CDS use and believes he is using again. She provided the garage door code and wished us to enter the residence to check on him. She advised his room was upstairs on the third floor.

Upon our arrival, his vehicle was observed in the driveway and there was no answer at the front door. The garage code provided by [REDACTED] was utilized to gain entry into the residence. [REDACTED] was located in his bedroom on the floor unconscious and unresponsive. [REDACTED] had agonal breathing and pin point pupils. A black shoe lace was observed tied around his arm. Sgt. Pacitti located two hypodermic needles, a silver metal spoon with a white cotton ball on it laying on the desk in [REDACTED] bedroom. A bundle of white wax folds with "frank lucas" stamped in black ink was also located in a silver box that was open on the desk. I administered one Narcan into [REDACTED] right nostril and began to supply oxygen via a bag valve mask. He continued to have agonal breathing for approximately ten minutes before Brick EMS arrived on scene and began to evaluate [REDACTED]. Brick EMS then administered another Narcan through his nostril and continued to provide oxygen. Approximately two minutes later, he began to open his eyes and speak with EMS personnel. He advised he has been clean for 47 days but used one or two bags today from what he can remember. He believes he flushed the empty bags down the toilet in his room prior to our arrival. [REDACTED] was escorted outside to the stretcher and was transported to Ocean Medical Center for further treatment and evaluation.

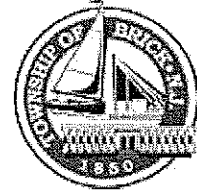
[REDACTED] was contacted via telephone and advised [REDACTED] was being transported to OMC and her house was re-secured.

The evidence recovered from the scene was logged into property to be tested.

DEU Sgt. Petrola #201 was advised of the incident.

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On 05/02/2019 at approximately 1414 hours, Ptl. McGrath #277 and I, Ptl. Caulfield #235, responded to [REDACTED] Easy Street in reference to a first aid call involving an unconscious female. Dispatch received a 911 call reporting a female subject in her 20's was unconscious and was experiencing agonal breathing. Furthermore, dispatch reported the female subject possibly ingested drugs and was potentially overdosing.

Upon arrival, I was directed to an upstairs bedroom where I observed a female subject, identified as [REDACTED], lying on the ground next to a bed. [REDACTED] was unconscious, unresponsive, had agonal breathing, and her face/skin tone was gray colored. The male caller, identified as [REDACTED], reported that [REDACTED] ingested an unknown amount of heroin in the house and passed out in an upstairs bedroom. After [REDACTED] was unable to wake [REDACTED], he called 911 to report [REDACTED] had overdosed on drugs. At that time, I administered one 4mg dose of Narcan (Naloxone) in [REDACTED]'s nostril in an effort to reverse the drug overdose affect.

After approximately one to three minutes, [REDACTED] became conscious, alert, and was up and talking. [REDACTED] reported she had ingested a three bags of heroin while inside the house with [REDACTED] and another unidentified female. According to [REDACTED], she and the unidentified female traveled to the Seaside Heights, NJ area to purchase heroin and then drove to [REDACTED] Easy Street in Brick, NJ for the purpose of ingesting the drug(s). [REDACTED] reported the home owner/resident of [REDACTED] Easy Street is another unidentified female friend who was not in the house at the time of the overdose. [REDACTED] never identified the two female subjects and their identity is still unknown at the time of this report.

In the bedroom where [REDACTED] had overdosed, two white colored wax folds stamped, "Guns & Roses," in red ink were located and recovered. In addition, two hypodermic needles were located and recovered from the same bedroom. Brick Police EMS Unit# 532 responded to the scene and transported Hedden to Ocean Medical Center in Brick, NJ for further treatment.

The two wax folds and two hypodermic needles were logged in property and placed in evidence locker #8. A NJ Attorney General's Naloxone Administering Reporting Form was completed, faxed, and filed. A Naloxone Replenishment Form was also completed as per policy. Def. Alvarado #221, Brick PD DEU, was contacted and notified of the incident, as well.
