Mayor Brown,

As Council President, on behalf of the governing body, as my authority to do so, I requested for the Borough Clerk to rescind the 48 Hour Notice for the Special Meeting, even prior to her sending out the notice, and on multiple occasions thereafter. It is my authority, due to the "Weak Mayor" form of government we possess in Neptune City, to authorize for a Special Meeting to be called and for a 48 Hour Notice to be rescinded. Unfortunately, the Borough Clerk refused to rescind the notice, which is a separate issue that will be dealt with accordingly.

There is no issue to solve tonight. Resolution 2019-17 was unnecessary. It is not needed. That's why it was tabled. It can be tabled indefinitely if the Council so chooses. A vote will not take place tonight because a quorum will not be meeting tonight.

On January 1st, Council passed Resolution 2019-19, which contains everything necessary for payment of payroll, bills and for the borough office to proceed with business as usual. This has been confirmed by multiple attorneys and by various government professionals. For you to have stated otherwise might have been ignorance at first, but to continue on with any other charade is completely unethical.

You did not have the authority to instruct the Borough Clerk to send out the email on January 1st to employees telling them they would not get paid on the 15th. The Borough Clerk's action, sending out that memo, incited fear and panic throughout town. If you choose to be ethical, you and the Borough Clerk can apologize to the employees for your error.

I remind you that we have a "Weak Mayor" form of government, and your only authority as the Mayor, from this point forward this year, is to conduct the council meetings according to "Robert's Rules of Order" and to vote if there is a tie. Employees report to the Council. They are to discuss issues with their Committee Chair. This is how our town was incorporated. This is our "Chain of Command".

We understand you might be having a difficult time dealing with a new Council party majority. Our town has been operating in a certain way for a long time, so it is understandable that it might take time for everyone to adjust. Having an open dialogue will help this transition take place more smoothly. I urge you to return my phone calls moving forward so as to prevent any other future misunderstandings and/or wrongdoing. We might not agree on everything, but we can engage in civil discussions, for the benefit of all our residents and employees.

Mrs. Brown,

Please be assured that the tabled resolution is not needed, nor is the Special Meeting. I have spoken with various professionals, including the two attorneys copied on this email. They all say the same thing, that Resolutions 2019-18 and 2019-19 are all that were needed passed in order for payroll to be met and bills to be paid as usual. These two resolutions (18 & 19) were well-provided for with detail and instruction according to state law. You are authorized to make all necessary payments at this time within the scope of the Temporary Budget.

The extra added resolution that Mr. Kocsis and I voted "yes" to last year was not needed either. It was also not the same. The language contained within it was quite different. Last year was the first year for any such similar resolution. Years prior, our government continued to function without it and without delay.

On behalf of the governing body, I instruct you to make all necessary payments within the scope of the Temporary Budget. If you fail to do so, then you risk legal charges being brought up against you.

The issues regarding your insubordination (inciting fear and panic by emailing a memo to department heads instructing them to inform all employees they will not be paid, defying my instruction to rescind the 48 Hour Special Meeting Notice on multiple occasions, and not answering my questions) will be dealt with at another time.

A quorum will not meet on Monday evening. There is no need.

Mayor and Council,

To address the previous emails. Yes, it is against the law to not pay our employees but the decision to table a resolution resulting in this outcome was the responsibility of this governing body. Therefore it is the governing body's responsibility to follow the laws set forth and my responsibility as the Municipal Clerk is to make sure you are following such laws. These actions are ultimately the responsibility of the Governing Body. To ask me as the Municipal Clerk to break the law and do something without the resolution authorizing as such after it was tabled and not have an attorney to reassure me that I am in no way held responsible is unacceptable. You are subjecting my certifications to consequences. I understand Ms. Lewis and Ms. Renee have both had conversations with Mr. Antonides. I have also had conversations with him. He is a very knowledgeable. However, he is not an attorney and cannot give a legal opinion.

Once again, I previously stated although this resolution is unnecessary, it was provided to me by the CFO who also provided it to me last year. It was on the agenda, the majority of the governing body chose to table it therefore action was taken. It is necessary to take further action in order to proceed with the resolution that is a legal document. Nowhere in this resolution is it stated it is for emergencies. This resolution is not for emergencies. This was NEVER an emergency meeting, it is not a cause for an emergency meeting. It is however a special meeting that is in place for the need to take action. If Ms. Renee contacted our CFO as she said she was going to, this would not be an issue. If no action is taken on Monday, the resolution cannot move forward. This will have consequences on this governing body and municipality as a whole. I would also like to remind Ms. Renee and Mr. Kocsis they voted yes to pass this exact same resolution on January 1, 2018.

I urge this governing body to research what their responsibilities are to this Municipality as Council members. And the laws that govern our form of government. Although I have only been an appointed Municipal Clerk for two years, I obtained my certification in 2011. I have been the Deputy Clerk and an assistant to the clerk since 2003 in Neptune City and have gained knowledge and experience in my profession.

Regarding the below, I am under the impression that this resolution, which calls for pre-paying all non-discretionary bills on a monthly basis, replaced an existing procedure of paying the bills bi-weekly with council approval. As such, I do not understand why we would not revert to the former system until such time as council can review and discuss a resolution to pay the bills on a monthly basis that everyone can agree on.

Another option would be to call a special council meeting prior to the next payroll run so that no Borough employee's pay is interrupted.

Lastly, I would recommend that the Borough CFO reach out to all members of the council ASAP as to why it is necessary to change standing procedure in this matter.
