-Read by Municipal Clerk at 7:17 P.M.

Roll Call

Present: Councilman Amato, Councilwoman Bellinger, Councilman Lagana, Councilman Nazziola, Councilman Verile, Councilwoman Warburton

-At this time the Mayor asks for a moment of silence to remember the victims of the typhoon in the Philippines

Mayor: Wants to extend any help he can to the Filipino community.

-The Mayor speaks about the events of last Monday. Talks about the job that our emergency personnel did. Commends this Governing Body for putting in place the leadership that we had during these trying times. The events turned out as well as they could under the circumstances. Westfield has done a tremendous job with training their personnel and lucky to have them as neighbors. We are proud of our Police Department and the job that they did. The Chief was the point man, coordinating the over 500 law enforcement officials there. Captain Guidetti did a tremendous job in assisting Chief Ehrenberg. It is appropriate to move Captain Guidetti to the Deputy Chief position.

At this time, the Mayor moves to the position of Deputy Chief, Robert Guidetti, with the condition of a salary freeze of one year

Discussion

Dr. Nazziola: Concerned because a couple years ago there was a Deputy Chief position but then it was decided that it was not needed. What has changed?

Mayor: Recognized the need for that position. Chief Ehrenberg agreed to same terms when promoted to Deputy Chief. Gives timeline for the promotion of Chief Ehrenberg.

Dr. Nazziola: Recalls more of a sense of urgency, Personnel concerns

Mr. D'Arco: Organizational structure and chain of command being reestablished.

Dr. Nazziola: If promote Captain to Dep. Chief, must promote someone to Captain.

Mayor: Explains situation, there will be assignments in absence of Captain, also have temporary appointments of four Lieutenants on for tonight.

Dr. Nazziola: Reluctant to promote.

Mayor: Chief will assign Captain duties to Lieutenants

Mrs. Warburton: Trying to build from bottom up and get more police on streets, will this hinder that goal financially?

Mayor: Already posted for four additional officers

Dr. Nazzola: Prefers to keep this candidate as Captain.

Mayor: With situation last Monday, numerous law enforcement agencies there, appreciates his position, moves as a Governing Body have worked out well, more work to be done though

Mrs. Warburton: If this is done, can we still move forward with hiring four more police officers for 2014?

Mr. Lagana: This does not affect our ability to hire, this is just leadership at the top.

Dr. Nazzola: May not be the right time to do this yet.

Mayor: With the events of last Monday, highlighted good that has been done but also highlighted work that still needs to be done.

Mayor: Thursday night at 6:00 P.M. Garden State Plaza is opening their new parking garage. All are invited.

3. ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

- AR James is on schedule for shelter replacements
- Still need to meet with the Mayor and Borough Engineer Peter Ten Kate regarding solar panels at the Pool and Firehouses. Also going to explore solar panels for the Golf Course building as well.
- All roofs are repaired at the Firehouse, Police Dept. and Library.
- Status report attached for the Borough Engineer.

Mayor: There's an encroachment of Paramus Golf Course onto Ridgewood Country Club and there is an encroachment of Ridgewood Country Club onto Paramus Golf Course. The areas are almost exactly the same. Ridgewood wants to make repairs and perfect an easement that allows them to make improvements and they will do the same for us. Golf Course Superintendent Andy Schuckers is in agreement. Ridgewood would like to know quickly as they would like to make improvements this winter. If it's alright with the Council, resolution can be added this evening. Asks Borough Attorney to make sure that there is no issue with Green Acres. Council would like to hear from Mr. Schuckers before acting.

Andy Schuckers

-Where the tornado came through a month ago is our 11th, 12th, and 13th hole. The fence put in between Paramus Golf Course and Ridgewood Country Club is on our property by about 3500 sq. ft. Conversely, our recycling area is on their property by about the same amount of square feet. Basically, the agreement allows each to use the property that encroaches upon the other's property.

Mayor: Wants to make sure that there is no issue with Green Acres, Borough Attorney will research.

Mrs. Warburton: Why the need to make a decision so quickly?

Mr. Schuckers: Doesn't know the reason other than the fact that they want to make repairs. Some of the fence is down from the tornado. Golf Commission is in full agreement.

Mr. D'Arco: Emergency Generators moving along, project is in full swing.

-Discussion last year about the drains for the Kiddie Pool at the Paramus Pool. That project has been completed and meets all certifications.

Mrs. Warburton: After meeting with Pool Commission, they were surprised that Allstate was back after the 2008 situation that occurred.

Mr. D'Arco: They were the low bidder, basic job, no problems, awarded to low bidder.

-Midland Avenue signaling has been adjusted;

-NJDEP Street Cleaning Grant, slim possibility, not recommended.

-CDBG Grants are moving forward, need clarification on one Grant and still have to come before the Governing Body

-2014 Budget process has started at the Administrative level

- Washington Township sewer charges, trying to meet with them, sent them information, requesting attorney's meet
- Police Promotional Ordinance needs to be addressed after Police Committee meeting with PBA

Mrs. Bellinger: Adding some language to the Ordinance, mostly administrative, must serve as detective, change "within six months" to "not Less than six months", Commendations, some positions generate letters, some don't, institute maximum. Different categories of disciplinary action, want to be consistent with Attorney General guidelines. Written exam was not broken down specifically.

Mayor and Council have a discussion about the role the Chief will play in the Promotional Process and the medical portion of the Promotional Process. Council is in agreement to keep 15 to 25 and medical.

Mr D'Arco: Postings for police officers are up.

- Communication from PSE&G in connection with the increase substation by the Fashion Center. The property that they have to expand through is a Borough easement, no intentions of selling or giving up to them. Discussion with PSE&G indicated that we will permit them to go through our property but they could not take our property or place things on our easement. Suggests that the Governing Body reserve that property.
 - Work continues in the Life Safety complex. New procedures and policies are in place for the Pistol Range.
 - Many pool activities ongoing. New issue relative to the removal of a cobblestone pad, recommend that the cobblestone be removed and put concrete down.
 - Recreation Center Committee for the Mayor and Council.
- Mayor: Attorney indicated that there was no issue, up to trustees to still discuss

Mrs. Warburton: Question about the Board of Education minutes, consensus was that they did not have enough information

Mayor: Volleyball Court and Bus repair bay discussed with the Board of Education. Ridge Ranch parking moving forward, Mr. D'Arco to speak with Peter Ten Kate to help expedite.

Mr. D'Arco: Donated Football storage container has been installed. Sending thank you to corporate.

- Completed employee handbook, working with an attorney from Mr. Kaufman's office, once finalized it will be distributed to the Governing Body.
