REQUEST TO APPLY FOR ACCIDENTAL DISABILITY RETIREMENT BENEFITS

Lorraine Mamrosh – Motor Vehicle Commission – The Board considered the eligibility of Lorraine Mamrosh to apply for Accidental Disability retirement benefits. After careful analysis, the Board determined that Ms. Mamrosh is ineligible to apply for such benefits and denied her request to do so. In making its determination, the Board relied on N.J.A.C. 17:1-6.4 and N.J.S.A. 43:15A-44. N.J.A.C. 17:1-6.4 states:

(a) Each disability retirement applicant must prove that his or her retirement is due to a total and permanent disability that renders the applicant physically or mentally incapacitated from performing normal or assigned job duties at the time the member left employment; the disability must be the reason the member left employment.

(b) Members who have involuntarily or voluntarily terminated service for any of the reasons listed below will not be permitted to apply for a disability retirement:

1. Removal for cause or total forfeiture of public service;
2. Settlement agreements reached due to pending administrative or criminal charges, unless the underlying charges relate to the disability;
3. Loss of licensure or certification required for the performance of the member's specific job duties;
4. Voluntary separation from service for reasons other than a disability; and
5. Job abolishment or reduction in force.

(c) The Division will review all disability retirement applications submitted after a member has terminated service to determine whether the member's application is eligible for processing, pursuant to (a) above.

[Emphasis added.]

The record before the Board establishes that Ms. Mamrosh filed her *Application for Disability Retirement* on November 8, 2020 requesting an Accidental Disability retirement effective December 1, 2020. On November 30, 2020, the Division received a *Certification of Service and Final Salary*, on which Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) indicated that Ms. Mamrosh was terminated due to administrative charges. MVC provided an addendum to the certification notifying the Division that Ms. Mamrosh had three disciplinary cases heard before an Arbitrator. The Opinion and Award (Award), In the Matter of Arbitration between the State of New Jersey (MVC) and CWA Local 1037, issued November 9, 2018, referred to a consolidated disciplinary appeal involving three separate disciplinary actions taken against Ms. Mamrosh. Office of Employee Relations (OER) Docket #11954 involved the arbitration appeal of a Final Notice of Disciplinary Action (FNDA) dated April 1, 2015 whereby Ms. Mamrosh received a 10-day suspension without pay on charges of Failure to Follow MVC Policies and Procedures and Neglect of Duty.

Lorraine Mamrosh – Motor Vehicle Commission – (continued)

OER Docket #12060 involved the arbitration appeal of a July 15, 2015 FNDA, whereby Ms. Mamrosh was demoted to the position of Senior Technician to Technician stemming from charges of Incompetency, Inefficiency or Failure to Perform Duties; MVC Disciplinary Guidelines Section II, (C) – Incompetency, Inefficiency or Failure to Perform Duties. Of note to the Board was OER Docket #14374, which involved an arbitration appeal of a December 7, 2016 FNDA, whereby Ms. Mamrosh was removed from employment, effective December 7, 2016. The history of that case reveals that by way of an amended Preliminary Notice of Disciplinary Action, dated December 30, 2015, MVC sought Ms. Mamrosh's removal, charging her with:

N.J.A.C. 4A:2-2.3 (a) 12 – Other Sufficient Cause, MVC Disciplinary Guidelines, Section II (M) – Failure to Follow MVC Policies & Procedures and/or DOP Rules & Regulations

N.J.A.C. 4A:2-2.3 (a) 7 – Neglect of Duty; MVC Disciplinary Guidelines Section II (D) – Neglect of Duty

N.J.A.C. 4A:2-2.3 (a) 12 – Other Sufficient Cause, MVC Disciplinary Guidelines Section III (F) - Falsification or Tampering and/or Alteration of Public Records or Information

N.J.A.C. 4A:2-2.3 (a) 6 – Conduct Unbecoming a Public Employee, MVC Disciplinary Guidelines Section III (J-1) Conduct Unbecoming a Public Employee

The specifications on the amended PNDA indicate that:

On September 22, 2014, [Ms. Mamrosh] failed to follow MVC policy and procedure, and neglected [her] duty by not properly completing the SAVE check which is required when a customer presents a Permanent Resident Card. [Ms. Mamrosh] initialed her application and wrote on it that [she] completed the SAVE check on this customer, however the SAVE process was not completed as [Ms. Mamrosh] did not receive a positive response. Consequently, the customer left the agency with a valid Identification Card. [Ms. Mamrosh's] continual neglecting of [her] duty and [her] willful failure to follow MVC Policies and Procedures will no longer be tolerated by the Commission.

On October 31, 2014, [Ms. Mamrosh] again failed to follow MVC Policies and Procedures when [she] processed a motor vehicle transaction while signed into the Comp System under the log on of a co-worker. [Ms. Mamrosh] compounded the error when [she] approached said co-worker and asked her to write her initials on the application. After she correctly refused to do so, [Ms. Mamrosh] falsified the document and forged her initials on the application as if she processed the transaction when she did not.

Additionally, on November 17, 2014, [Ms. Mamrosh] failed to follow MVC Policies and Procedures when [she] processed a duplicate registration for [her] husband, John Mamrosh, which was transaction number LK20143210227. After printing this document, [Ms. Mamrosh] voided it out of the system, then stamped the document "VOID" and signed the document. [Ms. Mamrosh] failed to write a reason for this voided document and [she] did not write a redo number on this document. This document was scanned into the MATRX system; however this did not contain the registration document. [Ms. Mamrosh] failed to follow MVC Policies and Procedures, which prohibit MVC employees from processing any work for family and friends.

Ms. Mamrosh requested a hearing, which took place on October 27, 2016. In his report, the Hearing Officer referred to Ms. Mamrosh's disciplinary history, which involved multiple charges of Failure to Follow MVC Policies and Procedures and upheld the charges in the amended PNDA. Accordingly, by way of an FNDA, MVC removed Ms. Mamrosh from employment effective December 7, 2016. In the Award, the Arbitrator concluded that MVC had just cause to remove her. The record before the Board clearly indicates that Ms. Mamrosh did not separate from employment due to an alleged disability, which is the requirement for applying for a Disability retirement as outlined in N.J.A.C. 17:1-6.4. Rather, disciplinary matters between Ms. Mamrosh and MVC led to charges, which resulted in her removal. Further, the Board noted that in order to comply with N.J.S.A. 43:15A-44, a member seeking a disability retirement must have a position to return to should the alleged disability diminish to the point that the member could return to employment. N.J.S.A. 43:15A-44 states, in pertinent part:

...
If the report of the medical board shall show that such beneficiary is able to perform either his former duty or other comparable duty which his former employer is willing to assign to him, the beneficiary shall report for duty; such a beneficiary shall not suffer any loss of benefits while he awaits his restoration to active service. If the beneficiary fails to return to duty within 10 days after being ordered so to do, or within such further time as may be allowed by the board of trustees for valid reason, as the case may be, the pension shall be discontinued during such default.
...

Thus, if Ms. Mamrosh were granted an Accidental Disability pension, but later it was determined that she is no longer disabled, there is no mechanism for the Board to stop paying the pension because Ms. Mamrosh could never be ordered to return to work, as required by N.J.S.A. 43:15A-44. Granting a disability retirement under such circumstances would be in contravention of the statutory scheme, and place the Board in the position of potentially paying a pension for which the Board has no ability or mechanism to terminate the disability pension payment. For the foregoing reasons, the Board determined that Ms. Mamrosh is ineligible to apply for Accidental Disability (or Ordinary) retirement benefits. (Motion made by Trustee Culliton; seconded by Trustee Smith.)

(A motion was made by Trustee Hurst; seconded by Trustee O'Brien to enter into Open Session.)

Dalton Bramwell – Office of the Public Defender – The Board considered all documentation in the record concerning the circumstances under which Dalton Bramwell separated from employment to determine what impact, if any, it may have on Mr. Bramwell's Early retirement benefits, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 43:1-3. N.J.S.A. 43:1-3 establishes 11 factors, which the Board is to consider and balance in view of the pension statutes when determining whether forfeiture or partial forfeiture of pension service credit is appropriate. These factors are:

1. **The member's length of service;**
Dalton Bramwell has 29 years and 8 months of service credit in the PERS;
2. **The basis of retirement;**
At its meeting of June 20, 2018, the Board approved Dalton Bramwell's application for Early retirement benefits effective July 1, 2018. However, at the time of its approval the Board was unaware of his administrative charges;
3. **The extent to which the member's pension has vested;**
Dalton Bramwell was vested in the PERS for a July 1, 2018, retirement and was 54 years old as of the date of his last pension contribution;
4. **The duties of the particular member;**
Dalton Bramwell held the position of Investigator 1, Public Defender. In this position, he was assigned the more complex and/or specialized field and office work involved in the preparation of cases for the representation of clients. The caseload involved individuals with mental illness or developmental disabilities;
5. **The member's public employment history and record covered under the retirement system;**
Dalton Bramwell was enrolled in the PERS as a result of his employment with the Public Advocate as a Field Representative 3 on October 22, 1988. He held various positions and continued his membership in the PERS. In October 1992, he became an Investigator for the Public Advocate/Public Defender. On April 26, 2008 he was promoted to Senior Investigator and ultimately, on July 12, 2014, he was promoted to Investigator 1, Public Defender which was the position he held when he resigned from employment;
6. **Any other public employment;**
None noted;
7. **The nature of the misconduct or crime, including the gravity or substantiality of the offense, whether it was a single or multiple offense and whether it was continuing or isolated;**
On February 21, 2018, a Preliminary Notice of Disciplinary Action charged Dalton Bramwell with Conduct Unbecoming a Public Employee and Other Sufficient Cause-Violation of Policy Against Discrimination, Harassment or Hostile Environments in the Workplace. Specifically, a complaint with the Affirmative Action Officer for the Office of the Public Defender (OPD) was filed by one of Dalton Bramwell's female co-workers accusing him of sexual harassment and creating a hostile work environment. An investigation determined that in September 2016, Dalton Bramwell started to approach the female with unwelcomed communication and actions that were sexually implied. Dalton Bramwell would frequent the female's office for personal reasons. During one of these visits to her office, Dalton Bramwell remarked that he remembered her as a child and that he no longer viewed her as a child to which the female co-worker demanded him to "move on" because his visit was unrelated to business.

In another incident, Dalton Bramwell asked the female about a tattoo on her neck and if she had a tattoo on her "butt." This comment made her exceedingly uncomfortable and she responded by walking away from him without a reply and reported the incident to a Supervisor who spoke to Dalton Bramwell regarding his actions and advised he keep his conversations with all staff professional and work-related. Unwelcomed advances from Dalton Bramwell toward his female co-worker continued subsequent to his supervisor's instructions on professional and work related interactions. Of these incidences, four specific occurrences in violation of sexual harassment were reported by the female co-worker. The first incident occurred in a common area in the workplace kitchen where Dalton Bramwell held a conversation of a sexual nature while on the phone in a voice that was calculated to ensure his female co-worker could hear the conversation. The next incident occurred in the conference room where Dalton Bramwell approached the female co-worker and touched her neck without her consent to which she forcefully responded, "Do not touch me." Dalton Bramwell then proceeded to sit next to her despite knowing his presence made her uncomfortable. The third incident involved Dalton Bramwell following the female co-worker down the hall and to her office while making comments about her hair and stating "You have a lot of hair - you going to give me some." Again, the female co-worker disapproved of his actions and responded by closing her office door on Dalton Bramwell while he was still speaking. The fourth reported incident occurred on August 22, 2017, in the lunchroom, where Dalton Bramwell attempted to converse with another male co-worker about sexual contents in his cell phone while in the presence of the female co-worker and another female. The comments made the male co-worker uncomfortable and he apologized to the women for Dalton Bramwell's inappropriate behavior and discussed his recent sexual harassment training. During an interview, Dalton Bramwell admitted that his comments were of a sexual nature. The OPD ordered Dalton Bramwell's removal subsequent to the findings of the investigation. The Board found the misconduct was grave and substantial, and it occurred on numerous occasions including after he was counseled as to his egregious behavior;

8. **The relationship between the misconduct and the member's public duties;**
Direct;
9. **The quality of moral turpitude or the degree of guilt or culpability, including the member's motives and reasons, personal gain and similar considerations;**
The Board found that the misconduct involved a high degree of guilt and culpability, and was motivated by his personal gratification;
10. **The availability and adequacy of other penal sanctions;**
In a settlement agreement between Dalton Bramwell and the Office used to resolve this matter, and prior unrelated matter that resulted in a twenty day paid suspension, the Office agreed to accept Dalton Bramwell's resignation effective June 30, 2018, and Dalton Bramwell agreed to never seek to gain employment, temporary or permanent with the Office or any other state entity in the future. Dalton Bramwell applied for a retirement benefit effective July 1, 2018;
11. **Other personal circumstances relating to the member which bear upon the justness of forfeiture;**
The Board noted that Dalton Bramwell did not appear at the meeting.

The record before the Board reveals that Mr. Bramwell was enrolled in the PERS effective October 22, 1988, as a result of his employment with the Public Advocate as a Field Representative 3. At the time of his last pension contribution on July 6, 2018, Mr. Bramwell held the title of Investigator 1, Public Defender. The record indicates that he resigned from employment due to administrative charges. On February 21, 2018, a Preliminary Notice of Disciplinary Action charged Mr. Bramwell with Conduct Unbecoming a Public Employee and Other Sufficient Cause-Violation of Policy Against Discrimination, Harassment or Hostile Environments in the Workplace. Specifically, a complaint with the Affirmative Action Officer for the Office of the Public Defender (OPD) was filed by one of Mr. Bramwell's female co-workers accusing him of sexual harassment and creating a hostile work environment. An investigation determined that in September 2016, Mr. Bramwell started to approach the female with unwelcomed communication and actions that were sexually implied. In a settlement agreement between Mr. Bramwell and the Office used to resolve this matter, and a prior unrelated matter in which he was charged with insubordination that resulted in a twenty-day paid suspension, the Office agreed to accept Mr. Bramwell's resignation effective June 30, 2018, and he agreed to never seek to gain any type of employment with the Office or any other state entity in the future. Mr. Bramwell applied for a retirement benefit effective July 1, 2018.

After careful consideration of the above in light of the statutory forfeiture provisions of N.J.S.A. 43:1-3, the Board found that Mr. Bramwell's misconduct was grave and substantial and occurred on numerous occasions over a continuous period of time, even after he was counseled as to the misconduct and how it impacted his female co-worker. The Board found that the misconduct was directly related to Mr. Bramwell's employment. The Board further found that the misconduct involved a high degree of guilt and culpability and was for his personal gratification. Therefore, the Board determined that a forfeiture of all service and salary credit earned as of September 1, 2016 through the termination of Mr. Bramwell's employment was warranted in light of the serious nature of his misconduct. The decrease in Mr. Bramwell's monthly retirement benefit will be retroactive to his effective retirement date of July 1, 2018. (Motion made by Trustee Hurst; seconded by Trustee Culliton.)

(A motion was made by Trustee Hurst to adopt Resolution B and enter into Executive Session; seconded by Trustee Brown. A motion was made to enter back into Open Session by Trustee Smith; seconded by Trustee Hurst. DAG Kelly recused. DAG Jeffrey Padgett provided legal counsel to the Board.)

Margaret Square – Treasury – Division of State Lottery – The Board considered the personal statements of Margaret Square and all documentation in the record concerning Ms. Square's resignation from service to determine what impact, if any, it may have on her application for a Service retirement, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 43:1-3. N.J.S.A. 43:1-3 establishes 11 factors, which the Board is to consider and balance in view of the pension statutes when determining whether forfeiture or partial forfeiture of the pension service credit is appropriate. These factors are:

1. **The member's length of service;**
Margaret Square has 48 years and 5 months of service credit in the PERS;
2. **The basis of retirement;**
At its meeting of September 15, 2021, the Board approved Margaret Square's application for Service retirement effective October 1, 2021. However, at the time of its approval the Board was unaware of her administrative charges;
3. **The extent to which the member's pension has vested;**
Margaret Square was vested in the PERS and was 72 years of age as of the date of her last pension contribution;
4. **The duties of the particular member;**
Margaret Square held the position of Deputy Director of the State Lottery. In this position, she would assume the role of Director in their absence, plan, organize, and direct all activities related to ensuring the security, honesty, and integrity of Lottery operations;
5. **The member's public employment history and record covered under the retirement system;**
Margaret Square was enrolled in the PERS on January 6, 1973, as a result of her employment as a Clerk Typist with the New Jersey Department of Treasury-Division of the State Lottery (Division). Throughout her employment, she held various job titles, and at the time of her resignation on September 30, 2021, she held the position of Deputy Director. The record indicates that pension contributions were remitted through September 10, 2021;
6. **Any other public employment;**
None noted;

- 7. The nature of the misconduct or crime, including the gravity or substantiality of the offense, whether it was a single or multiple offense and whether it was continuing or isolated;**

By way of a Preliminary Notice of Disciplinary Action (PNDA), Margaret Square was charged with Incompetency, Inefficiency or Failure to Perform Duties, Conduct Unbecoming a Public Employee, and Other Sufficient Cause. The Other Sufficient Cause charge included the following: Misuse of Official Position, Theft, Violation of Public Trust, Violation of the State of New Jersey's Uniform Ethics Code and Violation of the Plain Language Guide to New Jersey's Executive Branch Ethic Standards. Specifically, as a result of a Pre-Hire Ethics Questionnaire submitted to the Treasury's Ethics Officer by a possible candidate for the Technical Assistant position, an investigation into a possible ethical violation related to the hiring of a relative was conducted. It was determined that Margaret Square did not disclose that a niece by marriage was an applicant for the Technical Assistant position. Margaret Square was responsible for the review of all eligible applicants to determine who would be given an interview. Furthermore, she conducted the interviews along with the supervisor of the unit and ultimately selected her niece for the position, which nearly resulted in the extension of a job offer. The investigation found that Margaret Square did violate the Conflict of Interest Law and Uniform Ethics Code. The findings were forwarded to the State Ethics Commission (SEC) with a recommendation for discipline, which was upheld by the SEC. The Board found that the misconduct was serious and occurred on a number of occasions, and continued throughout the hiring process;

- 8. The relationship between the misconduct and the member's public duties;**

Direct;

- 9. The quality of moral turpitude or the degree of guilt or culpability, including the member's motives and reasons, personal gain and similar considerations;**

The misconduct involved a high degree of guilt and the member's motives were for personal gain in that her misconduct benefited a family member;

- 10. The availability and adequacy of other penal sanctions;**

On September 17, 2021, both parties entered into a Settlement Agreement. Margaret Square's employer agreed to hold the PNDA from September 15, 2021, which imposed a forty-five day suspension, in abeyance pending the outcome of the member's retirement effective October 1, 2021. If the retirement was approved then her employer would agree to rescind the discipline. In the event that the retirement application was not approved or Margaret Square amended the effective date of retirement later than October 1, 2021, then her employer would issue a Final Notice of Disciplinary Action for the mentioned PNDA. The suspension days would then be scheduled at a later date;

- 11. Other personal circumstances relating to the member which bear upon the justness of forfeiture;**

The Board noted the member appeared before the Board and was remorseful. The Board also noted her length of employment with no previous issues.

The record before the Board reveals that Ms. Square was enrolled in the PERS effective January 6, 1973, as a result of her employment with the New Jersey Department of Treasury – Division of the State Lottery as a Clerk Typist. At the time of her last pension contribution on September 10, 2021, Ms. Square held the title of Deputy Director of the State Lottery.

The record indicates that she resigned from employment due to administrative charges. By way of a Preliminary Notice of Disciplinary Action (PNDA), Ms. Square was charged with Incompetency, Inefficiency or Failure to Perform Duties, Conduct Unbecoming a Public Employee, and Other Sufficient Cause. The Other Sufficient Cause charge includes the following; Misuse of Official Position, Theft, Violation of Public Trust, Violation of the State of New Jersey's Uniform Ethics Code and Violation of the Plain Language Guide to New Jersey's Executive Branch Ethic Standards. Specifically, as a result of a Pre-Hire Ethics Questionnaire submitted to the Treasury's Ethics Officer by a possible candidate for the Technical Assistant position, an investigation into a possible ethics violation related to the hiring of a relative was conducted. It was determined that Ms. Square did not disclose that a niece by marriage was an applicant for the Technical Assistant position. If the retirement was approved then Ms. Square's employer agreed to rescind the discipline. In the event that the retirement application was not approved or if Ms. Square amended the effective date of retirement later than October 1, 2021, then her employer would issue a Final Notice of Disciplinary Action for the mentioned PNDA. The suspension days would then be scheduled at a later date. After careful consideration of the above in light of the statutory forfeiture provisions of N.J.S.A. 43:1-3, the Board found that Ms. Square's misconduct was serious and occurred on numerous occasions throughout the hiring process. The Board found that the misconduct was directly related to her employment. The Board further found that the misconduct involved a high degree of guilt and culpability, and Ms. Square's motives were to benefit a family member. Based on its findings above, the Board determined that a forfeiture of Ms. Square's last year of service and salary credit earned is an appropriate penalty in light of the serious nature of her misconduct. Thereafter, the Board approved Ms. Square's application for a Service retirement effective October 1, 2021, under her selection of Option C. (Motion made by Trustee Bruno; seconded by Trustee Culliton.)

APPEALS THE DIVISION'S DETERMINATION THAT POST-RETIREMENT EMPLOYMENT VIOLATED PERS REGULATIONS FOR DISABILITY RETIREES

Larry Watkins – Camden City Housing Authority – The Board was prepared to consider the matter of Larry Watkins' appeal of the Division's determination that Mr. Watkins' post-retirement employment was in violation of PERS regulations for Disability retirees. However, the Board voted to table the matter in order to allow Mr. Watkins to appear before the Board. Therefore, the matter was placed on the Board's March 16, 2022, agenda. (Motion made by Trustee Hurst; seconded by Trustee Smith.)

REQUEST TO STAY IMPLEMENTATION OF THE BOARD'S DECISION PENDING RESOLUTION IN THE OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE LAW

(A motion was made by Trustee Hurst to adopt Resolution B and enter into Executive Session; seconded by Trustee Brown. A motion was made to enter back into Open Session by Trustee Hurst; seconded by Trustee Culliton.)

Ulrich Steinberg – Plainfield City – The Board considered the statements of attorney, Corey M. Sargeant on behalf of attorney, Michael Bukosky's client, Ulrich Steinberg, and Mr. Bukosky's application requesting the Board to stay the implementation of the decision of the Division finding that he violated the PERS return-to-employment rules after his retirement. This matter involves the Board's October 18, 2021, decision to require Mr. Steinberg to repay to the PERS all pension benefits received while he was in violation of PERS return-to-employment rules. Subsequent to the Board's decision, Ian Novak, a Division employee, wrote to Mr. Steinberg and advised that he had received a total of \$58,309.44 in retirement benefits during the violations period. Mr. Novak advised that a monthly deduction of \$971.83 would begin with his February 1, 2022, pension check, continuing for 60 months in order to settle the outstanding obligation to the Fund. After careful consideration, the Board denied Mr. Bukosky's request for a stay of the recovery of improperly received pension benefits because his application did not meet the threshold for emergent relief that would prevent the Board from seeking recoupment of the monies owed to Fund. Crowe v. DeGioia, 90 N.J. 126, 133 (1982) ("One principle is that a preliminary injunction should not issue except when necessary to prevent irreparable harm.") The Appellate Division's February 4, 2022 Order, denying Mr. Steinberg's request for a stay, noted that he had made no showing of irreparable harm to justify emergent relief. As this matter is now in the Office of Administrative Law, in the event that Mr. Steinberg successfully appeals the Board's decision, all monies previously recouped by the Board would be repaid to him. Thus, Mr. Steinberg would not suffer irreparable harm as a result of the denial of his application, as he would be made whole in the event he is successful on the merits of his case. It is also well settled that the Trustees act as "fiduciaries and therefore have a duty to protect the fund and the interests of all beneficiaries thereof." Mount v. Trustees, Pub. Emp. Retirement Sys., 133 N.J. Super. 72, 86 (App. Div. 1975). The Board, therefore, determined that the recoupment of improperly paid pension benefits should be implemented to ensure that the monies are repaid. (Motion made by Trustee Hurst; seconded by Trustee Brown.)

INITIAL DECISIONS

Meghan Horan – Rowan University – The Board considered the following documents in Meghan Horan's appeal of the Board's denial of her application for Ordinary Disability retirement benefits: the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Jeffrey R. Wilson, dated January 6, 2022; and all exhibits. Thereafter, the Board adopted the ALJ's decision to dismiss Ms. Horan's appeal due to her failure to appear. (Motion made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee O'Brien.)

Benita Dickerson – Woodbine Developmental Center – The Board considered the following documents in Benita Dickerson's appeal of the Board's denial of her application for Accidental Disability retirement benefits: the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) David M. Fritch, dated December 8, 2021; and all exhibits. Thereafter, the Board adopted the ALJ's decision to dismiss Ms. Dickerson's appeal due to her failure to prosecute her petition. (Motion made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee O'Brien.)

Patricia Turzanski – Moorestown Twp BOE – The Board considered the following documents in the appeal of attorney, Barbara E. Riefberg, on behalf of her client, Patricia Turzanski: the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Kathleen M. Calemme, dated December 29, 2021;¹ and all exhibits. Thereafter, the Board voted to adopt the ALJ's decision, thereby reversing its original determination. The Board considers Ms. Turzanski totally and permanently disabled from the performance of her regular assigned work duties. Therefore, Ms. Turzanski is approved for Ordinary Disability retirement benefits effective July 1, 2019 under her selection of the Maximum Option. (Motion made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee O'Brien.)

Frantz Gilot – Passaic County – The Board considered the following documents in the appeal of attorney, Ronald Ricci, on behalf of his client, Frantz Gilot: the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Ernest M. Bongiovanni, dated January 6, 2022; and all exhibits. Thereafter, the Board adopted the ALJ's decision affirming the Board's denial of Mr. Gilot's application for Ordinary Disability retirement benefits. (Motion made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee O'Brien.)

Silvio Acosta – West New York Town – The Board considered the following documents in the appeal of attorney, John D. Feeley, on behalf of his client, Silvio Acosta: the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Nanci G. Stokes, dated January 12, 2022; and all exhibits. Thereafter, the Board voted to adopt the ALJ's decision, thereby reversing its original determination. The Board considers Mr. Acosta totally and permanently disabled from the performance of his regular assigned work duties. Therefore, Mr. Acosta is approved for Ordinary Disability retirement benefits effective July 1, 2019 under his selection of Option B. (Motion made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee Hurst.)

Nurya Noriega – Bergen County – The Board considered the following documents in the appeal of attorney, Samuel J. Halpern, on behalf of his client, Nurya Noriega: the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Barry E. Moscovitz, dated January 20, 2022; and all exhibits. Thereafter, the Board adopted the ALJ's decision affirming the Board's denial of Ms. Noriega's application for Accidental Disability retirement benefits. (Motion made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee Hurst.)

APPELLATE DIVISION DECISIONS

John Mignone – Treasury – Division of Taxation – The Court affirmed the Board's denial of Ordinary Disability retirement benefits. (Noted by Trustee Brown.)

(A motion was made by Trustee O'Brien to adopt Resolution B and enter into Executive Session; seconded by Trustee Brown. A motion was made to enter back into Open Session by Trustee Hurst; seconded by Trustee Brown.)

Ricky Marter – Monmouth County/Hall of Records – At its meeting of November 7, 2011, the Board denied Ricky Marter's application for Accidental Disability retirement benefits. A timely appeal was filed and the Board approved a hearing in the Office of Administrative Law (OAL). At its meeting of February 26, 2019, the Board reconsidered and denied Mr. Marter's application and the matter continued in the OAL.

¹ The Board requested and was granted an extension of time to issue its final administrative determination.

In her Initial Decision, dated January 23, 2020, Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Mary Ann Bogan affirmed the Board's denial of Accidental Disability retirement benefits. The Board adopted ALJ Bogan's decision at its February 19, 2020 meeting. An appeal was filed with the New Jersey Superior Court – Appellate Division. Subsequently, the Appellate Court remanded the matter to the Board for reconsideration or further fact-finding on the issue of causation. At its meeting of February 16, 2022, the Board remanded the matter to the OAL for further fact-finding consistent with the Court's decision. (Motion made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee Hurst.)

DISCUSSION OF PENDING LITIGATION IN THE OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE LAW

(A motion was made by Trustee O'Brien to adopt Resolution B and enter into Executive Session; seconded by Trustee Brown. A motion was made to enter back into Open Session by Trustee Smith; seconded by Trustee Brown.)

Joseph Coronato – Ocean County – The Board was prepared to consider the settlement offer attorney, Angelo J. Genova submitted to the Board regarding his client, Joseph Coronato, to resolve his matter which is currently pending in the Office of Administrative Law. The Board considered Mr. Genova's statements on behalf of Mr. Coronato, the statements of DAG Jeffrey Padgett, and all documentation in the record. After careful consideration, the Board voted to table the matter until the Prosecutors Part of PERS regulations have been published. (Motion made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee Smith.)

FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DETERMINATION & REQUEST FOR EMERGENT RELIEF – TEMPORARY DISABILITY RETIREMENT BENEFITS

Donna Walton – Dept. of Education – At its meeting on January 19, 2022, the Board considered the Initial Decision (ID) of the Honorable Elaine B. Frick, Administrative Law Judge (ALJ), dated November 29, 2021,² all exhibits, exceptions filed by Deputy Attorney General (DAG) Yi Zhu, dated December 9, 2021, and exceptions filed by Donna Walton, dated January 13, 2022.³ After careful consideration, the Board voted to adopt the ALJ's factual findings, but to reject her legal conclusion that Ms. Walton provided documentation that satisfied the regulatory requirements for an application for Accidental Disability (AD) retirement benefits and that the Board should consider the application on its merits. The Board directed the Secretary to draft findings of fact and conclusions of law consistent with its decision for presentation at its meeting of February 16, 2022. The record indicates that Ms. Walton originally filed an application for AD retirement benefits on June 15, 2015, with an effective date of July 1, 2015. On January 5, 2016, the Division notified Ms. Walton that she was unable to file for an AD retirement and required her to change her retirement type to Ordinary Disability. The letter further stated that Ms. Walton's application would be closed on February 15, 2016 if she failed to provide the requisite medical documentation before that date. Ms. Walton appealed this administrative determination to the PERS Board. At its meeting of March 16, 2016, the Board approved Ms. Walton's request to file for an AD retirement on the condition that all medical documentation be received by April 18, 2016.

² The Board requested and was granted an extension of time until February 28, 2022 to issue its final administrative determination.

Donna Walton – Dept. of Education – (continued)

On April 26, 2016, as a courtesy, the Board office left a voice message to inform Ms. Walton that the deadline had passed and to provide her one final opportunity to submit her medical documentation and avoid the closing of her application. On June 2, 2016, Ms. Walton was notified by the Board office that her original application was closed. No appeal was received regarding the closure of the retirement application Ms. Walton filed on June 15, 2015. Subsequently, on November 10, 2016, Ms. Walton submitted a new application for AD retirement benefits, with an effective date of December 1, 2016. The record shows that Ms. Walton was sent notices dated December 12, 2016, January 11, 2017, and February 13, 2017 requesting the medical documentation that she was responsible to provide within six months of application. On July 10, 2017, the Disability Retirement Section closed Ms. Walton's second application, because she failed to provide the necessary medical documentation within the requisite timeframe (plus two months). On August 8, 2017, Ms. Walton appealed the administrative decision to close the application that she had filed on November 10, 2016. At its meeting on September 20, 2017, the Board postponed action on Ms. Walton's appeal and granted her request for additional time, until October 3, 2017, to provide the medical documentation required under N.J.A.C. 17:2-6.1(e) and previously requested by the Division. However, the Board letter clearly indicated that the medical documentation must support Ms. Walton's claim that she was disabled when she separated from employment on June 30, 2015. In addition, based upon the information Ms. Walton represented at the meeting on September 20, 2017 regarding the termination of her employment, the Board also obtained documentation related to her disciplinary matter and a mediation agreement negotiated between Ms. Walton and her employer, to which neither the Division nor the Board of Trustees was a party.⁴ On November 15, 2017, following its review of the documentation provided by Ms. Walton and her employer, the Board affirmed the administrative decision to deny her request to re-open her November 10, 2016 application in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:2-6.1(e). Ms. Walton filed a timely appeal and the matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), where it was filed on February 28, 2018, to be heard as a contested case. Ms. Walton sought emergency relief from the Board, requesting payment for alleged prior and prospective monthly AD retirement benefits until the conclusion of her pending appeal. The Board transmitted the request as an emergent application to the OAL, where it was docketed on December 19, 2018. Oral argument on the emergent application was heard on December 27, 2018. On December 9, 2019, Ms. Walton failed to appear for the scheduled hearing date. Ms. Walton contacted the OAL on December 10, 2019, and indicated that she mixed up the hearing dates. The matter proceeded to a hearing on January 10, 2020.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Board noted that Ms. Walton worked for the Department of Education (DOE) prior to her resignation. Ms. Walton alleges that she suffers with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), depression, and anxiety as a result of an incident that occurred outside of her workplace. On July 9, 2010, Ms. Walton was standing outside of the building where she worked with some of her colleagues when a car jumped the curb and ran into a co-worker, causing a fatal injury.

Donna Walton – Dept. of Education – (continued)

Ms. Walton testified that she would have been struck had it not been for a co-worker who snatched her out of the way. ID at 3. Ms. Walton filed for AD retirement benefits on November 10, 2016, alleging that she is totally and permanently disabled on a psychiatric basis as a direct result of the July 9, 2010 incident. The Board acknowledges that the Division administratively closed her application prematurely on April 27, 2017⁵ due to her failure to provide the requisite medical documentation in support of her claim. Three months later, Ms. Walton sought to re-open her application and asked the Board for additional time to submit the required medical documents. The Board granted this request, providing an extension to submit the required medical documentation "no later than October 3, 2017" -- nearly eleven months after the 2016 application was filed. P-6. Ms. Walton again failed to supply the requisite medical documentation within the extended time. The Board notes on October 4, 2017, Ms. Walton hand-delivered various documents to the Division, including a copy of a settlement agreement with her former employer wherein she agreed to never seek reemployment with the DOE; a medical examination form completed by a nurse practitioner, dated October 3, 2017; and additional medical records. R-15; P-6; 2T8:14-15; 2T76:3-77:11; 2T120:2-17. Upon review of her submissions, the Board denied Ms. Walton's request to re-open her AD application for multiple reasons, but principally because her submission did not comply with the regulatory requirement that the medical report be completed by a psychiatrist or psychologist. The Board rejected the ALJ's finding that Ms. Walton is entitled to re-open her application for AD retirement benefits because she complied with the Board's extension of time to submit the required medical documentation under N.J.A.C. 17:2-6.1(e).⁶ The Board also noted that the ALJ found that the Board unreasonably denied Ms. Walton's request to re-open her AD application because the required treating physician form was completed by a nurse practitioner, rather than a psychiatrist or psychologist, as required by the statute. The Board disagrees with both of these findings by the ALJ. First, the Board rejects the ALJ's conclusion that the documentation was submitted timely. It is clear that the Board provided Ms. Walton with a lengthy extension to "no later than October 3, 2017" to submit her documentation. In total, the Board granted Ms. Walton extensions of approximately five months after she filed her AD application in 2016. P-6. Ms. Walton's hand-delivery of additional documents occurred on October 4, 2017, the day after the Board's deadline. R-15; P-6; 2T8:14-15; 2T76:3-77:11; 2T120:2-17. Thus, Ms. Walton failed to submit the required documentation on time, even if the documentation may have been dated (or "as of") October 3, 2017. More importantly, the Board rejected the ALJ finding that it had unreasonably denied Ms. Walton the opportunity to re-open her AD application because the medical report was completed by a nurse practitioner, instead of a psychiatrist or psychologist. The ALJ asserted that Ms. Walton was never advised by the Division that the medical report completed by the nurse practitioner did not comply with the statute. ID at 18.

⁵ Although the Division "administratively" closed the application approximately 13 days prior to the six-month deadline, this action did not affect Ms. Walton's ability to supplement her application with the required documentation before the deadline. Applicants for disability are afforded a grace period after the application is "administratively" closed.

⁶ The applicable version of the regulation in this matter would be N.J.A.C. 17:2-6.1(e), as amended by R.2010 d.149, effective July 19, 2010. N.J.A.C. 17:2-6.1 was rewritten in 2018 with a new subsection that moved subsection (e) to subsection (f) and added certain language not pertinent here. 49 N.J.R. 2189(a), 50 N.J.R.646(a).

Donna Walton – Dept. of Education – (continued)

In addition, the ALJ suggested that the medical report submitted by Ms. Walton is sufficient because a nurse practitioner possesses a doctorate in nursing practice. ID at 23. However, N.J.A.C. 17:2-6.1(e) explicitly states "[a]n application for a mental health medical disability retirement must be supported by at least two medical reports," one of which must be completed by the applicant's "psychiatrist or psychologist." (Emphasis added). A report by a nurse practitioner simply does not satisfy the requirement. Finally, the Board's fiduciary efforts to protect the members' funds are hampered when members continue to miss deadlines to provide documents and information, which are readily available to the member. Not only does the delay hinder the Division administratively, the Board is also required to determine if the member is disabled at the time of the filing of the application, not years after the member has separated from employment. Documentation received years after the application is filed simply do not provide the status of the member's ability to perform their regular or assigned duties prior to leaving employment, which is the standard for the receipt of disability retirement benefits. For these reasons, the Board rejected the ALJ's legal conclusion that the documentation Ms. Walton provided satisfied the regulatory requirements for an application for Accidental Disability retirement benefits. Consequently, the Board will not re-open her application for AD. In a separate motion, the Board denied Ms. Walton's request for emergent relief for temporary Disability retirement benefits and directed the Secretary to draft Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law on the relief request for review at the March 16, 2022, Board meeting. (Motion to approve Final Administrative Determination made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee Hurst. Motion to deny request for emergent relief made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee Hurst.)

FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DETERMINATION

Ivelisse Gonzalez (deceased) – Camden County Board of Chosen Freeholders – At its meeting of October 20, 2021, the Board originally denied the request of the late Ivelisse Gonzalez (hereinafter Ms. Gonzalez or the Estate), represented by attorney, James Katz, to apply for Long Term Disability (LTD) benefits through Prudential. Mr. Katz filed a timely appeal of that determination on December 21, 2021. At its meeting of January 19, 2022, the Board denied Mr. Katz' request for reconsideration and found no genuine issue of material fact in dispute. The Board directed the Secretary to draft Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law as outlined below, which were presented to and approved by the PERS Board at its February 16, 2022, meeting.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board made the following findings of fact. Ms. Gonzalez was enrolled in the PERS on October 1, 2018, as a result of her employment with the Camden County Board of Chosen Freeholders (Camden County) as a Clerk and established membership in PERS, Tier 5, under account 2-1488164. Ms. Gonzalez remained with this employer and pension contributions were remitted by this location until December 31, 2020. Ms. Gonzalez became ill and applied for Family Medical Leave through Camden County. By letter dated January 14, 2021, Camden County approved Ms. Gonzalez's leave of absence request for the period January 4, 2021 through July 4, 2021. On July 12, 2021, Camden County notified Ms. Gonzalez that her leave from employment was approaching a violation of their Limits on Leave Policy #301. Camden County acknowledged receipt of the medical documentation Ms. Gonzalez provided, dated July 9, 2021, stating that she was unable to return to work.

Although she was in violation of the Limits on Leave Policy #301 on July 29, 2021, Camden County granted Ms. Gonzalez an accommodation to continue on leave of absence until August 9, 2021. Ms. Gonzalez, with the assistance of Linda VanFossen, Certifying Officer applied for LTD through Prudential on July 23, 2021. By letter dated, July 28, 2021, Tontalane M. Franklin, Senior Disability Claims Manager, Prudential, denied the request, stating that upon review it was determined that benefits are not payable under the terms of the Group Policy. Ms. Gonzalez was also notified of this determination under separate cover. On August 3, 2021, Ms. VanFossen wrote to the Division to appeal Prudential's decision to deny LTD for Ms. Gonzalez. On September 28, 2021, Mr. Katz wrote to the Division and provided supplemental information filed by CWA Local 1014 on behalf of Ms. Gonzalez, as additional support for her appeal. In response to this request, an administrative denial letter was issued on September 29, 2021, from Kate Ozol of the Division's Disability Review Unit, advising that a review of Ms. Gonzalez's membership file indicated that she was not eligible to file for LTD. This determination was based on the fact that Ms. Gonzalez submitted her application on July 23, 2021, after her six-month leave of absence had expired. Unfortunately, Ms. Gonzalez passed away on October 3, 2021. Ms. Gonzalez' request was considered by the Board at its meeting of October 20, 2021. After careful consideration, the Board denied the request in accord with N.J.S.A. 43:15A-42.1(e). This appeal followed.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

After careful consideration, the Board affirmed the administrative determination of the Division that Ms. Gonzalez was no longer eligible to apply for LTD at the time her application was submitted, because she was no longer considered in active service after 6 months of her leave of absence under the plain language of the statute governing LTD benefits. In making its determination, the Board relied on N.J.S.A. 43:15A-42.1(e), which states in pertinent part:

(e) A member shall be deemed to be in service and covered by the disability benefit insurance provisions for a period of no more than six months while on official leave of absence without pay if satisfactory evidence is presented to the Division of Pensions and Benefits that such leave of absence without pay is due to illness and that the member was not actively engaged in any gainful occupation during such period of leave of absence without pay.

[(emphasis added).]

There is no dispute that Ms. Gonzalez's approved leave of absence extended beyond the six months as detailed under the statute, and that coverage for disability benefit insurance provisions expires after six months. Therefore, Ms. Gonzalez was not eligible to apply for LTD after her six-month eligibility period as a matter of law. In his appeal, Mr. Katz asserts that the Division's Fact Sheet relating to LTD, while clearly not controlling over the statute, is ambiguous and may be interpreted to deem Ms. Gonzalez eligible for LTD benefits under her membership Tier. Not so. In fact, Fact Sheet # 85 states that "[A] member on an official leave of absence without pay will remain eligible for the disability insurance coverage for up to six months..."⁷

Thus, once the 6-month period ended, Ms. Gonzalez was no longer eligible to receive LTD benefits. Finally, while Mr. Katz' argument is entirely reliant on an alleged ambiguity in Fact Sheet #85, he does not dispute the clear statutory language in N.J.S.A. 43:15A-42.1(e), which provides that a member is "deemed to be in service and covered by the disability benefit insurance provisions for a period of no more than six months while on official leave of absence without pay" if the member can establish to the satisfaction of the Division that the leave of absence is due to the member's illness. (Emphasis supplied). The Fact Sheet mirrors the statutory language, and both provide that members are no longer considered active members eligible to apply for LTD after 6 months on leave of absence. Unfortunately, Ms. Gonzalez did not apply for LTD during the first six months of her leave, and therefore was not eligible for LTD benefits under the clear and unambiguous statutory language quoted above. Mr. Katz suggest that because one must be disabled for six months before being eligible for payment, and eligibility of those on approved leaves of absence ends at six months, then it would be impossible for someone on an approved leave of absence to qualify for LTD. As a general proposition, this is not true. And in this case, Ms. Gonzalez appears to have been disabled in excess of six months during the first six months of her leave, that is, before her eligibility to apply for LTD expired. As noted above, the Board has considered Mr. Katz' written submission and all documentation in the record. Because this matter does not entail any disputed questions of fact, the Board was able to reach its findings of fact and conclusions of law on the basis of the retirement system's enabling statutes and without the need for an administrative hearing. (Motion made by Trustee Brown; seconded by Trustee O'Brien.)

HEARING REQUESTS/APPROVED

The Board approved the following members' requests for a hearing in the Office of Administrative Law:

Marilyn Hutton – Ancora Psychiatric Hospital– Appeals the Board's denial of Ordinary Disability retirement benefits. (Motion made by Trustee O'Brien; seconded by Trustee Smith.)

Yoida Nazario – Somerset County Finance Office – Appeals the Board's denial of Accidental Disability retirement benefits. (Motion made by Trustee O'Brien; seconded by Trustee Hurst.)

HEARING REQUEST/DENIED

The Board reviewed the following request for a hearing in the Office of Administrative Law and denied, essentially for the reasons set forth previously by the Board. Therefore, the Board has directed the Secretary, in conjunction with the Attorney General's Office, to draft a detailed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law that will formally outline the Board's decision and become the Board's final administrative determination.

(A motion was made by Trustee Culliton to adopt Resolution B and enter into Executive Session; seconded by Trustee Brown. A motion was made to enter back into Open Session by Trustee O'Brien; seconded by Trustee Hurst.)

Charlotte Salerno-Trout for Donald Trout (deceased) – Middlesex County – Appeals the Board's denial of Accidental Death benefits. (Motion made by Trustee O'Brien; seconded by Trustee Brown.)

REQUESTS PERS ENROLLMENT (CHAPTER 92)

Richard Burke – Hackettstown and Hope Twp – The Board was prepared to consider the matter of Richard Burke, and his appeal of the Division's determination that he was not eligible for certain PERS service credit in both Hackettstown and Hope Township pursuant to N.J.S.A. 43: 15A-7.2 (Chapter 92). The Board considered the statements of attorney, Angelo J. Genova, on behalf of his client, Mr. Burke, the statements of the Pension Fraud and Abuse Unit Investigator Kristin Conover, and all documentation in the record. After careful consideration, the Board voted to table the matter until the Prosecutors Part of PERS regulations have been published. (Motion made by Trustee Smith; seconded by Trustee Brown.)
