POSSIBLE VIOLATION OF TPAF'S POST RETIREMENT RETURN TO EMPLOYMENT RULES FOR DISABILITY RETIREES

(A motion was made by Trustee Favinger to adopt Resolution B enter into Executive Session; seconded by Trustee Yarusinsky. A motion was made to enter back into Open Session by Trustee Savicky; seconded by Trustee Yarusinsky.)

Ernest Turner – Glen Rock Borough BOE – The Board considered the personal statements of attorney, Robert A. Honecker, Jr. on behalf of his client, Ernest Turner, the statements of Kristin Conover, an Investigator with the Pension Fraud and Abuse Unit (PFAU) and her referral of Mr. Turner's possible violation of TPAF's post-retirement return to employment rules for disability retirees. Mr. Turner was approved on August 5, 2004, for Ordinary Disability retirement benefits effective July 1, 2004. However, the Board was provided with a referral dated January 25, 2022 from PFAU Investigator, Kristin Conover indicating that Mr. Turner entered into a contract effective July 1, 2004, the effective date of his retirement, with the Northern Highlands Regional High School District. Such an agreement is in violation of the TPAF statutes and regulations governing disability retirees. As noted in the PFAU's referral, the investigation is still ongoing and Mr. Turner has already received monthly pension payments from July 1, 2004 to January 1, 2022.¹ On February 18, 2022, Mr. Honecker notified the Board that he and his colleague Rahool Patel, Esq. were retained by Mr. Turner with respect to the January 25, 2022 referral of the PFAU. Mr. Honecker requested that this matter be postponed for at least 45 days. A 30 day postponement was granted and Mr. Honecker was informed that any additional requests for postponement would need to be approved by the Board. Following its review of the information, the Board voted to suspend Mr. Turner's monthly retirement benefit pending the completion of the investigation. The Board has a fiduciary responsibility to protect the assets of the Fund and recently became aware of the PFAU's investigation. Thus, the Board voted to suspend Mr. Turner's monthly retirement benefit at the next available retired payroll. The Board relied on N.J.A.C. 17:3-6.2, which states in pertinent part:

A member's retirement allowance shall not become due and payable until
30 days after the date the Board approved the application for retirement or
30 days after the date of retirement, whichever is later.

(Motion made by Trustee Favinger; seconded by Trustee Savicky.)

REVIEW OF ELIGIBILITY FOR ORDINARY DISABILITY RETIREMENT BENEFIT

A motion was made to enter back into Open Session by Trustee Savicky; seconded by Trustee Yarusinsky.)

Glenn Donahue – Lower Twp BOE – The Board considered the personal statements of Glenn Donahue as well as all documentation in the record concerning Mr. Donahue's continued eligibility to receive Ordinary Disability benefits. After careful review of the record and the conditions under which Mr. Donahue separated from employment with Lower Township Board of Education (BOE), the Board determined that Mr. Donahue is ineligible for a Disability retirement and stopped his monthly retirement allowance.

¹ As of April 18, 2022, Mr. Turner has been paid monthly retirement benefits from July 1, 2004 through March 1, 2022.

In making its determination, the Board relied on N.J.A.C. 17:1-6.4, which states:

(a) Each disability retirement applicant must prove that his or her retirement is due to a total and permanent disability that renders the applicant physically or mentally incapacitated from performing normal or assigned job duties at the time the member left employment; the disability must be the reason the member left employment.

(b) Members who have involuntarily or voluntarily terminated service for any of the reasons listed below will not be permitted to apply for a disability retirement:

1. Removal for cause or total forfeiture of public service;
2. Settlement agreements reached due to pending administrative or criminal charges, unless the underlying charges relate to the disability;
3. Loss of licensure or certification required for the performance of the member's specific job duties;
4. Voluntary separation from service for reasons other than a disability; and
5. Job abolishment or reduction in force.

(c) The Division will review all disability retirement applications submitted after a member has terminated service to determine whether the member's application is eligible for processing, pursuant to (a) above.

[Emphases added.]

The record before the Board indicates that in May 2020 Lower Township BOE served Mr. Donahue with tenure charges for incapacity, unbecoming conduct, and other just cause after he allegedly engaged in offensive and inappropriate conduct with a fellow staff member, as well as being present on school grounds smelling of alcohol. In accordance with the rules of the Commissioner of Education, an arbitrator was assigned to decide the dispute. On November 6, 2020 the Arbitrator accepted Mr. Donahue's letter of resignation in lieu of an arbitration hearing in this matter. In the Matter of the Tenure Charges against Glenn Donahue, Mr. Donahue and Lower Township Elementary School District Board of Education (LTESD BOE) entered into a Separation and Release of Claims Agreement, dated October 7, 2020 which included the following stipulations: LTESD BOE would pay Mr. Donahue salary and benefits for the period of October 1, 2020 to December 1, 2020; LTESD BOE would rescind any suspension which may have been previously imposed converting it to paid administrative leave; Mr. Donahue would tender an irrevocable resignation effective December 1, 2020, and would agree to not seek any re-employment with the LTESD BOE; the LTESD BOE agreed to cooperate with Mr. Donahue's application for Ordinary Disability retirement benefits and Mr. Donahue would not be considered as suspended or under consideration for disciplinary action. On October 7, 2020, Mr. Donahue filed for Ordinary Disability retirement benefits online through the Member Benefit Online System. At its meeting of January 14, 2021, the Board approved his application for Ordinary Disability retirement benefits.

The Board was unaware of any charges and/or misconduct at the time of the approval, as Lower Township BOE certified that Mr. Donahue had simply resigned. However, as outlined in the Division of Pension and Benefits *Fact Sheet: Disability Retirement Benefits*:

If you have been terminated for cause, or have a settlement agreement which sets forth the terms of your departure in lieu of the termination for cause, you and your employer must provide that information to the NJDPB at the time you file for Disability Retirement. It must be shown that you have separated from employment as a result of the disabling condition.

The record before the Board clearly indicates that Mr. Donahue did not separate from employment due to an alleged disability. Rather, he separated by way of a settlement agreement to resolve the tenure charges against him and agreed to not return to employment in the future. Further, the Board noted that in order to comply with N.J.S.A. 18A:66-40, a member seeking a disability retirement must have a position to return to should the alleged disability diminish to the point that the member could return to employment. N.J.S.A. 18A:66-40 states, in pertinent part:

...
If the report of the medical board shall show that such beneficiary is able to perform either his former duty or other comparable duty which his former employer is willing to assign to him, the beneficiary shall report for duty;
...

Thus, if it was later determined that Mr. Donahue is no longer disabled, there is no mechanism for the Board to stop paying the pension because he could never be ordered to return to work, as required by N.J.S.A. 18A:66-40. Permitting him to continue to receive Ordinary Disability retirement benefits under such circumstances would be in contravention of the statutory scheme, and place the Board in the position of potentially paying a pension for which the Board has no ability or mechanism to terminate the pension payment. For the foregoing reasons, the Board determined that Mr. Donahue is ineligible for Ordinary Disability retirement benefits. Thus, he has received Ordinary Disability retirement benefits to which he is not entitled. Therefore, the Board determined that Mr. Donahue is required to repay all overpaid retirement benefits paid to date. (Motion made by Trustee Favinger; seconded by Trustee Savicky.)

Linda Cainzos – Jackson Twp BOE – The Board considered the personal statements of Linda Cainzos and all relevant documentation concerning the issue of honorable service and what impact, if any, this may have on her Early retirement benefits, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 43:1-3. N.J.S.A. 43:1-3 establishes 11 factors, which the Board is to consider and balance in view of the goals of the pension statutes when determining whether forfeiture or partial forfeiture of pension service credit is appropriate. These factors are:

1. The member's length of service;

2. **The basis of retirement;**
On October 30, 2016, the Division of Pensions and Benefits (Division) received Linda Cainzos' application for Early retirement benefits effective March 1, 2017 under the Maximum option. On April 6, 2017, the TPAF Board approved the application. At the time of its approval, the Board was unaware of any criminal charges filed against Linda Cainzos;
3. **The extent to which the member's pension has vested;**
Linda Cainzos was vested in the TPAF and was 58 years of age as of her last pension contribution;
4. **The duties of the particular member;**
Linda Cainzos held the position of Teacher;
5. **The member's public employment history and record covered under the retirement system;**
Linda Cainzos was enrolled in the TPAF effective April 1, 1987, as a result of her employment as a Teacher with the Jackson Township Board of Education. She remained with this employer and in this position at the time of her resignation on February 28, 2017;
6. **Any other public employment;**
None noted;
7. **The nature of the misconduct or crime, including the gravity or substantiality of the offense, whether it was a single or multiple offense and whether it was continuing or isolated;**
By way of a Complaint – Summons Linda Cainzos was charged with Two Counts of Third Degree Theft by Deception in excess of \$500.00 for incidents occurring on or about October 9, 2015 and November 30, 2015. Linda Cainzos submitted insurance claims with fraudulent supporting documentation in order to receive monetary compensation for items that were claimed to be stolen or damaged. Specifically, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office received two referrals dated October 27, 2017 from the Office of the Insurance Fraud Prosecutor (OIFP) in reference to suspected fraud committed by Linda Cainzos. The first referral alleged fraud of approximately \$1,549.00. Linda Cainzos had reported water damage in her home from a leak in an upstairs bathroom. The California Casualty Insurance Company (Insurance Company) paid her \$6,120.73 on October 18, 2015. Following this payment Linda Cainzos emailed the insurance company with replacement cost receipts for several items. Subsequently, Linda Cainzos was paid an additional \$1,549.22. When the insurance company reached out to the retailers associated with the receipts, they learned that the receipts might not be valid. The second referral alleged fraud of approximately \$3,000. Linda Cainzos reported an alleged burglary to the insurance company, which resulted in items being damaged, specifically a Regency Gilt Mirror. Linda Cainzos was initially paid \$6,500.00 for the mirror. She submitted a receipt to the insurance company in the amount of \$9,500.00. The insurance company paid out an additional \$3,000.00. Agents of the insurance company tried unsuccessfully to authenticate the receipt for the mirror. On June 18, 2018, the insurance company served Linda Cainzos' bank a Grand Jury Subpoena for records in reference to all of her accounts held or owned. Contained within the credit card statements provided was a credit card statement dated September 18, 2016. The insurance company compared the actual statement from the bank to what they had received from Linda Cainzos. There were several discrepancies when the two statements were compared. The credit limit provided by Linda Cainzos was listed at \$15,000.00. However, the actual credit limit on the card was \$1,400.00. The statement provided by the bank did not show any purchases from Verizon, Louis Vuitton, or Nordstrom. The Board found that the criminal misconduct was serious, grave, occurred on numerous occasions and continued for a period of time;

- 8. The relationship between the misconduct and the member's public duties;**
Indirect;
- 9. The quality of moral turpitude or the degree of guilt or culpability, including the member's motives and reasons, personal gain and similar considerations;**
The Board found Linda Cainzos' criminal misconduct demonstrated a high degree of culpability and was for her personal financial gain.
- 10. The availability and adequacy of other penal sanctions;**
Linda Cainzos entered Pre-Trial Intervention (PTI) on August 14, 2019 for a period of twenty-four months. On October 28, 2020, by way of a Pre-Trial Intervention Order of Dismissal, the charges against Linda Cainzos were dismissed. Linda Cainzos successfully fulfilled all of the conditions of her PTI, which included paying fines and restitution in the amount of \$16,361.11. On May 13, 2021, the New Jersey Department of Education, State Board of Examiners, suspended Linda Cainzos' Teacher of Elementary Education Grades K-8 Certificate for one year;
- 11. Other personal circumstances relating to the member which bear upon the justness of forfeiture.**
The Board noted Ms. Cainzos' personal statements at the meeting.

The record before the Board establishes that Ms. Cainzos was enrolled in the TPAF effective April 1, 1987, as a result of her employment as a Teacher with the Jackson Township Board of Education, where she remained until her resignation on February 28, 2017. At that time, she had accrued the requisite service credit for an Early retirement. At its meeting of April 6, 2017, the Board approved Ms. Cainzos' application for Early retirement benefits effective March 1, 2017, unaware of the criminal charges filed against her. The criminal charges stemmed from two incidents of Ms. Cainzos allegedly submitting insurance claims with fraudulent supporting documentation in order to receive monetary compensation for items, which were claimed to be stolen or damaged. The first incident involved Ms. Cainzos reporting water damage in her home and submitting receipts for the replacement of certain items. When her insurance company contacted the respective retailers, they learned that the receipts might not have been valid. The second incident involved Ms. Cainzos reporting an alleged burglary. She was initially paid \$6,500.00 by her insurance company for a damaged mirror. Thereafter, she submitted a receipt for the mirror in the amount of \$9,500.00 to the insurance company and paid an additional \$3,000.00. However, agents of the insurance company tried unsuccessfully to authenticate the receipt for the mirror. The insurance company served Ms. Cainzos' bank a Grand Jury Subpoena for records in reference to all of her accounts held or owned. Contained within the credit card statements provided was a credit card statement dated September 18, 2016. The insurance company compared the actual statement from the bank to what she had provided. There were several discrepancies between them. Ms. Cainzos entered the Pre-Trial Intervention (PTI) program on August 14, 2019 for a period of twenty-four months. Thereafter, the Theft by Deception charges were dismissed by way of a Pre-Trial Intervention Order of Dismissal. The record indicates Ms. Cainzos successfully fulfilled all of the conditions of her PTI, which included paying fines and restitution. On May 13, 2021, the New Jersey Department of Education, State Board of Examiners, suspended Ms. Cainzos' Teacher of Elementary Education Grades K-8 Certificate for one year. The Board found that Ms. Cainzos' criminal misconduct was serious, grave, occurred on numerous occasions and continued for a period of time. Further, although the Board determined there was no nexus between the charges filed against Ms. Cainzos and her public duties, her criminal misconduct demonstrated a high degree of culpability and was for her personal financial gain.

After considering the aforementioned statutory factors, the Board determined that in accordance with N.J.S.A. 43:1-3 and N.J.A.C. 17:1-6.1, a partial forfeiture of Ms. Cainzos' retirement benefit was appropriate. The Board imposed a forfeiture of 10% of her monthly pension allowance. The Board found that after balancing the statutory factors and its authority under the regulation, this reduction was calculated to impose a reasonable forfeiture that reflects the nature and gravity of her misconduct. A reduction in the years of service may have made Ms. Cainzos ineligible for retiree health benefits. In that regard, N.J.S.A. 43:1-3 state in pertinent part:

a. The receipt of a public pension or retirement benefit is hereby expressly conditioned upon the rendering of honorable service by a public officer or employee.

b. The board of trustees of any State or locally-administered pension fund or retirement system created under the laws of this State is authorized to order the forfeiture of all or part of the earned service credit or pension or retirement benefit of any member of the fund or system for misconduct occurring during the member's public service which renders the member's service or part thereof dishonorable and to implement any pension forfeiture ordered by a court pursuant to section 2 of P.L.2007, c.49 (C.43:1-3.1).

...

d. Whenever a board of trustees determines, pursuant to this section, that a partial forfeiture of earned service credit or earned pension or retirement benefits is warranted, it shall order that benefits be calculated as if the accrual of pension rights terminated as of the date the misconduct first occurred or, if termination as of that date would in light of the nature and extent of the misconduct result in an excessive pension or retirement benefit or in an excessive forfeiture, a date reasonably calculated to impose a forfeiture that reflects the nature and extent of the misconduct and the years of honorable service.

In addition, N.J.A.C. 17:1-6.1 (c) states in pertinent part:

(c) In circumstances where the termination of pension rights as of the date of the misconduct results in no reduction or a minimal reduction of pension or retirement benefits, or in an excessive forfeiture, as compared to the nature and extent of the misconduct and the years of honorable service, the Board may, in its sole discretion, provide a more equitable relief. Alternate methods available to the Board when a forfeiture of service renders an unreasonable or unjust result include, but are not limited to:

...

6. Forfeiture of service in excess of that needed to qualify for a specific retirement benefit;

The Board determined the reduction will be on a prospective basis. (Motion made by Trustee Favinger; seconded by Trustee Savicky.)

Rhea Jolly – Neptune Twp BOE – The Board considered Rhea Jolly's personal statements and all relevant documentation concerning the issue of honorable service and what impact, if any this may have on Ms. Jolly's Service retirement benefits, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 43:1-3. N.J.S.A. 43:1-3 establishes 11 factors, which the Board is to consider and balance in view of the pension statutes when determining whether forfeiture or partial forfeiture of the pension service credit is appropriate. These factors are:

1. **The member's length of service;**
Rhea Jolly has 28 years and 11 months of service credit in the TPAF;
2. **The basis of retirement;**
On March 19, 2018, the Division of Pensions and Benefits received Rhea Jolly's application for a Service retirement. On June 7, 2018, the TPAF Board approved her Service retirement effective July 1, 2018, under Option A. When the TPAF Board approved her application, it was unaware of any criminal charges filed against Rhea Jolly;
3. **The extent to which the member's pension has vested;**
Rhea Jolly was vested in the TPAF and was 61 years of age as of the date of her last pension contribution;
4. **The duties of the particular member;**
Rhea Jolly held the position of Speech and Hearing Therapist;
5. **The member's public employment history and record covered under the retirement system;**
Rhea Jolly was enrolled in the TPAF on September 1, 1991 as a result of her employment as a Speech Therapist with the Neptune Township Board of Education (Neptune BOE). She remained with this employer and in this position at the time of her resignation on June 30, 2018;
6. **Any other public employment;**
Rhea Jolly purchased a total of two years of out of state time with the Board of Cooperative Educational Services of Sullivan County, New York, for the period of July 1, 1979 through June 30, 1981;
7. **The nature of the misconduct or crime, including the gravity or substantiality of the offense, whether it was a single or multiple offense and whether it was continuing or isolated;**
By way of an Accusation dated October 31, 2018, Rhea Jolly was charged with One Count of Third Degree Theft by Deception. Between on or about, November 6, 2012 and December 29, 2017, Rhea Jolly did purposely obtain, by deception, the property of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the New Jersey Division of Community Affairs (NJ DCA), having a value of \$500.00 or more. Specifically, Rhea Jolly did purposely obtain Superstorm Sandy grant monies from FEMA and NJ DCA, by creating or reinforcing the false impression that 613 Beachwood Avenue, Toms River, New Jersey was her primary residence at the time of Superstorm Sandy. Whereas in truth and fact, the Toms River address was not her primary residence at the time Superstorm Sandy had occurred. During the time of her criminal misconduct Rhea Jolly was employed as a Speech and Hearing Therapist with the Neptune Township Board of Education. Due to the above-mentioned charge, Rhea Jolly pleaded guilty to One Count of Third Degree Theft by Deception;
8. **The relationship between the misconduct and the member's public duties;**
Indirect;

9. **The quality of moral turpitude or the degree of guilt or culpability, including the member's motives and reasons, personal gain and similar considerations;**
The Board found that the misconduct involved a high degree of guilt and culpability, and was for Ms. Jolly's personal gain;
10. **The availability and adequacy of other penal sanctions;**
On January 9, 2019, a Judgement of Conviction was ordered sentencing Rhea Jolly to one year of Probation. She was ordered to pay restitution in the amount of \$156,636.06 as well as various other Fines. The Criminal History Review Unit provided information to the New Jersey Department of Education, State Board of Examiners, regarding Rhea Jolly's criminal charges. On April 12, 2019, Rhea Jolly was ordered to show cause as to why teaching certificate should not be revoked. On June 28, 2019, Rhea Jolly agreed to relinquish her Speech Language Specialist Certificate with the force and effect of a revocation and all attendant consequences to the New Jersey Department of Education, State Board of Examiners. Her certificate was revoked effective immediately;
11. **Other personal circumstances relating to the member which bear upon the justness of forfeiture.**
The Board noted the appearance and personal statements of Ms. Jolly and statements of her attorney, Edward J. Dimon, Esq. In addition, the Board noted Ms. Jolly's successful teaching career.

The record before the Board establishes that Ms. Jolly was enrolled in the TPAF effective September 1, 1991, as a result of her employment with Neptune BOE as a Speech Therapist. At the time Ms. Jolly separated from service as of June 30 2018, she was 61 years of age and had 28 years and 11 months of service credit in the TPAF. Thus, she was vested and eligible for a Service retirement benefit. On March 19, 2018, the Division received Ms. Jolly's application for Service retirement benefits effective July 1, 2018, under Option A. On June 7, 2018, the TPAF Board approved her application. At the time of the approval, the Board was unaware of any criminal charges filed against Ms. Jolly. An Accusation dated October 31, 2018, charged Ms. Jolly with One Count of Third Degree Theft by Deception. Specifically, she was charged with purposely obtaining Superstorm Sandy grant monies from the FEMA and the NJ DCA, by creating or reinforcing the false impression that her secondary home was her primary residence at the time of the storm. This offense occurred while she working as a Speech and Hearing Therapist with the Neptune BOE. On January 9, 2019, a Judgment of Conviction was issued and Ms. Jolly was sentenced to 1 year of Probation, and required to pay \$123,351 to the NJ DCA Sandy Recovery Division, \$23,285 to FEMA and \$10,000 to the Regular Services Program (Total restitution \$156,636). On June 28, 2019, the New Jersey Department of Education, State Board of Examiners, revoked her Speech Language Specialist certificate effective immediately. The Board found that the misconduct was indirectly related to her employment, involved a high degree of guilt and culpability, was for her personal gain and continued over a several years. After considering the aforementioned statutory factors, the Board determined that in accordance with N.J.S.A. 43:1-3 and N.J.A.C. 17:1-6.1, a partial forfeiture of Ms. Jolly's retirement benefit was appropriate. The Board imposed a forfeiture of 10% of her monthly pension allowance. The Board found that this reduction was a reasonable forfeiture that reflects the nature and gravity of her misconduct.

Christine for David Minsavage (deceased) – Hanover Park Regional High School District – The Board considered the following documents in the appeal of attorney, John C. Kelly, on behalf of his client, Christine Minsavage: the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Elia A. Pelios, dated February 25, 2022; and all exhibits. Thereafter, the Board voted to adopt the ALJ's decision and granted Ordinary Disability retirement benefits effective May 1, 2015, under Option A. (Motion made by Trustee Yarusinsky; seconded by Trustee Favinger.)

FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DETERMINATION

Colleen Kelly – Haddonfield BOE – At its December 9, 2021 meeting, the Board considered attorney Kathleen Naprestek Cerisano's statements on behalf of her client, Colleen Kelly's request for continued participation under a TPAF Tier 3 membership. The Board reviewed Ms. Cerisano's submission of November 1, 2021 as well as correspondence from the Division and all supporting documentation. After careful consideration, the Board affirmed the Division's administrative determination and denied the request to permit Ms. Kelly to continue her TPAF Tier 3 account. Ms. Cerisano filed a timely appeal. At its meeting of March 3, 2022, the Board considered Ms. Cerisano's personal statements, reviewed her written submissions and accompanying documentation. Thereafter, the Board denied reconsideration of its previous decision. Further, finding no genuine issue of material fact in dispute, the Board also denied Ms. Cerisano's request for an administrative hearing. Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law as outlined below were presented to and approved by the Board at its April 7, 2022, meeting.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The record shows that Ms. Kelly established membership in TPAF (Tier 3 Account) on September 1, 2009, based on her employment as a teacher with Voorhees Township Board of Education (Voorhees Twp BOE). Ms. Kelly's TPAF contributions continued with this location through June 30, 2017. On March 5, 2019, Ms. Kelly and Voorhees Twp BOE were notified (Account Expiration Notice) that Ms. Kelly's Tier 3 Account was due to expire on June 30, 2019, two years from the date of her last pension contribution.² After two years without pension contributions, Ms. Kelly's Tier 3 Account expired effective June 30, 2019 pursuant to N.J.S.A.18A:66-7(a). On March 22, 2019, Voorhees Twp BOE completed and returned the Employer Certification portion of the March 5, 2019 letter signed by the Certifying Officer, that Ms. Kelly resigned and noted her last known address. Our records indicate that on April 10, 2019, Ms. Kelly contacted the Division's Office of Client Services to get more information regarding the expiration of her account. A counselor explained to Ms. Kelly that her account would expire on June 30, 2019, and that if she returned to work prior to the expiration date she could transfer her membership. After obtaining a position with the Haddonfield Board of Education (Haddonfield BOE), Ms. Kelly contacted the Division to inquire about continuing her membership in her Tier 3 Account. A voicemail was left for Ms. Kelly on June 25, 2019, with confirmation from the Division's Enrollment Section that her Tier 3 Account would expire on June 30, 2019, and that if her hire date is September 1, 2019, she would be enrolled in a TPAF Tier 5 membership account, despite her being a 10-month employee. On August 29, 2019, the Division received a Report of Transfer form from Haddonfield BOE indicating Ms. Kelly would begin employment in September 1, 2019 as a teacher. By letter dated September 24, 2019, Janice Vasil, Client Services, confirmed in writing the Division's determination.

Colleen Kelly – Haddonfield BOE – (continued)

On October 1, 2019, Haddonfield BOE was informed that the Report of Transfer form could not be processed because Ms. Kelly's account expired June 30, 2019, and instructed them to enroll her as a new member online through the Employer Pensions and Benefits Information Connection (EPIC). On October 17, 2019, the Division received a letter along with a completed Member Authorization Form requesting a copy of Ms. Kelly's pension file. On October 22, 2019, a letter and CD containing Ms. Kelly's pension file was mailed to Ms. Cerisano. On October 30, 2019, an Enrollment Application was submitted through EPIC by Haddonfield BOE, which was acknowledged by the Division on October 31, 2019. Ms. Kelly became employed in a TPAF-covered position through her employment with Haddonfield BOE and she was enrolled under a new Tier 5 TPAF membership account (Tier 5 Account) effective September 1, 2019. On October 7, 2020, Ms. Cerisano wrote to the Division advising that she represents, Ms. Kelly and requested that the Division review her request to Intrafund transfer, remain in the Tier 3 Account, and issue a determination regarding the expiration of the Tier 3 Account. Along with Ms. Cerisano's letter she provided examples of expiration letters submitted in previous years which gave members of the TPAF longer than 24 months before their accounts expired. In response to her request, she received an administrative denial letter from Nikki Munko, Supervising Pensions Benefits Specialist, Enrollment Section, stating that a review of the Division's records reflects that Ms. Kelly's Tier 3 Account was credited with pension contributions through June 30, 2017. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:66-7(a): "Membership of any person in the retirement system shall cease if he shall discontinue his service for more than two consecutive years." Therefore, the Tier 3 Account expired on June 30, 2019, and Ms. Kelly was properly enrolled in a new TPAF membership account when she returned to employment on September 1, 2019. Ms. Munko acknowledged the examples Ms. Cerisano provided of some members who were provided additional time before their accounts expired. Ms. Munko informed Ms. Cerisano that the Division reviewed this practice in 2015 and discontinued it, because granting members of the TPAF additional time on the expiration of membership accounts contravenes the governing statutes. She noted that membership in the TPAF ends after two years of inactivity. Additionally, she noted that Ms. Kelly was notified in writing on March 5, 2019 that her account was set to expire on June 30, 2019. In Ms. Cerisano's appeal dated November 1, 2021, she represents that although Ms. Kelly was notified of the expiration of her account on June 30, 2019 and was unable to obtain employment in a TPAF covered position prior to the expiration of the Tier 3 Account, that she be permitted to extend the expiration of her account until September 30, 2019 as this was the Division's past practice. The Board denied this request. Although this may have been the past practice, there is no evidence that Ms. Kelly relied upon this now discontinued practice and therefore equitable principles do not apply in her case. By letter dated January 21, 2021, Ms. Cerisano filed an appeal of the Board's decision. At its meeting of March 3, 2022, the Board considered Ms. Cerisano's appeal and request for a hearing. The Board ultimately found that no genuine issue of material fact was in dispute and therefore directed the Board Secretary to draft detailed findings of fact and conclusion of law for review at its meeting of April 7, 2022.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The issue is whether Ms. Kelly is eligible to Intrafund service credit from her expired Tier 3 TPAF account into her active Tier 5 TPAF account. As noted above, the last contribution to Ms. Kelly's TPAF account was on June 30, 2017, at which time her TPAF membership reflected 8 years of TPAF service credit.

Colleen Kelly – Haddonfield BOE – (continued)

There was no record of activity in Ms. Kelly's account after June 30, 2017. N.J.S.A. 18A:66-7(a) states:

Membership of any person shall cease: (a) if, except as provided in section 18A:66-8, he shall discontinue his service for more than two consecutive years;

As N.J.S.A. 18A:66-7(a) requires membership in the TPAF shall cease after more than two consecutive years of inactivity, Ms. Kelly no longer had the option to resume contributions to her expired TPAF membership account or Intrafund service credit from that account to her active TPAF membership account. In addition, N.J.A.C. 17:3-7.2 states in pertinent part:

- (a) Members who leave one public employer and take a position with another public employer covered by the same pension system are immediately eligible to transfer their membership to their new employers, as long as the following conditions are met:

...

2. The account has not expired; that is, it has not been more than two years between the date of the last contribution received from the old employer and the starting date of contributions with the new employer;

...

In this case, Ms. Kelly was aware that her last contribution to her Tier 3 TPAF membership was June 30, 2017 as indicated by her receipt of the Account Expiration notice and subsequent contact to the Division's call center, before the account expired. Ms. Kelly did not return to TPAF covered employment and exercise her Intrafund transfer option and her TPAF membership account expired on June 30, 2019 in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:66-7(a). Therefore, the Board found that Ms. Kelly is not eligible to Intrafund transfer service credit from her expired TPAF membership account to her active TPAF membership account. (Motion made by Trustee Yarusinsky; seconded by Trustee Savicky.)

HEARING REQUEST/APPROVED

The Board approved the following member's request for a hearing in the Office of Administrative Law:

Emily Konopinski – East Orange School District – Appeals the Board's denial of Accidental Disability retirement benefits. (The following motion was made by Trustee Savicky; seconded by Trustee Favinger.)

CREDITABLE COMPENSATION

(A motion was made by Trustee Yarusinsky to adopt Resolution B and enter into Executive Session; seconded by Trustee Favinger. A motion was made to enter back into Open Session by Trustee Savicky; seconded by Trustee Yarusinsky.)

Michael Pinajian – Northvale BOE – The Board considered the personal statements of attorney, Stephen A. Fogarty, on behalf of his client, Michael Pinajian, his letter of March 21, 2022 and all relevant documentation in Mr. Pinajian's file regarding his pensionable salary with Northvale Board of Education (BOE). Mr. Fogarty contends that the portion of Mr. Pinajian's salary that represents the additional \$5,000.00 Principal salary increment paid to him should qualify as pensionable salary. After careful consideration, the Board denied Mr. Pinajian's request for this portion of his salary to be deemed creditable for pension purposes.

Michael Pinajian – Northvale BOE – (continued)

In making its determination, the Board relied upon N.J.A.C. 17:3-4.1, which states:

(a) The compensation of a member subject to pension and group life insurance contributions and creditable for retirement and death benefits in the Fund shall be limited to base salary and shall not include extra compensation.

1. Forms of compensation that have been identified as extra compensation include, but are not limited to:

ii. Pay for extra work, duty or service beyond the normal work day, work year for the position, or normal duty assignment;

...

v. Any compensation which the employee or employer has the option of including in base salary;

xix. Compensation paid for additional services performed during a normal duty assignment, which are not included in base salary.

...

1. (b) The Board may question the compensation of any member or retiree to determine its creditability, where there is evidence that compensation reported as base salary may include extra compensation.

(c) Extra compensation shall not be considered creditable for benefits and all employee contributions made thereon shall be returned without interest.

The record before the Board establishes that Mr. Pinajian is employed as the Superintendent for Northvale BOE. Pursuant to the Second Addendum to the Employment Agreement (Employment Contract)³ for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2022, Mr. Pinajian's title was changed to Superintendent/Principal in recognition of his appointment to the position of Principal upon the resignation of the former Principal on or about November 23, 2020. During the period retroactive to November 23, 2020 through June 30, 2021, Northvale BOE paid Mr. Pinajian as compensation to the Superintendent a salary for this position of \$183,957. This Employment Contract also indicates that Mr. Pinajian receives an additional \$5,000 prorated in the amount of \$3,038 for his responsibilities as the Principal for the District for a total annual salary of \$196,995.

³ The Second Addendum to the Employment Agreement between the Northvale Board of Education and Michael Pinajian was signed on July 16, 2021.

During the period beginning on July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022, Northvale BOE paid as compensation to Mr. Pinajian a prorated salary of 189,476 and an additional \$5,000 for his responsibilities as the Principal for the District for a total of \$194,476. Therefore, the Board has determined that Mr. Pinajian's additional Principal increment of \$5,000 by the Northvale BOE, which is separate from his annual compensation as Superintendent, is considered extra compensation, which is not creditable for pension purposes. (Motion made by Trustee Yarusinsky; seconded by Trustee Savicky.)

REQUEST TO EXTEND TPAF MEMBERSHIP

Michael Cheski – Kittatinny Regional High School – The Board considered the submissions dated January 3, 2021 and March 31, 2022 of attorney, Richard A. Friedman, on behalf of his client, Michael Cheski and all relevant documentation in regard to Mr. Cheski's request to extend the expiration of his Tier 1 membership account in the TPAF. After careful consideration, the TPAF Board denied Mr. Friedman's request for postponement and affirmed the administrative determination of the Division denying Mr. Cheski's request for an extension provided under N.J.S.A. 18A:66-8. In making its determination, the Board relied on N.J.S.A. 18A:66-7, which states in pertinent part:

Membership of any person shall cease:

- (a) If, except as provided in section 18A:66-8, he shall discontinue his service for more than two consecutive years;

...

The pension fund shall send written notice in care of the last employer of a member at least 60 days in advance of the date on which his inactive membership shall expire as provided in subsection (a) of this section.

The record indicates that Mr. Cheski was enrolled in the TPAF on February 1, 2002⁴ under Tier 1 based on his employment as a Teacher with Berkeley Heights Board of Education. On September 1, 2008, Mr. Cheski accepted a position at Sussex County Technical School where he served as a Video Technology Teacher. He remained in this position until June 30, 2009. Thereafter, Mr. Cheski transferred to the Kittatinny Regional High School (Kittatinny) on January 2, 2018. He remained in this position and contributions were remitted from this location until June 30, 2019. On March 2, 2021, Mr. Cheski was notified that his TPAF account was due to expire on June 30, 2021, two years from the date of his last pension deduction or June 30, 2019. After two years with no pension contributions, Mr. Cheski's Tier 1 membership account expired effective June 30, 2021 pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S. A. 18A:66-7(a).

⁴ Mr. Cheski became eligible for TPAF membership on September 1, 2004, as a result of his employment with Berkeley Heights Board of Education. An Interfund Transfer was completed, wherein Mr. Cheski transferred his former Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) membership account to his new Tier 1 TPAF membership.

Michael Cheski – Kittatinny Regional High School – (continued)

Mr. Friedman represents that Mr. Cheski was laid off from his non-tenured teaching position at Kittatinny due to budgetary reasons, not for any performance-related issues, which would qualify him for the statutory exemption of expiration of membership beyond two years, thus allowing him to maintain his original Tier 1 membership. The Board disagrees. Instead, Mr. Cheski's annual contract with Kittatinny was not renewed and his non-tenured teaching position ended on June 30, 2019. Therefore, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:66-7(a), Mr. Cheski's TPAF membership expired on June 30, 2021, after two years of inactivity. Accordingly, the Board denied Mr. Friedman's request to extend the expiration of Mr. Cheski's Tier 1 TPAF membership. (Motion made by Trustee Yarusinsky; seconded by Trustee Savicky.

Vote 4-1; Trustee Lipoff nae.)

REQUEST TO PURCHASE SERVICE CREDIT

(A motion was made by Trustee Yarusinsky to adopt Resolution B and enter into Executive Session; seconded by Trustee Favinger. A motion was made to enter back into Open Session by Trustee Savicky; seconded by Trustee Yarusinsky.)

William Spence – Vineland City BOE – The Board considered the personal statements and submissions of William Spence, the statements of Shirlene Scott, Supervisor of the Division of Pensions and Benefits' Purchase Section, as well as all documentation in the record concerning Mr. Spence's request to purchase service credit rendered with the United States Military. After careful review of all relevant documents, the Board approved his request to purchase service credit; however, the Board tabled the processing of the purchase in order for Mr. Spence to provide specific information/proof regarding the periods eligible to purchase. The record shows that on December 3, 2021, Mr. Spence submitted a *Purchase Application* for Military Time for the period covering February 1, 1981 to July 10, 2009. The Board noted on February 2, 2022, a Purchase Quotation⁵ was issued to Mr. Spence advising that he is eligible to purchase 69 months (5 years and 9 months) of military service. The Purchase Section was able to verify and determine the periods eligible for purchase from his submission of DD-214's, which indicated the exact start and end dates. The periods eligible for purchase are as follows:

07/19/1983 – 04/05/1985	U.S. AIR FORCE
09/09/1985 – 05/23/1987	U.S. AIR FORCE
06/08/1987 – 09/05/1987	U.S. AIR FORCE
08/26/1990 – 07/31/1991	U.S. AIR FORCE
02/10/2003 – 03/31/2004	U.S. AIR FORCE

The record also shows that on June 15, 2020 Mr. Spence authorized the purchase of 29 months (2 years and 5 months) of military service. This period covered February 18, 1981 to July 18, 1983. A review of the DD-214 for the period covering June 5, 2007 to June 9, 2007 reflected his active service for this period as 6 days. A denial letter was issued on February 2, 2022 advising this period is not considered active-duty because it is less than 30 days. The Division's Purchase Section also reviewed the National Guard Bureau Form 22-Report of Separation and Record of Service (Form 22) that Mr. Spence provided.

⁵ The Purchase Quotation issued on February 2, 2022 expires on May 3, 2022. If Mr. Spence reapplies for the purchase, the cost may increase.

William Spence – Vineland City BOE – (continued)

Form 22 reflected his date of enlistment in the Army National Guard as August 9, 1985 and the effective date of separation as July 20, 1988. Form 22 also indicated he had 1 year, 11 months and 3 days of active duty service. However, it did not provide the beginning and end dates for this period. In addition, the DD-214's Mr. Spence submitted for periods covering September 9, 1985 to May 23, 1987 and June 8, 1987 to September 5, 1987 overlap the period of service on Form 22. A Purchase Quotation could not be issued for Mr. Spence's National Guard service because the exact dates of his active duty service were not reflected on Form 22. As a result, the Purchase Section did not have sufficient information to establish purchase eligibility and a denial letter was issued on February 2, 2022. Included in Mr. Spence's appeal was a Service Summary and a copy of email correspondence between him and the Air Force Personnel Center (ADPC). The Service Summary reflected beginning dates of May 17 and end dates of May 16 for the period covering 1980 to 1990 and did not provide the exact dates of active duty service that he is requesting to purchase. As a result, the Purchase Section did not have exact dates to establish eligibility and therefore a purchase quote was not issued. The Purchase Section relied on the provisions of N.J.A.C. 17:3-5.5 (b)1. N.J.A.C. 17:3-5.5 (b)1 states:

(1) Active duty military service prior to enrollment: Active military service that is eligible for purchase means honorable full-time duty in the active military service of the United States, which is the same as the Federal definition found at 10 U.S.C. § 101. Such term includes full-time training duty, and attendance, while in the active military service, at a school designated as a service school by law or by the Secretary of the military department concerned. It does not include periods of service of less than 30 days, weekend drills, or annual summer training of a National Guard or reserve unit, nor does it include periods when the member was on-call. It also does not include time spent in the Reserved Officers Training Corps or as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies. Military service before enrollment cannot be used to qualify for an ordinary disability retirement.

Consequently, this matter will be held in abeyance until Mr. Spence provides information from the United States Military that contains exact start and end dates in order for the Purchase Section to verify which periods of time he is eligible to purchase. Exact dates of active duty service are required to ensure that he receives credit for the correct periods and to make sure that they do not overlap with other periods of service. (A motion to approve the request was made by Trustee Yarusinsky; seconded by Trustee Savicky. Vote: 4-1; Trustee Culliton nae. Thereafter, a motion was made to table the processing of the purchase for specific information was made by Trustee Favinger; seconded by Trustees Savicky. Vote 4-1; Trustee Yarusinsky nae.)

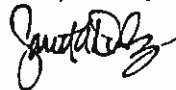
