Dear Mayor and Council

As previously communicated, in November 2019, the GR BOH, with a now clarified autonomous status, voted on and approved the attached language to be added to our current code. This will provide our health inspector greater ability to enforce pest control code compliance and establishes that a required monthly prevention program be in place. It also establishes fines for non-compliance.

A certified pest applicator is currently a requirement to be filled out on new Glen Rock business licenses applications. However, some establishments have failed to provide that information without consequence.

On behalf of the GR BOH, we look forward to ensuring that Glen Rock maintains the highest health standards, thus allowing us to be a gold standard in protecting the health and safety of all who patronize the food establishments in Glen Rock.
