Dear Sir/Madam:

The Evesham Township Clerk's Office received your Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request on **April 22, 2020**. The Evesham Township Police Department Records Custodian received your OPRA request on **April 22, 2020**. Clarification was requested and received on **April 23, 2020**. The seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request was **May 1, 2019**. A request for extension to **June 19, 2020** was sent to the email above on **April 28, 2020**. This response to your request is being provided to you within the extension period.

The records listed on the attached indexes are responsive to your OPRA and common law request for: "...1. All police CAD reports with narratives for the days of 12-26-2018, 3-10-2019, 3-11-2019 Please include a Record Index with your response..." (You denied a limit to the search in response to a request for clarification.) Due to the size of the responsive record files, the answers will be sent to you in multiple emails.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the Evesham Township Police Department to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
