Burnett v. County of Bergen, 198 N.J. 408 (2009). Without ambiguity, the court held that the privacy provision "is neither a preface nor a preamble." Rather, "the very language expressed in the privacy clause reveals its substantive nature; it does not offer reasons why OPRA was adopted, as preambles typically do; instead, it focuses on the law's implementation." "Specifically, it imposes an obligation on public agencies to protect against disclosure of personal information which would run contrary to reasonable privacy interests."

Upon attempting to leave the house, Angela confronted Stephen and accused him of being intoxicated. Stephen stated he briefly argued with Angela. He was planning on just going to bed and to not have any further altercation with Angela.

I reminded Stephen to not drive his vehicle if he was intoxicated.

11. Narrative

Detective Gaffey and I responded to 21 Main Street in reference to a dispute. Upon arrival, we spoke with Angela Wilson who advised her husband, identified as Stephen Wilson, was belligerent inside the house. Angela further advised Stephen was extremely intoxicated and was starting arguments with her. She told Detective Gaffey and I that Stephen was not physical with her and that she didn't think he would ever hit her. She requested we talk to Stephen in an attempt to calm him down.

We entered the residence and located Stephen in his office. We explained why we were there and asked him what was going on. Stephen said he was tired Angela getting mad at him for drinking alcohol, and that he merely wanted to go to sleep. He said she was arguing with him for no reason which was causing him to be upset. While speaking with him, it was clear he was extremely intoxicated and we requested he spend the night somewhere else in order to prevent the situation from escalating. Stephen advised he was willing to spend the night at a hotel if Angela wanted him to. Angela confirmed she thought it was best for him to leave for the night. Stephen was subsequently transported to the Holiday Inn Express by Detective Gaffey and I.
