NARRATIVE

On November 23rd, 2023 at approximately 12:54 P.M, I responded to 13 Jay Street, Avenel for a 911 Hang Up, later modified into a Domestic Violence Report.

While en route, I was advised via Computer Aided Dispatch Notes (CAD), that there were multiple 911 Hang Ups, coming from 13 Jay Street. The phone number (#848-203-7854), was going straight to voicemail on call back. The location was established by the Rapid SOS system.

Upon arrival, I knocked on the door and met with the suspect, Wilfredo Vazquez, and advised him if anyone contacted the police from the residence. Wilfredo replied saying something along the lines of "Oh this is what happened", before asking the victim, Lorena Geraldino-Ortiz, to explain to me what had occurred. I quickly observed that Lorena's face appeared to be as if she was just crying. Lorena began to explain what had occurred, however I cut her off, due to the fact that Wilfredo was behind her listening. It should be noted, Lorena and Wilfredo only speak Spanish and the conversations forward were in Spanish. At this time, I advised Woodbridge Police Headquarters to send me another police officer.

Shortly after, I asked Lorena to speak with me in the front of the residence, away from Wilfredo. Lorena said that an argument stemmed from an incident, which occurred yesterday, November 23rd, 2023 at approximately 10:00 P.M. Lorena said she has a son from a previous relationship, who stays with her and Wilfredo, at times. She said that yesterday at 10:00 P.M, Lorena's father (NFI), picked her son up from the home, when she wasn't there. Lorena stated she was upset and advised Wilfredo as such. Lorena said that Wilfredo began to tell her to go back to the son's father and suspected her of cheating. She states that she has not spoken to her son's father in over five years.

Lorena stated that after the initial argument, she went to sleep. On November 23rd, 2023 at approximately 4:00 A.M, Wilfredo woke Lorena up and re-engaged an argument with her. Lorena stated that Wilfredo accused her of cheating again, which prompted her to leave the bedroom and sleep in the living room. She states Wilfredo left her alone until approximately 12:30 P.M today. This afternoon, Lorena stated that Wilfredo began to argue with her once again. Lorena states she attempted to ignore Wilfredo, but also advised him that she wanted to leave the home. Lorena stated that Wilfredo did not like the idea of being ignored and grabbed her face. She stated Wilfredo grabbed and held her face with his hands, telling her that she had to speak with him.

Furthermore, Lorena stated she contacted her family members so that they may pick her up. She stated she began to gather her belongings when she said Wilfredo pushed her. She stated Wilfredo grabbed her and pushed her around in the living room area. The living room area did not appear to be in disarray. While speaking with Lorena, I did not observe any visible signs of injuries and she did not have a complaint of pain. I questioned Lorena if she wanted to be seen by an Ambulance, which she stated no. I provided Lorena the opportunity to apply for a Temporary restraining Order (TRO) and explained her Domestic Violence Rights. Subsequently, Lorena stated she did not want a TRO at this time and signed the VINE form, acknowledging as such. She was advised on how to apply for one at a later date if she wished. A state supplementary form was completed.

I spoke with Wilfredo who stated he had a verbal argument with Lorena. I questioned him if the argument was ever physical, which he stated something along the lines of "I didn't touch her. I would never hit her." When asked what the argument was about, Wilfredo stated he was just attempting to speak to Lorena, which she did not allow him to.

Subsequently, Lorena's family members arrived and assisted Lorena with gathering her belongings. Lorena stated she was leaving the residence

and not returning. The VINE and State supplementary forms were filed accordingly. The Domestic Violence Registry was checked and yielded no active TRO.
