Officer Report Narrative On 01/17/2025 at 22:16 hours, Ptl. Klein and I (Ptl. Arway) were dispatched to the area of Raritan St & Main St. for a motor vehicle crash (MVC). While en route, dispatch advised the responding patrol units that one of the persons involved in the MVC was leaving the scene and heading on Washington Rd. towards Ernston Rd. The reporting person of the MVC was the other person (Kevin Krishnasamy) involved in the MVC and was following the vehicle that left the scene as well as updating dispatch of their location. At that time, I activated my overhead emergency lights and sirens to respond to the fleeing vehicle. Kevin followed the other vehicle down Washington Rd, followed by a left onto N. Minisink Rd. then a right onto Creamer Dr at which time other		



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responding patrols and I arrived at which time both vehicles came to a stop.

Upon my arrival, I approached the vehicle (2021 black Lexus - NJ J59PDJ) that was in question for leaving the scene of the MVC as Ptl. Klein went and spoke with the reporting person. Ptl. Raub was already speaking with the driver who was identified as Devin Zamora. I asked Devin what had happened and why he left the scene of the crash. Devin advised he was not involved in a motor vehicle crash. I advised Devin we are here with him because it was reported he was involved in a MVC with another vehicle. I asked Devin if he knew what was going on and he began to look down in the car while shifting his body weight and stated nothing. I then inspected the front of Devin's vehicle because it was reported that his vehicle struck the rear of another, I found minor damage to the front right side of the bumper.

After inspecting the front of Devin's vehicle, I went to inspect the damage on Kevin's vehicle and speak with him. Kevin advised he was stopped at the traffic light on Raritan St. intersecting with Main St. when his vehicle was struck from behind by Devin's vehicle. Both drivers then exited the vehicle and began to have a discussion. Devin asked Kevin if he was okay and if he was calling the police. Kevin told Devin he was calling the police at which time Devin entered his vehicle and drove off heading onto Washington Rd. Kevin also stated Devin looked and sounded like he was drunk. I made my way back to Devin's vehicle and asked him how much he had to drink this evening, and he responded nothing. I questioned nothing at all two additional times which he responded no.

I then requested Devin's driver license, vehicle registration and vehicle insurance card. Devin's hand movements were very slow while looking for, retrieving and handing over the documents requested. As I was waiting for Devin to provide me with his documents, I advised him the driver of the other vehicle advised that they were out of the vehicle speaking about the incident together and you asked him if he was okay. I asked Devin if this happened, and he responded Yes. I inquired as to why he would ask this since he claimed he was not in any motor vehicle crash. Devin advised he pulled me over referring to the driver of the other vehicle. As my questioning continued, Devin stated he was not in an accident, and he did not get out of his vehicle and ask the other driver if he was okay. It appeared at this time; Devin was not being truthful with his statements. During my conversations and interaction with Devin, I observed his eyes to be watery with slightly droopy eyelids. While speaking with Devin, his speech was slurred, and I could detect an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the interior compartment of his vehicle. I asked Devin once again if he had anything to drink this evening and he advised he did not. I then asked him if there should be any damage to front of the vehicle and he advised there should not. I then asked Devin to step out of the vehicle so I could show him the damage. Devin exited the vehicle and stood in between the door and the



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vehicle trying to explain that he was a retired Newark Police Officer. Devin was unable to stand without grasping on the door for support and partially stumbling.

Based on my training and experience, there were several indicators causing me to believe Devin was possibly under the influence and field sobriety tests should be performed to determine further action. At that time, I requested Ptl. Raub to conduct a HGN test. See Ptl. Raub's supplement for further information in reference to his HGN test findings. Ptl. Raub advised while attempting to conduct the HGN test, he was able to detect an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from Devin's breath. After Devin was unable to perform the HGN test with Ptl. Raub, I brought Devin in front of marked patrol vehicle to perform additional field sobriety tests where the ground was level and clear of any debris. Emergency lights were deactivated for the purpose of the testing and Devin was faced away from the patrol vehicle.

I explained and demonstrated to Devin the first test we would be performing would be the walk and turn. After explaining and demonstrating the test to Devin, I asked him if he understood the instructions. Devin advised he understood. Devin placed his right foot to the front right of his left foot not touching or close to his left foot. I instructed Devin again to place his foot heel to toe for starting position. As I was continuing to explain the test, Devin stepped over his left foot and stumbled losing his balance and then tried to start walking forward. I advised Devin not to begin until I tell him to do so. After advising Devin to begin the test, he took nine steps forward and did not maintain heel to toe touching one time. Devin also did not keep his hands at the sides of his body. At the ninth step, Devin stopped, faced me, crossed his arms holding his hands and stared at me. I asked Devin if he was going to continue the test, Devin stated you said nine. I asked Devin if he understood the instructions and he said yes. I asked him what the next set of instructions are, and he was advised he had no idea. I advised Devin I would explain the instructions again and not to begin until I advise him. Before finishing the explanation of the instructions Devin started to walk forward and count each step at which time I advised him to begin. Devin took nine steps forward attempting to touch heel to toe however failed to do so as instructed. On the ninth step, Devin spun around on one foot inside of taking a series of small steps to turn around. Devin began to take steps back while counting each step however not maintaining a heel to toe walk. At step five, Devin lost his balance and stumbled. Devin continued after regaining balance and continued to nine steps however not maintaining heel to toe as instructed.

The second test explained and demonstrated to Devin was the one leg stand. I asked Devin if he had any injuries or disabilities that would hinder him from performing the test. Devin advised he did not, but he was 55. After explaining and demonstrating the test to Devin, I asked him if he understood the instructions. Devin advised he understood. Devin was then advised to begin the test when ready.



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Devin then stepped forward with his right foot first and continued to take steps counting each one until reaching nine steps. Devin then stopped, crossed his arms and began to stare at me. I advised Devin we were supposed to be performing the one leg stand test and that he understood the instructions and Devin stated oh. I then explained and demonstrated the one leg stand a second time to Devin. I asked Devin if he understood the instructions and he responded yea. I advised Devin to begin when ready. Devin stepped forward again with his right foot first and began to count one-one thousand followed by taking eight more steps and counted in the manner of two-one thousand, three one-thousand for each step until reaching the ninth step.

Based on the results to the field sobriety tests performed by Devin, the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from Devin's breath and all our observations during the investigation, it was determined Devin was placed under arrest for suspicion of driving while under the influence. Devin was placed in handcuffs, double locked behind his back with sufficient spacing around his wrists. Devin was then searched with negative results. Devin was escorted to patrol vehicle #23 and seated in the rear passenger compartment. The rear passenger compartment was checked and cleared prior to placing Devin inside. Devin was advised he would be audio and video recorded while in the rear compartment of the patrol vehicle.

Devin was transported to headquarters for processing with Ptl. Klein following. At headquarters, our duty weapons were secured in the salle port. Upon opening the rear passenger compartment door where Devin was located, I immediately detected an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the compartment area where Devin was. Devin was then escorted to the booking room where he was uncuffed and resecured to the booking room bench. I was advised that our Alcotest 9510 was out of service, and we would have to go to Old Bridge P.D. to utilize their Alcotest 9510. Devin was re handcuffed behind his back and the handcuffs were double locked with sufficient spacing around the wrists. Devin was escorted back to the salle port and secured in the rear compartment of vehicle #23. Ptl. Klein and I then began to transport Devin to Old Bridge P.D. in patrol vehicle #23. While en route to Old Bridge P.D., Devin began to complain about the handcuffs causing pain to his wrists and arms. Devin was advised the handcuffs were double locked with sufficient spacing. Devin continued to complain about the pain and requested medical assistance as we were pulling into the Old Bridge P.D. parking lot. I advised dispatch to have EMS meet us as Old Bridge P.D. for a complaint of pain on his wrists. We parked outside the Old Bridge P.D. salle port and escorted Devin into their building. Once we entered a room that lead to the cell area, I unlocked and increased the handcuff spacing around Devin's wrists. The handcuffs were then doubled locked again. Old Bridge P.D. asked if Devin still required medical assistance from EMS. I asked Devin if he would like the medical assistance that he requested from EMS and he advised he did not.



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We began the twenty-minute observation period commencing at 23:23 hours. Once their booking/Alcotest room was open, Devin was escorted to the room where the observations continued. During the twenty-minute observation period, Devin did not drink anything, eat anything, spit, burp, cough, vomit, hiccup, sneeze, place anything in his mouth or remove anything from his mouth, furthermore, do any action voluntary or involuntary that would cause the observation period to restart. I then read the NJ Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators to Devin. After reading the statement to Devin, he responded "yes" indicating he would provide his breath samples.

Once the twenty-minute observation period concluded, I initiated the first phase of instructions on how to perform a breath sample. Devin was read the standard instructions which consists of the following: "I want you to take a deep breath and blow into the mouthpiece with one long continuous breath. Continue to blow until I tell you to stop. Do you understand these instructions? Devin advised he understood. A new sealed mouthpiece was placed on the Alcotest hose and Devin attempted to provide his first breath sample at 23:45 hours, however he was not providing any volume of air into the hose. Devin was advised he needs to blow into the mouthpiece in order to provide a sample. The test was then stopped, and Devin was advised he would be given the opportunity to provide a second sample. Devin was reread the standard instructions listed above and a new sealed mouthpiece was placed on the Alcotest hose. Devin put his mouth onto the mouthpiece however he would not blow any air into the mouthpiece again. The test was stopped, and Devin was advised he would be provided a 3rd attempt. Devin was further advised if fails to provide a sufficient breath sample by attempting to manipulate the test, I would issue him a refusal. Devin advised he was blowing into the mouthpiece. However, the Alcotest would not register any volume of air as a sample was attempting to be given. Devin was then reread the standard instructions listed above for a 3rd time and a new sealed mouthpiece was placed on the Alcotest hose. Devin placed his mouth on the mouthpiece and once again, failed to blow any air into the mouthpiece. The 3rd test was stopped, and Devin was advised I would give him one last attempt to provide a breath sample. Devin was then reread the standard instructions listed above for a 4th time and a new sealed mouthpiece was placed on the Alcotest hose. Devin placed his mouth on the mouthpiece and failed to blow any air into the mouthpiece. The 4th test was stopped, and Devin was advised he was being issued a refusal to provide sufficient breath samples under sequential file #238.

Devin was escorted outside through the side port to patrol vehicle #23 and secured in the rear of the rear passenger compartment of the patrol vehicle. Upon pulling out of the Old Bridge P.D. parking lot, Devin began complaining of wrist pain from the handcuffs and requested we pull over and adjust the cuffs. I had adjusted the handcuffs when we arrived at Old Bridge P.D. to provide extra spacing on his wrists due to his complaints and he had not mention or complain once while inside the Old Bridge Police station. I advised Devin we would not be stopping or pulling over but if he would like EMS assistance, I will advise dispatch to have them respond to Sayreville headquarters



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to address his complaint. Devin continued to complain about pain to his wrists and request/demand we pull over. Since Devin's complaints were non-life threatening and I also provided additional spacing on his wrists when we arrived at the Old Bridge Police Station, the transport was not stopped.

Upon our arrival at Sayreville headquarters, our duty weapons were secured in the locked boxes inside the salle port. Devin was escorted to the booking room where he was to be booked and processed as per departmental procedures. Sayreville EMS arrived at headquarters, assessed Devin's complaints and provided him with an ice pack. Devin's complaint was that the handcuffs were too tight and that he sustained bruising to the top of his knuckles on both hands from the handcuffs. Devin requested from EMS to photograph the bruises. EMS advised Devin they do not take photographs. Since Devin was requesting the bruises to be photographed and document, I dismounted my body worn camera and scanned over his hands to document the bruises.

During the booking process, Devin was uncooperative, argumentative, and continuously made statements that he was a retired police officer and why did we do this to him. After taking Devin's booking photographs, he refused to sit back down on the holding bench. Devin was given several commands to sit back down which he refused. Devin ultimately sat down and was resecured to the bench handcuff. Devin then began to demand that we contact the Middlesex County Prosecutors Office for the bruising he claims was caused by the handcuffs. Devin was advised once he was released, he could call the prosecutor's office on his own accord.

Devin was asked to provide us with someone who would respond to headquarters and take custody of him upon his release. Devin advised he would like his daughter, Bryanna to pick him up. Devin provided us with his daughter's address since he did not know her phone number by memory. Devin provided an address of 250 Maple Ave, South Bound Brook. We had dispatch contact South Bound Brook P. D. and request they make a notification to Bryanna to respond to Sayreville P.D. to take custody of Devin. South Bound Brook P. D. made the notification and advised Bryanna would be responding.

While waiting for Devin's daughter to arrive, Devin made another request for EMS to assess his complaint of pain from the handcuffs but not by the same EMS squad because "they are our people". I advised Lt. Wilkins of Devin's request at which time RMJ EMS 1B13 responded to headquarters for Devin. Devin advised RWJ EMS of the bruising allegedly caused by the handcuffs and wanted EMS to document and take photographs of the bruises. EMS advised they do not take photographs. Devin did not make any further requests or complaints to the EMS at which time the cleared from the building.



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Bryanna Benjumea responded to headquarters and was provided with the Potential Liability Warning form and advised to read it. Bryanna then signed the form and provided me with a NJ driver's license. A copy was made of the signed form along with Bryanna's driver's license. Bryanna was then given the original signed form.

At this time, Devin was uncuffed and advised he was free to go. Devin was given his personal property back and advised to walk with us to the exit. Devin then began to record with his cell phone and was resistant to following our instructions to walk towards the EXIT. Devin finally walked to the area right before the exit to the lobby, stopped and demanded we call the Middlesex County Prosecutors Office. Devin had to be given several orders by Ptl. Klein, I and ultimately Lt. Kilcommons to exit this area. Devin finally exited through the door into our lobby area and requested the phone number for the MCPO. Lt. Kilcommons and I went out to the lobby at which time, I provided Devin with the phone number to the MCPO and Lt. Kilcommons provided Devin with an internal affairs complaint form. Devin insisted and demanded several times we call the MCPO. Lt. Kilcommons advised him that is not the proper procedure, and we would not be contacting the MCPO. As Lt. Kilcommons and I were entering back through the doorway into the Police Department, Devin grabbed onto the door attempting to restrict me from closing the door. Devin was physically moved back and advised he would be arrested if he attempted to enter this area of the building which is not permitted. Devin ultimately left the building.

Devin was issued the following summonses: E25000459 for 39:4-50, E25000460 for 39:4-96, E25000461 for 39:4-129B, E25000462 for 39:4-50.2. Devin was given his summonses and advised of the mandatory court date.

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Officer Report Detail

On Friday 01/17/2025, I (Ptl. Raub) was on patrol in uniform in marked patrol car #24. At approximately 2218 hours, I heard Ptl. Arway and Ptl. Klein get dispatched to a motor vehicle accident at the intersection of Raritan Street and Main Street. Moments later, Dispatch advised that the suspect vehicle, a black 2021 Lexus LS (NJ/J59PDJ) had fled the scene and was traveling westbound on Washington Road. Dispatch advised that the vehicle that was struck was following the suspect vehicle. I then responded to the area and ultimately located the vehicles on South Minnisink Avenue. I pulled behind the vehicles with my emergency lights activated right as they made a right turn onto Creamer Drive and both vehicles pulled over. I notified dispatch of my



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location and approached the Lexus.

Upon approaching the Lexus, I spoke with the male driver and only occupant, who was later identified as Devin Zamora. I asked Devin what happened, and Devin had no recollection of the accident and denied even being in an accident. Several other Officers arrived on scene at this time. Ptl. Arway and I continued to speak with Devin, while Ptl. Klein spoke with the driver of the victim vehicle. While speaking with Devin, his story changed multiple times. Devin initially denied being in an accident, then moments later admitted that he got out of his vehicle to check on the driver of the other vehicle after the accident, then again denied being in an accident. We located damage on the Lexus that was consistent with this motor vehicle accident. Ptl. Arway requested Devin's driver's license, registration and insurance. Please note that Devin's movements were slow and deliberate, and he had difficulty completing this simple task. While speaking with Devin, I observed his eyes to be watery and bloodshot and I could detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his mouth as he spoke. Ptl. Arway asked Devin if he had anything to drink tonight but he stated that he did not. Ptl. Arway asked Devin to step out of the vehicle and requested that he perform some Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFST's). Devin agreed to participate in the testing.

The first test administered was Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN). I administered this test by provided clear and concise instructions on how to perform the test. I asked Devin if he understood the instructions and he advised that he did. I held the stimulant, the tip of my finger, approximately 12-15 inches away from Devin's face during the testing. Devin also denied wearing contact or glasses. I began with testing with the medical assessment to check Devin's eyes but was unable to due to Devin moving his head back and forth with my finger. I asked Devin if he understood the instructions I gave him and he stated that he did, I then advised Devin again to stop moving his head and follow my finger with his eyes and eyes only. On my second and third attempt to conduct the test, Devin, again did not follow the instructions and continued to move his head so I was ultimately unable to complete this test. Please note that while I was standing face to face with Devin, I again detected the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. The remaining SFST's were completed by Ptl. Arway. Please see his initial report for further information. Devin was ultimately placed under arrest by Ptl. Arway for 39:4-50. I then conducted a search of the passenger compartment of Devin's vehicle for intoxicants but did not locate anything. I remained on scene until Devin's vehicle was towed by Thrust Towing and then cleared the scene.

Nothing further at this time.
