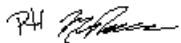
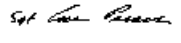

51. Narrative On the above date and time, Sgt. Prach and I responded to Justin Court, building 2, for a report of a loud disturbance out back of a female smashing things and banging on doors. Upon arrival, Sgt. Prach made contact with a passerby who advised the disturbance was coming from apartment #210. As I approached apartment #210, there was a black wig on the ground and a disheveled door mat wedged under the apartment door. A female answered the door, and I recognized her as Zeda Swain, whom I have previously dealt with for a noise complaint (see 23-29315). Sgt. Prach began to speak with her asking if everything was okay and that we got called there for a disturbance. Zeda immediately became argumentative with Sgt. Prach and inside the apartment there were items thrown all over the ground. He asked if there was anyone else in the apartment and she advised her sister, Kayla. As Zeda held the door open, Kayla approached the door when Sgt. Prach asked Kayla to come outside to speak to me (I also recognized Kayla from the previous noise complaint incident). At that point, Zeda attempted to shut the door stating we don't pay rent and cannot enter the apartment. Sgt. Prach was able to block Zeda from shutting the door when Zeda reached out with a closed fist to strike at Sgt. Prach. Sgt. Prach and I were able to grab Zeda from the doorway and escorted her outside, where she continued to fight and forcibly resist after she was told she was now under arrest. Kayla then exited the apartment and attempted to come between Sgt. Prach and I. I was able restrain Kayla by holding her wrist and trying to keep her attention on me as Zeda was screaming while Sgt. Prach was putting her in handcuffs. Kayla then tried to turn from me in an attempt to get to Zeda again, and grabbed Sgt. Prach, when she

tripped over Zeda who was now on the ground and fell. At that point Zeda was in handcuffs and Sgt. Prach assisted me with attempting to place Kayla in handcuffs, but she was forcibly resisting by pulling away, kicking, yelling, and not listening to our commands to stop resisting. Once we were able to get her in handcuffs, Zeda began to run away yelling for help towards the direction of Justin Court while in handcuffs. Once Kayla was secured, Sgt. Prach ran after Zeda and was able to locate her in front of the main office.

Once I had Kayla secured, I escorted her to my patrol vehicle, Car #76, where she continued to try to pull away and grab at me while yelling and calling me names. I conducted a search which was negative for weapons or contraband and placed her in the rear seat when I noticed [REDACTED]. I was unable to determine if it was caused from something prior to our arrival as there was [REDACTED] in the house or from when she tripped trying to get to Zeda. I asked if she needed medical attention, but she denied it. It should be noted while dealing with both parties, they both had a strong odor of alcoholic beverage emanating from their breath. At that point, Det. Magley, Det. Zakrzewski, Pt. Coleman, and additional units from Morris Township PD arrived. Ptl. Coleman stood by with Kayla and was able to gather that the both of them had been drinking and smoking marijuana when they had a verbal argument. Due to Kayla's mood swings going from fighting, to screaming, to crying, to being apologetic, we were unable to gather anything further as to why they were yelling and causing a disturbance. Sgt. Prach and I entered the house to make sure there were no additional parties inside. Inside was negative, but there [REDACTED], items broken throughout the house, and the stove was on.

Sgt. Prach was able to secure Zeda in his patrol car, Car #77. Det. Zakrzewski followed me back to police headquarters as I transported Kayla in the rear seat of Car #76 which was checked before and after with negative results. Once at police headquarters we provided Kayla with a Tyvek suit due to her having no shoes and no shirt, only two sport bras. She was escorted into police headquarters where she was processed, fingerprinted and photographed. Kayla then ripped the Tyvek suit off while sitting in the processing chairs. Due to the time that was needed to complete the complaints and Kayla acting belligerent (yelling, crying, banging on the processing ledge), she was placed in Cell #1. A prisoner log was completed. While in the cell, she continued to yell, scream, punch/kick the door, attempted to clog the toilet, and threw ripped up toilet paper all throughout the cell.

Once the charges were completed, Kayla had a PSA of a 1/2. I charged Kayla on Complaint-Summons 1412-2024-000078 for the following charges, Aggravated Assault on a Law Enforcement Officer, 2C:12-1B(5)(A), Hindering by Use of Force, 2C:29-3A(5), Resisting Arrest 2C:29-2A(1), Obstruction 2C:29-1A, Harassment 2C:33-4A, and Disorderly Conduct, 2C:33-2.

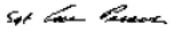
She was advised of her court date at the Morris County Superior Court on March 27, 2024 at 11:30 AM and was provided with a CJP form. She was released from police custody.
