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On 07/12/2026 at 22:01 hours, Ptl. Cortez, Ptl. Jarock and I (Ptl. Dufrat) were dispatched to 140 Morgan Ave. for the report of a possible domestic. Dispatch advised the call went to South Amboy PD and there were multiple 911 abandons coming from the residence.

Upon arrival, I spoke with Deborah Fusco and Stanley Pado in the backyard of 140 Morgan Ave. Deborah explained that their neighbor from 29 Second St., Laura Hamilton, came to the residence earlier asking for help. Deborah allowed Laura and her children, and Michael Scott into the residence. Deborah then explained that Laura's husband, Frank Miranda, came to the residence and was pounding on the front door demanding to know where his children are. Deborah explained that Stanley answered the door and a verbal dispute started between Stanley and Frank. Deborah and Stanley both explained that Frank then started attacking Stanley, and the physical altercation moved into the street. Stanley had a bruise under his left eye as a result of the altercation but denied medical attention.

I then spoke with Laura and Frank at their residence across the street (29 Second St.). Laura advised that she was ok and there was no domestic violence incident between her and Frank. Laura explained that she went over to Deborah asking for help because Laura did not have any power and wanted to move some food into their refrigerator. Laura explained that Frank was intoxicated and went over to 140 Morgan Ave. because he did not know where and Michael were. An argument occurred between Frank and Stanley and they ended up fighting in the middle of the street.

I spoke with Frank who was visibly intoxicated (stumbling, slurring his words and had the distinct smell of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his person). Frank shared a similar version of events but explained that Stanley was the one who attacked him first in front of 140 Morgan Ave. Frank explained that he only held Stanley down on the street and did not throw any punches at him. Frank had scrapes to both of his knees but denied medical attention.

At Frank and Laura's request, we went over to 140 Morgan Ave. where was. willingly came outside and advised he is more than comfortable to go back home and he did not witness any of the incident as he was inside. Ptl. Jarock spoke with Michael who advised that he wished to stay at 140 Morgan Ave. for the night and did not wish to come outside to speak with Frank or Laura. Deborah advised that Michael can stay at the



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residence for the evening.

Both Stanley and Frank were provided with a case number and advised how to sign complaints against each other for simple assault. Nothing further at this time.
