NARRATIVE

On September 29, 2022 at approximately 2131 hours, I (Patrolman Fegler) was traveling northbound on US HWY 1. While traveling northbound, I observed a white Honda Accord, bearing New Jersey registration (NJ- [REDACTED]) being operated in a careless and reckless manner specifically by traveling at a high rate of speed, swerving in and out of lanes and almost causing numerous motor vehicle crashes. As I attempted to close the gap between my patrol vehicle and the suspect vehicle, I radioed over to dispatch advising them of the aforementioned New Jersey registration and that I would be conducting a motor vehicle stop.

It should be noted at this time, the suspect vehicle and I were stopped at a red traffic signal at the intersection of US HWY 1 and Old Post Road, just near the Boston Market. Once the traffic signal turned green and upon locating a safe location, I activated my overhead emergency lights in attempt to conduct the motor vehicle stop. The suspect vehicle activated his right turn signal, making a right turn on to Old Post Road as if he was going to come to a complete stop on the side street. However, the suspect vehicle failed to come to a complete stop and immediately accelerated at a high rate of speed, in attempt to flee from me. I notified dispatch, as well as supervisors of the situation.

At this time, I activated my sirens and attempted to close the gap between my patrol vehicle #47 and the suspect vehicle. It was unknown at this time if the suspect vehicle was stolen due to CJIS being temporarily down. While attempting to close the gap, I provided direction of travel and number of occupants observed in the vehicle. Before I was able to request authorization for a pursuit, the suspect vehicle crashed into a guardrail at the intersection of Old Post Road/ Clausen Road. Due to extent of the motor vehicle crash, I requested all available units to my location, as well as EMS, Medics, and Edison Fire Department.

I exited my patrol vehicle and took cover behind the rear driver side bumped. I advised dispatch that I had no movement inside of the vehicle and waited for additional units to arrive. As units were enroute to my location, I observed the passenger door of the suspect vehicle open. I drew my duty firearm, providing verbal commands for the subjects to show me their hands and to get on their stomachs. I notified responding units that I had two (2) subjects at gun point.

As units arrived, we were able to approach the subjects and clear the

vehicle. Both subjects were placed in handcuffs and detained for further investigation. The driver of the vehicle was identified as Angel Yambo and the passenger was identified as Javian Medina.

Mr. Medina was secured in the rear of Patrolman Shamy's patrol vehicle #30.

Mr. Yambo was patted down for officer safety before being secured in my vehicle. It should be noted; while patting down Mr. Yambo, I observed a blunt object in his front right coat pocket, which resulted in the findings of a grey and black scale. Mr. Yambo stated the scale was used to weigh his marijuana.

Patrolman Ellmyer, Sgt. Sorber, Sgt Varga and Sgt. Duffy arrived on scene.

EMS arrived on location and both Mr. Yambo and Mr. Medina were evaluated for their injuries. Both subjects refused medical attention and did not wish to go to the hospital. Majestic towing was detailed to this location for an impound.

While on scene, officers were trying to figure out if the vehicle was possibly stolen. Mr. Yambo stated the vehicle was registered to his father ([REDACTED]) but it was determined that the vehicle was registered to a [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Dispatch contacted Middletown PD and requested an officer to go speak with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] contacted this jurisdiction and spoke with the Watch Commander, informing him that the vehicle is not stolen and a family friend has been using her vehicle for approximately four years and believes his name is [REDACTED]

Mr. Yambo was transported to police headquarters for processing. While enroute to police headquarters, I advised Mr. Yambo of his Miranda Rights, which he stated he understood. Once back at police headquarters, Mr. Yambo was fully processed. I contacted Judge Dedhia in regards to this incident. She advised me that she would place the charges on a summons but manually changed Mr. Yambos' CJP appearance to 09/30/2022 at 1000 hours. Mr . Yambo was served with his complain summons, 1205-S-2022-001035 for 2C:36-2A- possession of drug paraphernalia and 2C:29-2B for Eluding. Additionally, Mr. Yambo was served with numerous motor vehicle summons and provided a court date of October 10, 2022 at 0900 hours. Mr. Yambo was released on his own recognizance.

Patrolman Ditmars completed the impound sheet as well as the crash report. (For further details, see crash report# 22058612).

It should be noted; my department issued body worn camera was activated during this incident. All in-car and BWC footage has been tagged

accordingly. ***NOTE- in-car camera time is not accurate***
