CASE REPORT FOR PD CASE #2025-23257

BWC/MVR ACTIVATED FOR INCIDENT

On 07/26/2025 at approximately 2010 hours, I was on Patrol in unmarked PTPD Patrol Vehicle #1818 in the area of Lakehurst Road and Rancocas Lane. I observed turning off of Junction Road onto Lakehurst Road, a Side by Side offroad vehicle at a high rate of speed nearly losing control turning onto Lakehurst Road. I observed the same vehicle pass me on my left, covered in mud without a visible registration displayed. I observed the vehicle begin making a left hand turn into the parking lot of the Dominos Pizza located at 100 Lakehurst Road, without utilizing its left hand blinker. I entered the parking lot behind the Side by Side, with my emergency lights activated, and the vehicle began to enter into a parking spot. During this time, I observed the white male operator stick his head out of the driver side window area and look at my patrol vehicle. The male described as a white male with a goatee and a backwards baseball style hat. The male then placed the vehicle in reverse, and reversed into my patrol vehicle. I observed Central Communications of my location and incident, at which time the vehicle pulled forward, and again reversed into my vehicle. At this time, My K9 Pepper struck into the kennel partition with force and fell onto her side. At this time, the vehicle pulled forward, striking a black in color Jeep Cherokee which was later deemed to be occupied by an adult and two juvenile children, then again reversed striking my patrol vehicle and drove onto the hood of my patrol vehicle. The vehicle drove forward again striking the black Jeep, and again backed into my vehicle, before pulling forward, striking the black Jeep again, and fleeing the parking lot. During this duration, my emergency lights were activated as well as my emergency sirens as well. I advised Central Communications of my location and requested permission to pursue the motor vehicle which was authorized by OIC Smith.

I pursued the vehicle which failed to maintain its lane on Clubhouse Road, making a left turn onto Oak Avenue with speeds nearly double the posted speed limit. I continued the pursuit onto East Avenue, Ultimately turning onto Clubhouse Road with the vehicle failing to stop for a posted stop sign. The vehicle entered onto West lakeshore drive passing multiple vehicles on a posted double yellow line at a high rate of speed. During the length of West Lakeshore Drive, the vehicle was traveling up to approximately 70 MPH in a posted 35 MPH Zone, passing vehicles on a posted double yellow line. Vehicles were yielding to my patrol vehicle during this time and there was no pedestrian traffic. The vehicle turned onto Bayberry Street towards East Lakeshore drive, continuing through an illuminated and flashing red light at a high rate of speed, once I safely cleared the intersection, I continued across the intersection. During this section of Bayberry while approaching Hanover Blvd, the vehicle traveled at approximately 70 MPH in a posted 25 MPH Zone. The vehicle then turned left onto Hanover Blvd, and continued at a high rate of speed passing a vehicle at approximately 90 MPH across a double yellow line, then turned right onto Lupin Street. While traveling on Lupin Street, I confirmed with OIC Smith to



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continue the pursuit which he authorized after I Reaffirmed speeds and road conditions. At this time, the vehicle turned onto Larch then quickly onto Vine Street. The vehicle failed to stop at the posted stop sign on Vine Street, and continued on the second section of Vine towards North Lakeshore Drive. The vehicle failed to stop at the posted stop sign on Vine and made a right hand turn onto North Lakeshore Drive. I lost a visual due to the vehicle making a right hand turn onto Aster St, at which time I turned onto Alyssum street advising Central Communications of my update. Once back on North Lakeshore Drive, I observed the vehicle turn off of Fern Street back onto North Lakeshore Drive. I again requested permission to pursue the vehicle which was authorized. The vehicle made a left hand turn onto Lupin Dr, then drove through a backyard back towards North Lakeshore Drive. During this time there was no vehicle traffic and speeds maintained around 70 MPH in a posted 35 MPH Zone. The vehicle slowed down to around 40 MPH before traveling through a yard at North Lakeshore Drive onto Mockingbird. The vehicle then stopped in the middle of the roadway and the driver, exited the vehicle and fled on Mockingbird towards the woodline. Due to their being an occupant of the vehicle, I stayed with the vehicle, and removed the passenger detaining him into handcuffs which were double locked.

Once the male passenger was detained and a safety pat down was complete the male, later identified as Jason Ferriday was placed into a patrol vehicle. Once the scene was secured, I returned to my patrol vehicle and retrieved K9 Pepper, placing her into her tracking harness. K9 Warnings were announced at this time and Once near the vehicle, K9 Pepper was placed in a down and began to track. K9 Pepper tracked into the woodline where the male was last seen running, continuing through the woods and ultimately onto the second section of Mockingbird towards the top portion of Goodwater. Due to K9 Pepper now showing signs of fatigue as well as a limp, This K9 track was terminated. Once the description of the male was put out, after a short time officers found the driver walking on Goodwater Avenue in the area of Vine Street matching the description. This male was detained, and I responded to the scene to identify the male. I observed the male, matching the same male which operated the motor vehicle which struck my patrol vehicle as well as fled on foot. I mirandized the male, which he acknowledged that he understood the rights and agreed to speak with me. I explained to the male later identified as Bobby Boyle the reason as to why I attempted to stop him. Boyle explained to me that the passenger Ferriday told him during the duration of the stop, that he had drugs on him and that is the reason that he fled the stop, and ultimately fled on foot. I checked on Boyle's health which he advised that he was not injured during this incident. It should be noted that during this time, Boyle was found to be slurring his words, as well as a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage was emanating from his breath while speaking with me. Boyle was transported to this agency without further incident. Once checked through Central Communications, Ferriday was released from custody without incident and walked from the scene. Always towing responded to the scene, and ultimately took possession of the Side by Side, which was towed to our impound yard.

Boyle was fingerprinted and processed for violation of NJS: 2c:12-1B5A, 2c:29-2B, 2c:29-1A, 2C:17-3A1, 2C:29-3B2, and 2C:29-3.1b. These charges were placed on PTPD Warrant #0330-W-2025-648. A NJ victim notification form was also completed for this incident. Summonses for violation of NJS Title 39



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were issued as follows: 39:3-10, 39:4-97, 39:3-33, 39:4-126a, 39:4-88, 39:4-96, 39:4-98, 39:4-144, 39:3-44, 39:4-97.2, 39:3-80, 39:6b-2. Boyle was subsequently transported to the Burlington County Jail where he was ultimately lodged.

Due to the initiated pursuit, A Benchmark Pursuit form was completed and submitted to Captain Luis for this incident. The motor vehicle accident will be completed as a NJTR-1 under this case number.
