The Carteret Borough Hall received your OPRA Records Act (OPRA) request on June 10, 2019. The official Records Custodian, Captain Michael Dammann received your OPRA request on June 10, 2019. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request is Wednesday June 19, 2019. This response is being provided on the **Seventh (7th)** business day since the Carteret Police Departments records custodian received said request.

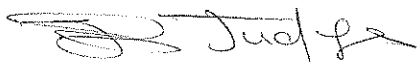
The size of your request is voluminous and therefore requires additional time beyond the seven (7) business days to fulfill. OPRA allows custodians to seek extension of time pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5.I. Specifically, OPRA states that, "the requestor shall be advised by the custodian when the record can be made available. If the record is not made available by that time, access shall be deemed denied."

Your request requires an extension of time until June 28, 2019.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within seven (7) business days by law, you have the right to challenge the decision by the Carteret Police Department to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint form.
