Narrative:

On January 23, 2014 at approximately 0848 hrs., I (Patrolman Austin Pelka) responded to 1201 Route 37 E for the report of a burglary. Upon arrival I spoke with reporting person, Robert Grady who stated that several offices within the building were burglarized. As I walked through the building, I noticed several doors "kicked in" and the offices disheveled. Mr. Grady has an office in the building although was not a victim of this incident. I spoke with victim Robert Smith (office #3). Mr. Smith stated that at this time he did not notice anything missing or stolen. The front door of the office was kicked in and the lock was broken. He reported that a few shelves and papers were out of place.

I spoke with witness Albert Finkel (AJ Finkel CPA). He stated that he was the last one in the office building as he normally is. He left his office at 1930 hrs the previous day. His office is located on the top floor. He stated that he did not lock the front door of the building because he believed he heard several individuals downstairs on the bottom floor. Let it be noted that on Monday and Wednesday's from 1930-2030 hrs., there is Alcohol Anonymous meeting located downstairs in office #16.

I further spoke with witness Susan Zapata, who is an employee of Always Immaculate Inc. located in an upstairs office. She stated she came into the office building around 1045 hrs. yesterday. She was only in the building for approximately 15 minutes. Although she mentioned while in the building, she heard several individuals in the downstairs offices. She assumed since there are multiple businesses it was not suspicious. She did mention that she heard a "loud bang" downstairs, although stated thought it was a door being slammed. She noted that she remembered seeing a grey Honda Civic with a spoiler sitting outside at this time. She mentioned she has never seen the vehicle before outside the office building.

I spoke with Sally Torres of Always Immaculate. She stated that earlier this morning (0650 hrs.) one of her workers advised her that the front door of the office building was unlocked. She did mention it is not uncommon for the doors to be unlocked. The worker did not know that the offices were

burglarized at this time.

There were several other doors broken into. The furnace room located on the bottom floor had the door kicked in. It appeared that nothing was missing. A vacant room (Office #14), was broken into as well. Also the female restroom was broken into the same way. For Anchor Contracting (Office #2) reference case #14-4435. For Learning Plus (Office #4) reference case #14-4436. Both referenced cases were victims of the burglary.

I contacted property manager, Helen Voss, and notified her of this incident. She stated that she would contact that building owners (R&T Corporation). She advised me that she does not believe that the building has cameras. She is also unaware of who may be the suspect/s. Ptl. Brennan responded to the scene for processing. Nothing further at this time.
