On 04/04/2011 at 1320 hours I was dispatched to a theft call at 242 Possum Hollow Road Suite 1A. Upon arrival I met with Adi Nikitinsky who is the

tenant and business owner of Dot Designing. Mr. Nikitinsky stated he had spoken to his landlord Thomas Reagan and he wanted to report he had three 36"x26" screens stolen from his window sills. The subject showed me the windows that were missing screens. I observed three window sills that had a small indent in the bottom of the glass pain where the rubber is located. Mr. Nikitinsky stated that he believes the indent indicated the screens were most likely taken off the sill with a pry bar. I observed the glass windows and saw no fingerprints on them. There were no visible signs of entry into the structure. Mr. Nikitinsky stated he was not missing anything from the inside of his office.

This officer was then informed the last time Mr. Nikitinsky saw the screens was approximately one week ago. Mr. Nikitinsky stated he did not notice the screens were missing until the morning of 04/04/2011. I asked Mr. Nikitinsky how he noticed the screens were gone. He informed me a man named Donald from the Sara Lee Company that neighbors his business called to inform him he had a screen stolen from his window. I then asked Mr. Nikitinsky how much the screens were worth. The subject estimated Mr. Reagan paid approximately sixty dollars for each screen.

I asked Mr. Nikitinsky if he had any ideas as to who might have taken his screens. The subject stated that a group of kids have been building a fort in the woods nearby. Mr. Nikitinsky stated that perhaps the juveniles took his screens to use at their fort. This officer then walked into the woods to look for the screens. While walking around the area I observed no screens. I returned to Dot Designing to speak with Mr. Nikitinsky.

This officer informed the subject that the business's screens were not located. I told Mr. Nikitinsky that if he has any more information to contact me at police headquarters. I then cleared the scene. There is no further information available.

On July 22, 2011 at approximately 10:37 hours, I was dispatched to Police Headquarters for a walk in fraud report. Upon arrival, I spoke to Adi Nikitinsky who advised me he received three bad checks from a client. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he is the President of DOT Designing LLC, a graphic design and print studio. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he printed several

pictures for a client, Ms. Jennifer Buchold and sold them to her on June 10, 2011. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me Ms. Buchold wrote him two checks, Bank of America #114 for \$180.00 and #115 for \$75.00, for a total of \$255.00 dollars. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he deposited both checks into his account, PNC Bank [REDACTED] Mr. Nikitinsky advised me both checks were returned due to insufficient funds. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he has contacted Ms. Buchold several times both through emails and phone calls. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me Ms. Buchold sent him another check, Bank of America #0996 for \$250.00 dollars, which was also returned after he deposited it, due to insufficient funds. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he has been unable to contact Ms. Buchold since. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he would like to sign complaints against Ms. Buchold.

I then provided Mr. Nikitinsky with a Bad Check Form to complete. I advised Mr. Nikitinsky he needed to send two certified letters to Ms. Buchold advising her of the returned checks before he could sign a criminal complaint against her for the bad checks. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he would do so and return to sign the complaints. I then provided him with a Monroe Township Blue Citizen Information Card and advised him how to obtain a copy of this report. I then completed a Property Report form and logged the checks into the downstairs evidence drop. See attached copies. No further information. Cleared Scene.

On the above date I responded to 242 Possum Hollow Road to speak to Mr. Adi Nikitinsky about a trailer that had been parked on his property. Mr. Nikitinsky is the owner of DOT Designing which is located in suite 1A.

Mr. Nikitinsky stated that he had a landscape trailer parked outside of his business. The trailer, which is owned by Mr. Theodore Ganska Jr., was

parked outside awaiting work to be done to it. Mr. Nikitinsky stated that he received a text message from Mr. Ganska stating that he no longer wanted work done to the trailer because Mr. Ganska would be getting a new trailer. Mr. Nikitinsky stated the last contact he had with Mr. Ganska was approximately the end of March 2012.

Mr. Nikitinsky called the police because when he arrived at work on 5/07/2012 at approximately 0800 hours he noticed that the trailer was missing. He stated he attempted to contact Mr. Ganska, however did not get a response. Mr. Nikitinsky wanted to document the incident so he would not get blamed for anything that may be wrong with the trailer. Mr. Nikitinsky stated he would continue to try and make contact with Mr. Ganska and if he did speak to him he would advise him to contact this agency.

I then returned to headquarters and attempted several times to make contact with Mr. Ganska via telephone. After several failed attempts, I left a detailed message on Mr. Ganska's voicemail with instructions on how to proceed if he wished to enter his vehicle as stolen.

While in headquarters on 05/21/12 at 1357 hours, I was informed by dispatch that there was in individual who wanted to report a stolen trailer.

I went into the lobby and spoke to Carolyn Therrien. Mrs. Therrien stated that her brother, identified as Theodore Ganska Jr., wanted her to report that his cargo trailer bearing NJ registration THK98U was stolen from DOT Designing at 242 Possum Hollow Road. She stated that Mr. Ganska was unable to come in person to report the trailer stolen because of his hectic work schedule and his distance from Monroe Twp.

Mrs. Therrien was able to provide me with some information about the trailer, as well as the registration. She was unsure of what was contained inside of the trailer. I issued her two property loss forms for Mr. Ganska to fill out for the contents of the trailer and advised her to have it returned to MTPD as soon as possible. I attempted to make contact with Mr. Ganska which was unsuccessful. I left him a message to attempt to get more information about the incident.

On 05/07/12, Adi Nikitinsky (owner of DOT Designing) filed a report stating that the trailer was missing from the parking lot of his business (see report 12-12462). I called Mr. Nikitinsky on 05/21/12 at approximately 1415 hours to speak with him. Mr. Nikitinsky stated that he saw the trailer in the parking lot when he left at about 1400 hours on 05/04/12 and noticed it was missing when he returned on 05/07/12 at about 1200 hours. Mr. Nikitinsky stated he tried to contact Mr. Ganska but was unsuccessful.

I had dispatch enter the trailer into NCIC (NIC# V815190873).

Upon arrival, I spoke to David Dobson who advised me the resident of 1 Davino Drive, later identified as Adi Nikitinsky got into a verbal argument with a driver of a dump truck over blocking the roadway.

Mr. Dobson advised me that he is the Forman for Scheideler Excavating and at any given time there are approximately twenty to thirty different privately contracted dump truck drivers loading and unloading on the site. Mr. Dobson advised me he did not know which driver Mr. Nikitinsky got into an argument with but would contact me if he found out. I then provided Mr. Dobson with a citizen information card with my contact information on it.

I was then approached by a male subject, identified as Adi Nikitinsky. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me an unidentified dump truck driver yelled at him to get out of the road, so he could proceed to his job site. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he did not like how the driver spoke to him so he stood in the roadway, engaging in a verbal argument. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he was then approached by Mr. Dobson about moving from the roadway, which then turned into another verbal argument. Mr. Nikitinsky advised me he then moved out of the way. Both subjects were advised to stay away from each other to prevent further verbal disputes.

At this time, I have no description of the driver or vehicle involved. No further information. Cleared scene.

While en route, I was advised by Ofc. McClain that a vehicle, NJ registration V17JFB, had just left the driveway of this residence and that she believed it was involved in this incident. I then located that vehicle on Prospect Plains Road and stopped it in front of 168 Prospect Plains Road.

I then spoke to the driver, Charles Dipierro, and the front seat passenger, Peter Tufano. Mr. Tufano stated that he had a verbal argument with a co-worker, Adi Nikitinsky, at 346 Applegarth Road. Mr. Tufano stated that the argument was about signs that Mr. Nikitinsky had made for an upcoming election. Mr. Tufano stated that the argument did not become physical and that Mr. Nikitinsky had left just prior to our arrival. While on scene, I had dispatch conference me with Mr. Nikitinsky and he reiterated a similar story to Mr. Tufano. Mr. Nikitinsky confirmed that the argument did not become physical, and that it had started in regards to election signs he had made for Mr. Tufano and Mr. Dipierro.
