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On November 8, 2021 at 1926 hours, the victim, Michael Simonetti, responded to police headquarters to report his ex-girlfriend, Lindsey Kramer, had been harassing him and he would like to apply for a Temporary Restraining Order. Simonetti stated Kramer had been harassing him at work in Stafford Township and he has been receiving non-stop phone calls. Simonetti stated during one of the phone calls Kramer stated she was going to shoot him. Simonetti showed me his phone but did not have any proof that she stated this. Simonetti expressed he thinks Kramer is attempting to ruin his life and the relationships he has. He stated that early this afternoon, there was an incident in Stafford Township in which he received a summons from Stafford Township Police Department for violating a TRO Kramer has against him but he was not arrested. Simonetti stated there has been continuously ongoing issues between him and Kramer. After speaking with Simonetti, Ptl. McKuhan and I went back into the squad room to print a copy of the TRO and contacted Stafford Township PD in reference to the incident which occurred in their jurisdiction.

Stafford PD advised they had dealt with Simonetti earlier in the day and he was arrested for a violation of the TRO and released on a summons. Stafford PD stated Ocean Township Police Department had just called them an hour ago looking for Simonetti because Kramer reported another incident had occurred. After speaking with Stafford PD, I contacted Ocean Township PD in reference to the incident that happened in their jurisdiction. Ocean Township PD stated Simonetti violated the restraining order and there was a warrant out for his arrest. Little Egg Police Dispatch faxed down the warrant. Upon receiving the copy of the warrant, Ptl. McKuhan and I responded back to the police headquarters lobby. I had advised Simonetti was under arrest for violating an active Restraining Order out of Ocean Township. Simonetti was advised to place his hands behind his back in which he complied and was handcuffed using the double lock mechanism. He was then searched incident to arrest yielding negative results for contraband. Simonetti's property that he had with him was turned over to his friend, Ryan.

Simonetti was then escorted into the processing room. Ptl. McKuhan and I secured our firearms. He was handcuffed to the processing bench using the double lock mechanism. A New Jersey Victim Notification Form was completed. Simonetti was advised of his Domestic Violence Rights and advised he has the right to apply for a Temporary Restraining Order. Judge Scott Basen was then contacted and apprised of the incident. After speaking with Simonetti, Judge Basen denied the TRO at 2043 hours. Simonetti was explained he could appeal the TRO requesting a De Novo hearing but declined after stating he wanted to speak with his lawyer. Simonetti refused to sign the VINE form.

At 2110 hours, Squad 85 was notified to respond to headquarters for Simonetti having chest pains. Squad 85 arrived on scene and attended to Simonetti. Simonetti stated to Squad 85 he would like to go to the hospital for his chest pains. He was then handcuffed in the front using the double lock mechanism. I rode inside the ambulance and assisted Squad 85 with the transport to Southern Ocean Medical Center. Ptl. McKuhan followed Squad 85 with patrol vehicle #70. As Ptl. McKuhan and I arrived at the hospital, Ocean Township PD was already on scene. Ocean Township PD took custody of Simonetti. A copy of the TRO was later delivered by Ptl. McKuhan since the TRO was not able to be finished before Simonetti was transported in the ambulance. Nothing further to report.
