Dear ASK NJ Media Co.,

Your OPRA request sought access to the following:

- “1. I seek all Body-Worn Camera Footage and audio communication recordings for any police officers-involved for the "Protest-6/1/2020".
2. Please provide all dash camera footage and audio communication for any police car involved for the "Protest-6/1/2020".
3. Any and all radio transmissions between MCSOC dispatch and any officers involved for the "Protest-6/1/2020".
4. Any and all cell phone calls/phone calls between MCSOC dispatch and any officers involved for the "Protest-6/1/2020".
5. A copy of any and all cell phone texts between MCSOC dispatch and any officers involved for the "Protest-6/1/2020".
6. A list of all Asbury Park police officers and other police officers from other law enforcement agencies/police departments by rank, name and badge number that were involved during the "Protest-6/1/2020".”

Your request requires additional time beyond the seven (7) business days to fulfill due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. OPRA allows custodians to seek extensions of time pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5.i. Specifically, OPRA states that, “the requestor shall be advised by the custodian when the record can be made available. If the record is not made available by that time, access shall be deemed denied.”

Your request requires an extension of time until October 4, 2020. A response will be provided to you on or before this date.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the City of Asbury

Park to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
