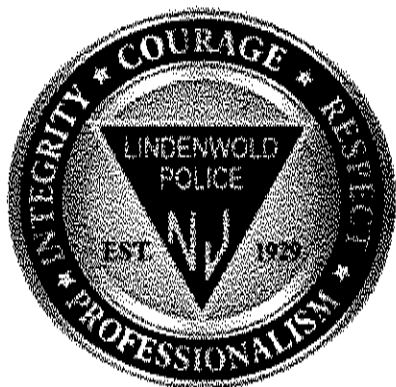

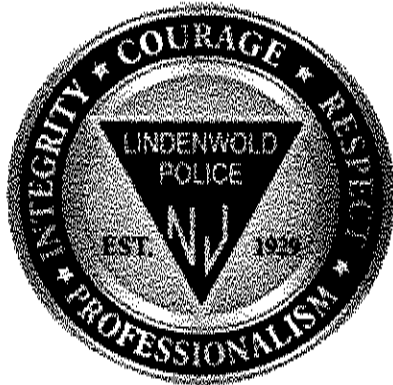

Good Morning,

I would like to acknowledge Chief McCarthy, Captain Cavallaro, Councilmember DiDomenico, and Borough Administrator Dawn Thompson for meeting with me yesterday to discuss how to "Bridge the Gap" to distressed neighborhoods with community policing strategies.

I would like to thank Chief McCarthy, in particular, for keeping the dialogue open, committing to the evolution of the community policing philosophy and to making positive interactions with law enforcement more accessible to citizens, in addition to ongoing efforts like "Cone with a Cop", Police trading card program, Basketball camp, and the popular "Hooked on Fishing Event".

I've included below, a summary of notes and takeaways from the meeting.

Chief McCarthy Goals:

Coordinate rides for kids for basketball camp and junior police academy who wants to attend, but cannot due to logistics limitations.

Reiterate officer empowered initiation for trading card program.

Increased foot patrol vs vehicle patrol for VTCCA to enable trading card engagement.

Sarah Vellner Goals:

Increase community engagement with LPD by continuing to promote LPD events and initiatives, especially within VTCCA

Enable and empower neighbors to reach out to law enforcement and see them as partners.

Encourage use of mental health crisis resources where appropriate.

Provide strategies and community partnerships for LPD consideration.

Stretch goals:

LPD endorsed, Community driven block party

LPD encouragement to VTCCA to provide safe areas for kids to play

LPD outreach in distressed neighborhoods(pop-up block party, bike safety/repair workshop, joining The Greens and Pine Hill PD for Resident Appreciation Day, Good Citizens program, etc.)

Cross-Complex Basketball Tournament

Your attention to this matter and willingness to engage in finding ways to meet and reach citizens of Lindenwold where they live and play is admirable and greatly appreciated.

I will follow up privately with Chief McCarthy to provide further details on potential community partnerships and strategies for LPD.

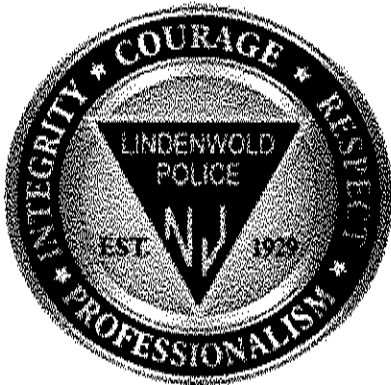

Subject: Internal affairs complaint -

Good morning,

This is a complaint against Lindenwold Police Department executives, Chief McCarthy, Captain Cavallaro, Lt. Matalski, Sgt Errico and Prom La Fontaine for defamation and harassment of Village of Timber Creek residents.

I would also like to file a complaint against Chief McCarthy, Captain Cavallaro, Lt Matalski and County Prosecutor Detective Smith for refusing to accept and investigate my previous complaint.

1) Defamation and harassment from Lindenwold PD executives, Captain Cavallaro and Lt Matalski, Sgt Errico and Prom La Fontaine. LPD executives forwarded hearsay from Village of Timber Creek management accusing Village of Timber Creek residents of harassment and stalking. These accusations were patently untrue. LPD did not investigate to confirm the complaints of harassment and instead forwarded the hearsay as fact to other LPD executives with a personalized warning about residents.

2) When I met with Lt Matalski in April 2021 to file an internal affairs complaint in regard to a March 12 incident in Village of Timber Creek, and to beg, on behalf of our community, that LPD stop accepting misinformation from management to target and criminalize our residents, stop staring down our kids in their 2-3 patrols a day through the neighborhood, and instead spend some time interacting with our residents to help begin to rebuild the trust between community and law enforcement. Lt Matalski spent the entire conversation making passive aggressive insinuations about connections to other residents in the community LPD was targeting on the direction of Timber Creek management, rather than focusing on the content of my complaint. As a community activist, I have responsibility to connect with community members from all walks of life to ensure I am representing the interests of the community holistically. Lt. Matalski's commentary served no purpose other than to cause me distress as he would not explain his comments further. I have no doubt that Lt Matalski's attitude and response were influenced by the defamation or character shared as fact by Capatin Cavallaro.

No internal affairs complaint was recorded from that meeting.

3) When I met again with LPD, Police Chief McCarthy, Captain Cavallaro, and Lindenwold Borough officials, to advocate for a review of community policing practices and offer support in the form of low cost or not cost strategies, I was met with hostility and insults. Most importantly, when asked about the March 12 incident, Chief McCarthy stated that no internal affairs complaints had been filed. I found that odd knowing that the family involved in the incident filed a lawsuit and I, personally, filed an internal affairs complaint.

4) Armed with the information from Chief McCarthy that the investigation on the case involving the March 12 incident was closed and there was no pending internal affairs investigation, I filed a records request for the police records for the March 12 incident in Village of Timber Creek and received a response from police records that the investigation was still pending. Confused, I went to Lindenwold Police Station to ask Chief McCarthy for an update status on the case. Chief refused to come out from behind the glass, or answer a question about the case. He kept stating that a letter would be mailed to me and then walked away. I still don't know why my complaint from April was not processed. Or why Chief McCarthy would claim there were no internal affairs complaints while there was a pending internal affairs investigation.

All told it took over 7 months to gain access to these public records. This is counter to the NJ regulations governing public access to records.

5) In September, I once again attempted to file an internal affairs complaint with LPD regarding the obstruction of records and the failure to document IA complaints, whether substantiated or unfounded. To date, I have not received any follow up.

6) In October, I received copies of some of the communications about Timber Creek residents, myself included, being sent around Lindenwold Police Department. Suddenly, the passive aggressive comments from Lt. Matalski made sense. Certain residents being targeted, followed and detained on Timber Creek property by LPD made sense.

7) For months Timber Creek management used LPD to deny residents civil rights, intimidate residents into silence about these violations of our rights, and criminalize residents by informing LPD that residents who ask for basic services and rights to be honored are harrassing and stalking management. I met with LPD multiple times in an attempt to bring perspective to the situation and help LPD bridge the gap with residents to build trust after our community was traumatized by LPD and their aggressive and intimidating patrolling and targeting of our residents.

8) Whenever Timber Creek management didnt want to honor residents rights, they would threaten to call the police and claim they resident was harrassing them. On many occasions they did call LPD and assert harrassment. This is still the policy of Timber Cream management to this day, and our action group of residents is working with the NJ DCA to address the issues with management. However, LPD responds to residents by stating, accurately, they they cannot get involved in a civil dispute.

If this is LPD policy, then why are they keeping tabs on our civil community organizing newsletters?

9) On or about October 26, I reached out to the County Prosecutor's office and spoke with Detective Smith. I expressed that I needed to make an IA complaint, but that I was not comfortable making the complaints directly to thr LPD agency given their history of failure to document past complaints. Detective Smith took down my details and informed me that, even though I called the County Prosecutor, LPD would be responsible for accepting and processing the complaint. I asked how that was going to work with LPD officials, including the internal affairs supervisor, being the subject of my complaint.

10) I forwarded screen shots of the emails and further information via email to Detective Smith who forwarded that information to LPD.

11) Captain Cavallaro declined to accept or investigate any complaint against himself or other LPD executives.

Please refer to my previous communications with Captain Cavallaro and Detective Smith for the screen shots I mentioned. By no means are the LPD communications provided the only ones regarding myself and other Timber Creek residents. The fact that I am referred to as "you know who" demonstrates that communications regarding my person preceeded the provided records.

I am happy to provide further details. This ordeal has been going on for 2-3 years and came to a head this spring.

We need law enforcement that sees our residents as humans, not nuisances. We need law enforcement that has the empathy and the vision to understand the deep wounds between the marginalized communities and law enforcement. We need law enforcement that understands how those communities are doubly marginalized by the lack of law enforcement they can reliably reach out to without the wrong household of kids ending up cuffed and on the ground.

We need law enforcement that listens the community and welcomes critical feedback, not law enforcement leadership and oversight the fixes complaint records by never taking the complaints.

Captain Cavallaro,

Details were provided to you from Detective Smith and from me, personally.

I am happy to meet and provide further details to the County Prosecutor's office; however, based on the information you provided from the AG, there is not a minimum detail of information necessary to accept and investigate a complaint.

I'll recommend that you refer to your own resource, in particular sections 5 and 6 on Accepting and investigating reports.

Beginning with this statement:

5.0.1 Every law enforcement agency shall establish a policy providing that any complaint from a member of the public is readily accepted and fully and promptly investigated. Allegations of officer misconduct or complaints of inappropriate behavior can alert the law enforcement executive to problems that require disciplinary action or identify the need for remedial training. In addition, executives must also recognize that complaints from the public provide them with an invaluable source of feedback. Such complaints, whether substantiated or not, increase the executive's awareness of both actual or potential problems and the community's perceptions and attitudes about police practices and procedures. The executive should use complaints from the public as one means of determining whether the agency is falling short of its intended goals.

Further, I will refer Detective Smith to this section:

5.1.10 If a person comes to a particular law enforcement agency to make a complaint about another agency . . . The complainant should also be advised that if they have fear or concerns about making the complaint directly to the agency, they may instead file a complaint with the County Prosecutor or the Attorney General's Office.

This is why I contacted the County Prosecutor's Office directly and stated that I had concerns about making a complaint directly to Lindenwold PD.

My complaint should never have been referred back to LPD, it should have been accepted and investigated with the County Prosecutor's office.

I will be following up with both of your supervisor's and reaching out to the AG's office.

I'll recommend to you to provide details for every instance in which you feel is a violation of NJ law or department policies. Provide details for each incident to assist with the investigation. The detailed complaints will be assigned to the appropriate person for further investigation.

From the limited information I possess at this point, I don't see any violation of law or policy on the part of any Lindenwold Officer. Your best recourse may be through civil court to get the relief you seek.

I would like to file an internal affairs complaint against Cpt Cavallaro, Lt Matalski, Sgt Errico, and Ptlm LaFontaine for harassment and defamation of character of myself and Village of Timber Creek Residents. The claims of harassment made by management are false, but were shared throughout LPD as fact, with a personal warning, issued by yourself.

When the hearsay from Village of Timber Creek management was sent to LPD, it could and should have been investigated before being shared across the department as fact.

Further, what is the purpose of keeping tabs on my community organizing with the Village or Timber Creek unit owners?

If LPD does not get involved in civil disputes, then shouldn't that approach stand for both management and residents?

Lindenwold PD worked with Village of Timber Creek management to harass and intimidate targeted residents. This information was shared with LPD, Lt Matalski, and instead of taking the information with the same weight that LPD received the misinformation from management, Lt Matalski spent his time making thinly veiled accusations about my association with David Melton. I didn't understand what he was talking about at the time.

In light of these emails, I now understand the LPD response to Lindenwold residents.

Shame that LPD couldn't take the time to do their due diligence and investigate managements claims before sharing them as fact.

I will look further into body cam footage records provided in response to my records request.

Finally, is there a limit to the number of IA complaints per case?

Ms. Vellner, I have been in contact with the Camden County Prosecutor's Office Special Prosecutions Unit regarding your phone conversation with a Detective on or about 10/26/2021. A summary of your conversation was provided to me including screen shots of e-mail communications in which you provided. I will attempt to address your complaints via e-mail so as to limit any misunderstanding.

Regarding your concern of the police investigation at the Village of Timber Creek on or about 03/12/2021: The conduct of the officers was thoroughly investigated through an Internal Affairs investigation. The incident was reviewed by the Camden County Prosecutor's Office (Special Prosecutions Unit) and the Lindenwold Police Department Internal Affairs Unit regarding any criminal conduct on the officers' behalf and/or violations of Lindenwold Police Department Policies and Procedures. A letter was mailed to you on or about 10/14/2021, which provided a result of the investigation.

- If you have further information that you would like to provide regarding this investigation, please e-mail me a statement of any actions you witnessed and further investigation may be completed if necessary.

Regarding your complaint that you only received one Body Worn Camera footage through an OPRA request: I viewed your Facebook post regarding this issue. Using link #2 from your post, I was able to download and view 10 separate Body Worn Camera recordings. Please know that due to the size of the file, the download does take some time to complete. If you are still having issues with this download I'd recommend that you obtain technical assistance through a computer professional. Please know that this link will expire in three days from your receipt. Upon further review it appears that there have been approximately 50 downloads attempted on this item that you posted on Facebook.

Regarding your concerns about the scheduling of Lindenwold Borough Council meetings: No member of the Lindenwold Police Department, including the Chief of Police, has any input or decision-making involvement on the scheduling or cancellation of any meetings conducted by the governing body of the borough. The Chief's attendance at these meetings is voluntary and he will attend, when available, as a courtesy to the Mayor and Council to address police matters when appropriate. At times, there are matters discussed at this meeting in which the Chief cannot respond, as the timing would be inappropriate or he is restricted from doing so by law or policy. In other cases, the Chief will respond if able to provide instant feedback where appropriate. Lindenwold Police Department does not have any policy or procedure that addresses the Chief's attendance at public events.

- If you have items in which you would like a response from the Chief, please send those items to the Chief for consideration. He will respond to you if appropriate to do so. Any response will be made at his discretion or if required by law or court order.

Regarding your concerns of the content of the e-mail communications you've received and/or provided: No member of the Lindenwold Police Department has initiated any criminal investigation against you on the basis of e-mail communications any officer has received. I'd recommend that you obtain any and all police reports of incidents where you are involved to see what reports are on file. Your relationship & interaction with the management of the Village of Timber Creek has not required any police response or investigation as of this date.

Should you have any specific complaints you would like to file against any Lindenwold Police Officer for a violation of law or department policy & procedure please e-mail me the details so that an Internal Affairs complaint can be initiated.
