The Carteret Police Department is in receipt of your request for records pursuant to the Open Public Records Act (NJSA 47:1A-1) dated, February 23, 2021 which was forwarded from the Borough Of Carteret Clerks Office. The Carteret Police Department Official Records Custodian, Captain Jeffrey VanWoeart received your OPRA request on February 25, 2021. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request is March 3, 2021. This response is being provided on the sixth (6th) business since your request was submitted.

The following specific records have been requested:

I would like a copy of all police reports for 27 Atlantic St in Carteret NJ from January 1, 1994 through February 19, 2016

I would like a copy of all police reports Generated by Daniel Reiman / Judith Valdez in them from January 1, 2000 through February 19, 2021

I would like a copy of all police body camera footage from 319 Carteret Ave Carteret Nj from January 1, 2016 through February 19, 2020)

Records responsive to this request:

*I would like a copy of all police reports for 27 Atlantic St in Carteret NJ from January 1, 1994 through February 19, 2016

Investigation reports have been located . Investigation reports are Criminal Investigatory Records. Criminal Investigatory Records are exempt from release under OPRA. Pursuant to NJSA 47:1A-1.1, criminal investigator records are "records which are not required by law to be made, maintained or kept on file that are held by a law enforcement agency which pertain to any criminal investigation or related civil enforcement proceeding." Therefore your request is denied.

Medical Reports have been located. **N.J.S.A 47:1A-1 Privacy Interest** – a public agency has a responsibility and an obligation to safeguard from public access a citizens personal information with which it has been entrusted when disclosure thereof would violate the citizens reasonable expectation of privacy.
