Good afternoon Jim,

It was truly my pleasure meeting with you today. Thank you for taking the time to stop at our police station and listen to our woes. Nonetheless, please find attached the complaint lodged by the Borough of South River with the Superior Court. There is additional information I would like to provide with you to aid in your investigation:

- At the direction of [REDACTED] the South River EMS (paid) has extremely recently (within a few days) obtained the services of a PR firm. The initial expense is \$10,000.00 (first month) with each subsequent month being \$5000.00. Through the grapevine I understood this **\$65,000.00** annual contract was signed by [REDACTED] (First [REDACTED] President, Vol. Board of Directors).

I am not sure of the mechanics behind how they are organized because since you left, I learned there was yet another auxiliary organization involved. It appears if these relationships are very incestuous, lending to the unsavory business practices. I understand the hiring of the PR firm is to publicly combat the towns direction/efforts.

- On the South River Rescue Squad Facebook page, [REDACTED] publicly announced the squad had purchased new scheduling software. (This was a few months back) Nonetheless, I am sure you will be able to order the schedule from them to determine if someone (and if so who) was scheduled "on-duty" during the turnovers. It has been our experience members have been at the building "hanging out" smoking outside etc. When a call was toned out, these people entered the building, garage doors closed, and there was no response requiring police dispatch to seek mutual aid. OR members of the South River Rescue Squad (Vol.) were signed in "on-duty" yet the building was unoccupied.
- Funds from South River EMS (paid) were used at the direction of [REDACTED] to furnish the basement of the squad building with new flooring and a flat screen TV with surround sound. Because the basement is considered an area exclusive to South River Rescue Squad (vol.), employees of the South River EMS (paid) are prohibited from entry.

- Although not zoned or permitted by the Borough; volunteer members are sleeping at the squad building.
- Patrick Geraldo has installed a video security system inside the building and monitors the activity of the South River EMS (paid) squad from his cell phone.
- [REDACTED] is an EMT (confirmed).
- [REDACTED] is employed by the North Brunswick EMS. He has programmed their frequency (NB EMS) into several portable radios purchased by the Borough of South River.

I have spoken with our Chief of Police regarding our meeting and your investigation. He has confirmed you have the full cooperation of the Borough, Mayor and Council, Public Safety Committee and our police department. You are welcome to carry-on your investigation how you see fit and will be provided with whatever documentation we can provide. The Chief also advised, the criminal investigation was somewhat incomplete/superficial/cursory in nature due to the dynamics involved, specifically had it been more detailed it would've exposed those who have stepped forward. At the time we felt it would be best to tread lightly and conduct a more thorough investigation once more was exposed. He felt that you might find something more during your investigation that we will certainly follow-up on should the need arise.

We are looking forward to working with you and I will presume we will be speaking soon. For your convenience I can always be reached via cell phone at 732-853-4514. I would appreciate if you could provide me with your cell phone number as well as I forgot to ask you earlier in the day.

Hi Jim,

There very well may be a criminal element you will potentially will uncover during the course of your investigation. At this juncture, we would not be surprised and felt this was a possible discovery of the collaborative investigation. We are reliant on your knowledge of how the funds can be obtained (i.e. state training, Medicare, etc.) disseminated and used. There are indeed various criminal statutes that would cover forms of fraud, misappropriation and theft. This is the reason Chief Tinitigan invited Det. Lt. Maclosky to our last meeting.

If you do discover something you feel is inappropriate, amiss or you know is a violation, please let me know and I will inform the Chief accordingly. Misappropriation of funds, theft, fraud et. al. would also constitute Official Misconduct and would involve alerting the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office. What that said; we have no issues whatsoever launching a criminal investigation in the event you make a discovery.

Hi Jim,

Thanks for making time for us today and meeting with the attorneys. And, as you presumed, it gets thicker. I felt you might be able to use the following information for your investigation.

- ? [REDACTED] reported since the South River EMS was established it has been common knowledge that volunteers from the South River Rescue Squad should use NJ DOH certified trucks so that the patient can be billed. This has occurred for many years. When it was brought to [REDACTED] attention this is done so that funds can be generated and filtered back to the SRRS, [REDACTED] stated if you put it that way it doesn't seem right. [REDACTED] added [REDACTED] hasn't personally utilized the SRRS truck for over year.
- ? [REDACTED] also stated on at least two occasions in 2018 SRRS officers/volunteers would not leave the building during an officer's meeting to handle a call. On one occasion [REDACTED] was present and personally witnessed the failure to respond. [REDACTED] referred to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] as those present at the meeting who would not respond.

Once again thanks for your help. If you require anything please give me a shout. Otherwise good luck next week and let me know how you make out.
