Administrator DeCroce,

As discussed over the weekend, I was notified there was a call for service involving Dover Councilperson / Police Committee Chair Sergio Rodriguez and Dover Police Officer Christopher Caraig on January 5th 2024. The call for service involved a complaint of a possible homeless individual with an open alcoholic beverage container, which is a local ordinance violation. This call response was recorded via Axon Body Worn Camera. A link to this video was forwarded to you as the Appropriate Authority / Business Administrator for review as appropriate, via a separate email.

We were further advised Dover Councilperson Rodriguez then posted a video message on social media (Facebook) after the call for service, criticizing the town employees response.

If there are any concerns regarding police officers actions or response, the Police Dept. has mechanisms in place to thoroughly review these complaints ie. via the Internal Affairs process, and will take appropriate action. If there are any potential conflicts, the Morris County Prosecutor's Office can conduct thorough and objective investigations into any complaints as well.

During the encounter, it appears Councilperson Rodriguez wanted the accused arrested for having an open container. He further advised he planned to physically detain other individuals with open containers in the future until police arrived.

That action would be improper and likely unlawful depending on the circumstances.

I look forward to discussing it further.

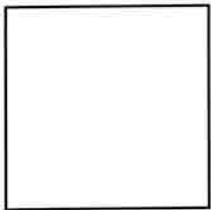

Subject: Officer Caraig's encounter with Sergio Rodriguez

Mrs. Decroce,

I reviewed the Body Worn Camera footage regarding Officer Caraig's encounter with Sergio Rodriguez which took place on January 5, 2024 at approximately 8:55 P.M.

While reviewing the footage, Officer Caraig's report, and the Morris County Dispatcher's notes, I learned that Officer Caraig responded to the intersection of Sussex and Blackwell Street after Mr. Rodriguez called dispatch to report an intoxicated male with an open container.

While speaking with Mr. Rodriguez, Officer Caraig was very professional and answered several questions that were asked. Officer Caraig explained that public intoxication and possessing an open alcohol container are not crimes and the police can't arrest a citizen for these violations. He advised Mr. Rodriguez that if the police observed an intoxicated male or a subject with an open alcohol container, the following would occur:

The subject would be issued a summons.
The subject would be ordered to dispose of their beverage.
The subject would have a court date.

He also advised Mr. Rodriguez that depending on the subject's level of intoxication, the subject could be transported to the hospital for evaluation and treatment.

It appeared Mr. Rodriguez was not satisfied with this response and repeatedly asked Officer Caraig for clarification.

At one point during the interaction, Mr. Rodriguez eluded that he had aspirations of removing the local homeless/alcohol citizens from this town. He also stated, "Ok, Next time I'll grab'em by the shoulder and wait until you guys come."

I truly believe Mr. Rodriguez, although his intentions are pure, could place himself in a dangerous situation if he were to attempt to hold a homeless and/or intoxicated male against their will. Those actions could also open up the Town of Dover to civil liability.

As previously discussed, I believe a sit down with town officials regarding this matter or any matter in particular would be beneficial as we can educate them on the responsibilities and actions of the police department.

Administrator DeCroce,

I am forwarding you a concern involving Councilperson Rodriguez to bring the matter to your attention again.

For safety reasons, I would recommend advising Councilperson Rodriguez as well as other members of the governing body, not to personally confront individuals they believe are committing an offense or crime. It is unknown whether individuals being approached may attempt to assault the person(s) confronting them and accusing them of an offense or crime. Rather, I would recommend they notify the local police department and allow trained personnel to address each call for service appropriately. Councilpersons do not have law enforcement powers or the lawful authority to detain anyone.

As you are aware, on;

1/5/2024 at 1738 hours - Councilperson Rodriguez reported homeless individuals possibly drinking and standing along East Blackwell Street.

He advised he told a group of individuals they are not to stand in front of the businesses anymore and at that point a man started screaming at him. He further advised he planned to be checking the streets every hour. Officer Krasnick and Officer Matos spoke with Mr. Rodriguez and documented that they advised him not to confront or approach individuals by himself for his own safety.

By Councilperson Rodriguez confronting these individuals and potentially agitating them, it can also make it more difficult for responding officers to be able to handle the situation.

He was advised to call the police department if he observed any violations (Dover case #: 2024-00428).

1/5/2024 at 20:55 hours - Councilperson Rodriguez called the Dover Police Department and during the encounter with Officer Carraig, he advised he wanted the accused arrested for having an open container (non-arrestable offense).

During the encounter, when it appears Mr. Rodriguez was not receiving the information he anticipated, he told the police officer he was calling Mayor Dodd and wanted the police officer to tell the Mayor he couldn't arrest for public intoxication. Later in the conversation, Mr. Rodriguez further advised he planned to physically detain other individuals with open containers in the future until police arrived. After being advised accordingly, he posted a video on social media specifically naming the town employee involved, (Officer Caraig) saying he had a dismissive attitude and criticized his handling of the call for service publicly. (Dover case #: 2024- 00433) This may be a violation of the Town of Dover Employee Handbook.

1/8/2024 at 18:23 hours - Councilperson Rodriguez called the Dover Police Department reporting suspicious males at the Meridia Transit Plaza stating they were about to smoke marijuana. Councilperson Rodriguez then posted a video on social media showing him confronting multiple individuals and criticized the police officers response. I then sent an email to you advising to inform Mr. Rodriguez to refrain from confronting others for his own safety and instead to call the police. (Dover case #: 2024-00693)

1/11/2024 - 10am - the Community Affairs Unit of the Dover Police Department scheduled to meet with Councilperson Rodriguez to help educate him and conduct a walk-along to help identify his concerns. I received an email from Evelyn Santiago canceling this meeting which stated; Due to conflict in scheduling, Councilman Rodriguez is unable to attend today's meeting at 10am. I sent a reply stating "please advise if he'd like to reschedule" but as of this email I have not heard back yet.

1/13/2024 at 19:34 hours - Councilperson Rodriguez called the Dover Police Department reporting parking violations. Police Officer Cordes & Caraig responded and addressed the call for service, issuing appropriate summonses (2024-01113).

1/13/2024 at 22:21 hours - Councilperson Rodriguez called the Dover Police Department reporting individuals in the Meridia courtyard with open containers. It appears he confronted two individuals prior to police officers arriving. Upon the police officers arrival, Officers Cordes and Martinez addressed the violation accordingly utilizing discretion. (Dover case # 2024-01132)

1/15/2024 at 1323 hours - Councilperson Rodriguez called the Dover Police Department reporting four (4) individuals in Municipal Parking Lot C carrying open containers of alcohol. (see forwarded email for additional information).

We appreciate Councilperson Rodriguez's concern for the community and look forward to working with him. However, I want to be clear that it is strongly recommended he not confront individuals, especially when outnumbered, for his own safety.

It is recommended he notify the local police department and allow trained personnel to address each call for service appropriately based on the totality of the circumstances.

I look forward to discussing further as appropriate.

Chief Delaney,

On January 15, 2024, at approximately 1323 hours, Councilman Sergio Rodriguez reported that there were four (4) individuals in Municipal Parking Lot C carrying open containers of alcohol. Upon my arrival, Officer Matos was already on-scene and speaking with the four males in the area of the parking meter. I also observed Councilman Rodriguez who was standing on the sidewalk and recording the officer's interaction with the group. As I made my way to the parking lot, I observed that Councilman Rodriguez had moved from the sidewalk and was now within the parking lot and standing near Officer Matos.

Councilman Rodriguez explained to me that his "constituents," who reside at 1 Thompson Avenue, advised him of the violation and that he (Councilman Rodriguez) responded, confronted the individuals and called the police. Councilman Rodriguez alleged that the group was drinking and accused one of the individuals of littering. Councilman Rodriguez stated that he "hoped" that the group would get a summons and added that he did not know how it worked, referring to the process of issuing a summons. I reminded Councilman Rodriguez that he was already explained the process of when officers can issue a summons and advised him that Officer Matos would be investigating.

As Officer Matos was conducting his investigation, Councilman Rodriguez interrupted at times by posing questions that were clearly antagonizing and accusatory. During that time, it was brought to my attention that there was a blue vehicle parked on the east side of Orchard Street, north of the Crescent Field entrance, which is a no-parking zone and posted with No Parking Here to Corner. I asked Councilman Rodriguez regarding the vehicle and that it was illegally parked after which he indicated that it was his friend's vehicle but that he came with him.

It should be noted that Councilman Rodriguez has made numerous complaints regarding illegally parked vehicles and parking violations throughout Ward #2. During the above incident, it was made evident that Councilman Rodriguez was showing hypocritical behavior by failing to relocate the vehicle that he arrived in.

It's clear that Councilman Rodriguez is receiving complaints from his "constituents" and overstepping his authority by taking it upon himself to respond to the scene and confront the alleged actors in what appears to be an aggressive and harassing manner. This can be problematic as the group could become violent and possibly injure Councilman Rodriguez. Moreover, people don't like the fact that he tends to record the interaction and likes to ask accusatory questions. Instead of de-escalating, Councilman Rodriguez seems to be escalating the situation.

In situations where people are allegedly drinking in public, as indicated above, it would be better that Councilman Rodriguez not respond to the scene or at the very least not approach anyone and just notify the police so that we can observe the violations and issue summonses accordingly.

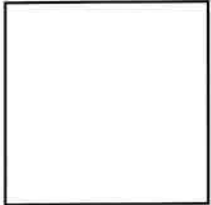
