(Hereinafter referred to as ("**CONTRACTOR**"))

W I T N E S S E T H :

WHEREAS, the **BOROUGH** has heretofore duly sought bids for goods and services contracted for herein; and

WHEREAS, the **CONTRACTOR** has filed with the **BOROUGH** its bid in writing in response to said advertisement; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2019, the **BOROUGH** duly received bids for a three (3), four (4) and five (5) year contract for the "Collection of Solid Waste, Bulk Waste and Recyclable Materials"; and

WHEREAS, the **BOROUGH** has accepted the **CONTRACTOR'S** quote as the lowest conforming bid submitted, for the five (5) year and on June 20, 2019, by Resolution No. 209

awarded the Contract to the **CONTRACTOR** herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms, conditions, and stipulations hereinafter set forth, it is mutually agreed by and between the parties as follows:

The **CONTRACTOR** shall furnish all labor, equipment and materials necessary for the performance of this Contract. In consideration for such labor, equipment and materials the **BOROUGH** agrees to pay for the collection of Solid Waste, Bulk Waste and Recyclable Materials from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2024 as follows:

1. On the following:

- Its ***base bid***, representing 104 collections for solid waste per year for residential properties based on cost schedule below:

July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2022: \$207,840.00

July 1, 2022- June 30, 2024: \$218,232.00

- Its ***sum of monthly cost for potential future solid waste*** upon commencement authorization by the Borough based on cost schedule below:

July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2024: \$3,247.00

- Its ***base bid***, representing 52 collections for recyclables per year for residential properties based on cost schedule below:

July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2022: \$51,960.00

July 1, 2022- June 30, 2024: \$54,550.00

- Its ***sum of monthly cost for potential future recyclable collection*** upon commencement authorization by the Borough based on cost schedule below:

July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2024: \$3,247.00

- Its ***base bid*** of \$168.00 per pull for bulk waste in regards to a 30-yard container based on the schedule below:

July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2024; and

- Its *base bid* of \$0 per pull for collection of solid waste and recyclables for Borough 4 and 5 yard containers;
2. The work pursuant to the Contract shall be performed and all payments made in accordance with the terms hereof set forth in the Contractor's Bid dated June 11, 2019, which is incorporated herein by reference.
 3. The **CONTRACTOR** agrees to make payment of all proper charges for labor or materials required in the performance of the Specifications aforesaid and hereby agrees to indemnify and save harmless the **BOROUGH**, its officers, agents and servants against and from all suits and costs of every kind and description and from all damages to which the **BOROUGH**, or any of its officers, agents or servants may be put, by reason of injury to the person or property of others, resulting from carelessness in the performance of said Contract or through the negligence of the **CONTRACTOR** or through any improper or defective machinery, implements, materials, or appliances used or supplied by the **CONTRACTOR** in the execution of this Contract, or through any act or omission on the part of the **CONTRACTOR**, its agents or servants.
 4. The **CONTRACTOR** expressly represents and warrants that he has complied with, or will comply with all the requirements concerning insurance and contractual indemnification on or before the execution of the within Contract and that, simultaneously herewith, **CONTRACTOR** shall provide the **BOROUGH** with the required Performance Bond, in accordance with the specifications. This Contract is specifically contingent upon the **CONTRACTOR** providing to the Borough a

This Contract is specifically contingent upon the **CONTRACTOR** providing to the Borough a proper Certification of Insurance in a form satisfactory to the Borough's Risk Manager.

5. This Contract shall be binding on the **BOROUGH**, its successors or assigns and upon the **CONTRACTOR**, its successors or assigns (except that this provision shall not create any right in the **CONTRACTOR** to assign this Contract).

6. Modification or waiver of any of the provisions of this Contract shall be effective only if made in writing and executed with the same formality as this Contract. The failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of any of the provisions of this Contract shall not be construed as a waiver of any subsequent default or the same or similar nature.

7. During the performance of this Contract, the **CONTRACTOR** agrees to comply with all requirements as set forth in **EXHIBIT A** attached hereto and incorporated herein.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the **BOROUGH** has caused this instrument to be signed by its Mayor, attested to by its Borough Clerk and its Municipal Seal to be hereunto affixed and the **CONTRACTOR** has likewise signed and sealed the Contract on the day and year first above written.

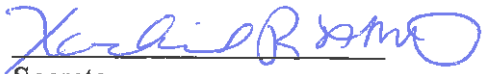

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTRACTORS
(Collection of Solid Waste, Bulk Waste and Recyclable Materials)

The **CONTRACTOR** shall maintain during the life of the contract, insurance policies of the type and with the minimum limits indicated below and in a form satisfactory to the municipality. The Contractor shall provide a copy of the policies and/or certificates of insurance prior to commencement of work.

A) Policy and Limit Guidelines as follows:

- 1) Workers Compensation insurance in accordance with laws of the State of New Jersey and other states where work is being performed. The Contractor shall also have and maintain Employers Liability Insurance as well and USL&H and Jones Act coverage where applicable.
- 2) Commercial General Liability insurance coverage written on an occurrence basis, and must not be altered by any endorsements limiting coverage. Limits of liability **shall not be less than** the following:

\$2,000,000	General Aggregate per location/per job
\$2,000,000	Products/Completed Operations
\$1,000,000	Personal Injury and Advertising Injury Limit
\$1,000,000	Each Occurrence Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage

The Coverage shall include:

- a) Premises/Operations
- b) Elevators
- c) Independent Contractors
- d) Contractual liability covering assumed under the indemnification provision contained in this Agreement and deleting any third-party beneficiary exclusion.
- e) Broad form property damage liability including completed operations.
- f) Coverage for liability arising from explosion, collapse and underground damage, if blasting or excavation is to be done.
- g) Personal injury coverage, including coverage for liability arising from

false arrest, malicious prosecution, willful detention, libel, slander, defamation of character, invasion of privacy and wrongful egress or entry.

- h) Products and completed operations for a period of two (2) years from substantial completion.
 - i) Limited Pollution Cleanup at a limit of \$100,000 for construction projects over \$500,000.
- 3) Comprehensive Automobile Liability insurance covering the use of all owned, hired or leased automobiles with limits of liability not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage. Coverage should include uninsured and underinsured motorist at limits no less than the minimum statutory limits.
 - 4) Umbrella Liability insurance policy written on an occurrence basis with a minimum combined single limit of “see below” as “Follow Form” excess of the Contractors Employer’s Liability, Commercial General Liability and Comprehensive Automobile Liability insurance policies required herein. Coverage to include on site limited pollution.

B) Additional Requirements as follows:

- 1. Certified copies of all insurance policies provided above or certificates thereof satisfactory to the Borough of Little Ferry shall be furnished forthwith. Each such policy or certificate shall contain a provision that it is not subject to change, cancellation or non-renewal unless 30 days prior written notice via certified mail/return receipt shall have been given to the Borough of Little Ferry by the Contractor’s Insurer. These must be received prior to commencement of work.
- 2. The Contractor agrees that it will make payment of all proper charges for labor or materials and hereby agrees to release, defend, indemnify and save harmless the Borough of Little Ferry, including its officials, officers, agents and employees from and against any loss, damage, liability, suits, judgment or demand including attorney fees and defense costs which arise out of injuries to persons or property,

including accidental death, or damage to property caused by Contractor, its agents, subcontractors or any other person or persons arising out of or in connection with the work, or by reason of the operation under this agreement.

3. All insurance purchased and maintained by the Contractor shall designate the Borough of Little Ferry, their officers, officials, agents, employees, consultants as additional insured.
4. Except as modified by the Borough of Little Ferry in writing, the insurance requirements herein shall also apply to Subcontractors and to the Sub-Subcontractors and the Contractor will be responsible for supervision of the filing of certified copies of the insurance policies and/or insurance certificates prior to any Subcontractor commencing work on the project.
5. The Borough of Little Ferry shall maintain Property insurance upon the entire work at the site. The insurance shall insure against the perils provided by the Bergen JIF and its excess insurer.
6. A waiver of subrogation applies to all policies in favor of the Borough of Little Ferry. The contractor waives all rights against the Borough of Little Ferry. The Borough of Little Ferry shall require the architect, separate contractors, sub-contractors, and sub-contractors by appropriate agreements, written where legally required for validity, similar waivers, each in favor of the Borough of Little Ferry.
7. All insurance coverage evidenced by the Contractor in accordance with this contract shall be from A.M. Best rated A-X or better Insurance Company licensed to do business in the State of New Jersey.
8. All proof of insurance submitted to the municipality shall clearly set forth all exclusions and deductible clauses. The Borough of Little Ferry will allow certain deductible clauses which are not considered excessive, overly broad, or harmful to the interest of the Borough of Little Ferry. Standard exclusions will be allowed provided they are not inconsistent with the requirements of this subsection allowance of any additional exclusion. This will be at the discretion of the Borough of Little Ferry. Regardless of the allowance of exclusions or deductions by the Borough of Little Ferry, the Contractor shall be responsible for the deductible limit of this policy and all exclusions consistent with the risks he assumes under this contract and imposed by law.

In the event that the Contractor provides evidence of insurance in the form of certificates of insurance, valid for a period of time less than the period during which the Contractor is required by the terms of the contract to maintain insurance, said certificates are acceptable, but the Contractor

shall be obligated to renew its insurance policies as necessary and to provide new certificates of insurance so that the Borough of Little Ferry is continuously in possession of evidence of the Contractor's insurance in accordance with the foregoing provisions.

In the event the Contractor fails or refuses to renew its insurance policy, or the policy is canceled, terminated, or modified so that the insurance does not meet the requirements of this subsection, the Borough of Little Ferry may refuse to make payment of any further moneys due under this contract or refuse to make payment of moneys due or coming due under other contracts between the Contractors insurance for the periods and amounts referred to above. Alternatively, the Borough of Little Ferry may default the Contractor and direct the surety to complete the project. During any period when the required insurance is not in effect, the Borough of Little Ferry may suspend performance of the contract. If the contract is so suspended, additional compensation or extension of contract time is not due on account thereof.

EXHIBIT A

MANDATORY EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY LANGUAGE N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 ET SEQ., N.J.A.C. 17:27

GOODS, PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AND GENERAL SERVICE CONTRACTS

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual, orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Except with respect to affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, the contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that such applicants are recruited and employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without

regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Such action shall include, but not limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

The contractor or subcontractor where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to employ minority and

women workers consistent with the applicable county employment goals established in accordance with **N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2**, or a binding determination of the applicable county employment goals determined by the Division, pursuant to **N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2**.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing its appropriate recruitment agencies including, but not limited to, employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personal testing conforms with the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

In conforming with the applicable employment goals, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

The contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:

Letter of Federal Affirmative Action Plan Approval
Certificate of Employee Information Report
Employee Information Report Form AA302

The contractor and its subcontractor shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Contract Compliance & EEO as may be requested by the Division from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Contract Compliance & EEO for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to **Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C.17:27.**
