The Outside Agencies and Municipalities listed above will remain included in the contract for its entire term. No solid waste will be included that is generated from outside of Camden County. All solid waste generated/originating from the cooperative

group will be directed exclusively to the contracted facility on the initial date of inclusion into the contracted services as identified on sheet PR-14.

- 1.2.2 The above-noted non-participating Municipalities have reserved the right to terminate their solid waste disposal services and re-direct disposal to any facility located within 25 miles of the border of the Municipality. If existing service is to be terminated, notice to the existing vendor must take place a minimum of 90 days prior to the anniversary of each contract. The right is limited to the Municipality(ies) securing pricing that is a reduction of costs over the existing contracted value:

FIRST YEAR (January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019)

SECOND YEAR (January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020)

125,000 tons to 150,000 tons:

1.1 First Year \$ 78.00 (per ton per year)

1.2 Second Year \$ 79.95 (per ton per year)

150,001 tons to 175,000 tons:

1.3 Second Year \$ 77.95 (per ton per year)

Above 175,000 tons:

1.5 \$5.00 additional cost per ton, per year if the Bidder is an out-of-state facility, for bridge tolls that would be incurred by Camden County, the various outside agencies and various Camden County Municipalities. This additional cost consideration is to be applied to 1.1 to 1.6.

2. THIRD YEAR OPTION (January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021)

2.1 125,000 tons to 150,000 tons: \$ 83.15 (per ton per year)

2.2 150,001 tons to 175,000 tons \$ 81.15 (per ton per year)

2.3 Above 175,000 tons \$ 79.15 (per ton per year)

2.4 \$5.00 additional cost per ton, per year if the Bidder is an out-of-state facility, for bridge tolls that would be incurred by Camden County, the various outside agencies and various Camden County Municipalities. This additional cost consideration is to be applied to 2.1, 2.2 & 2.3.

3. FOURTH YEAR OPTION (January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022)

3.1 125,000 tons to 150,000 tons: \$ 84.47 (per ton per year)

3.2 150,001 tons to 175,000 tons \$ 84.47 (per ton per year)

3.3 Above 175,000 tons \$ 82.47 (per ton per year)

3.4 \$5.00 additional cost per ton, per year if the Bidder is an out-of-state facility, for bridge tolls that would be incurred by Camden County, the various outside agencies and various Camden County Municipalities. This additional cost consideration is to be applied to 3.1, 3.2 & 3.3.

4. FIFTH YEAR OPTION (January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023)

4.1 125,000 tons to 150,000 tons: \$ 89.93 (per ton per year)

4.2 150,001 tons to 175,000 tons \$ 87.93 (per ton per year)

4.3 Above 175,000 tons \$ 85.93 (per ton per year)

4.4 \$5.00 additional cost per ton, per year if the Bidder is an out-of-state facility, for bridge tolls that would be incurred by Camden County, the various outside agencies and various Camden County Municipalities. This additional cost consideration is to be applied to 4.1, 4.2 & 4.3.

5. NOTES:

5.1 The Redirect Costs per ton as calculated by the County, (and the additional bridge tolls for out-of-state facilities if applicable) will be added to the Bid price per ton submitted to determine an adjusted Bid, which will be used to evaluate the bids. See "Redirect Costs" section for how these costs will be calculated.

5.2 The determination of the price per ton to be paid by the participating Municipalities will be calculated by the approximate total tons identified in the Scope of Work. The initial participating County entities and Municipalities account for approximately 134,030 tons per year and therefore would be charged at the costs within the 125,000 to 150,000 ton pricing provided. As additional non-participating Municipalities opt into the contract, cost considerations will be adjusted to reflect the new total tonnage calculated in the Scope of Work.
