The City of Lambertville received your Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request on April 19, 2026. The official Records Custodian, Lindsay Hansche received your OPRA request on April 20, 2026. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request was April 29, 2026. This response to your request is being provided to you as soon as was possible.

Copies of ALL invoices for all fire extinguisher, kitchen fire suppression and fire alarm services from 2022 to present

The following records are being provided in their entirety and are responsive to your request:

PDF copies of fire extinguisher service records, organized by year
PDF copies of alarm service invoices, organized by year

These records are being transmitted to you via email as per your request. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5.b., the cost associated with this request is \$00.00.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the City of Lambertville to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
