As mandated in N.J.S.A. 47:1A-I "a public agency has a responsibility and an obligation to safeguard from public access a citizen's personal information with which it has been entrusted when disclosure thereof would violate the citizen's reasonable expectation of privacy." Personal information that has been redacted may include, but is not limited to; unlisted telephone numbers, driver's license numbers, social security numbers, credit card and bank account and juvenile information.

The New Jersey Open Public Records Act (N.J.S.A 47:1A-et seq.) permits a person who believes he or she has been illegally denied access to a public record either to file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC), or file suit in Superior Court to challenge the decision and compel disclosure.
