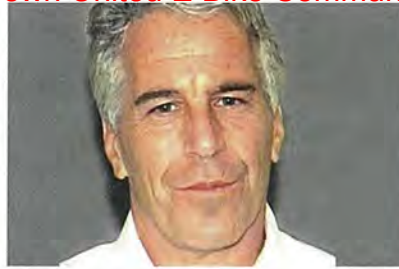

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Bicycle Safety Video

Helmet:

- You should always wear a helmet. In NJ, anyone under 17 must wear a helmet by law. Livingston has extended it to age 18.
- Remember 2-V-1
 - 2 fingers between eyebrows and helmet
 - V shape made by the straps under your ears
 - 1 finger of space between your chin and strap
- Should be snug and sit flat

A bicycle is a vehicle:

- You have to follow the rules of the road just like someone driving a car
- Obey all traffic rules and signs
- Ride on the same side of the road with traffic
- Ride in a straight line, single file

Communicate with drivers:

- Use hand signals
- Make eye contact
- Wear bright clothing so you are easily seen
- You need to have a bell or horn on your bicycle to communicate with others. By law, it must be audible from 100 feet.



Safety while riding:

- Look for things that can make you fall, like potholes, puddles, leaves, etc.
- Be careful of cars exiting driveways
- Don't use your phone while riding

- Don't wear headphones in both ears while riding so you can hear traffic around you
- Don't have any loose clothing that can get caught in the chain
- Be courteous to other riders, drivers and pedestrians
- Stop and look left and right before entering intersections

Riding at night:

- It's best not to ride at night, but if you must, make sure that you can be seen
- Have something reflective on your clothing and your bike. You can buy reflective tape to put on your bike, helmet and shoes.
- You need to have a headlight and a taillight on your bicycle – it's the law
 - Headlight must be a white light, visible from at least 500-600 feet in front.
 - Taillight must be a red light, visible from 500-600 feet behind, plus a red reflector.

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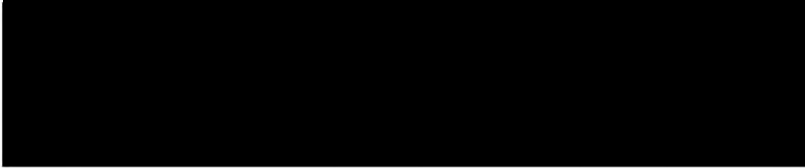
