I responded to 1749 Rt 70 (Chick Fil A) for an initial report of a suspicious vehicle. Dispatch advised receiving a call from an anonymous driver stating a Black Ford Transit Van (██████████) was driving erratically on I295. The caller advised the driver of the van was now parked on the lot of 1749 Rt 70 and was operated by a female driver.

Upon arrival, I located the vehicle on the lot and it appeared to have been parked but still running. The vehicle was observed stopped in between two parking stalls. I approached the driver's side of the vehicle. The driver's window was lowered and the vehicle was operated by a female driver, later identified as Tia Daloisio, who appeared to be asleep behind the wheel. I observed the vehicle to still be in drive and I then opened the driver's door and placed the vehicle into park. I attempted to wake Daloisio with difficulty as she appeared to be in deep sleep as evident by a large amount of saliva drooling from her mouth. Daloisio ultimately awoke and exited the vehicle and indicated she did not wish to speak with me.

Due to the difficulty I had in waking her, I asked her if she ingested any CDS to which she stated she did not but did drink a bottle of wine. I detected an odor of an alcoholic beverage on her breath and while speaking with her, she was slurring her speech and was unable to maintain her balance. While I was questioning her she sat on the ground due to her being unable to maintain her balance. I informed her I wished to conduct field sobriety tests and she stated she did not wish to perform them. I assisted Daloisio into a standing position and placed her under arrest for suspicion of driving while intoxicated. She was handcuffed (adjusted for fit and double locked), searched incident to arrest with negative results and placed in the rear compartment of RPC 2530.

P/O Radetich #480 and P/O Bill #534 arrived on scene to assist. The vehicle was checked for intoxicants yielding one empty bottle of Beatbox Hard Tea in between the driver's and front passenger's seat. A check of the vehicle's registration showed it to belonging to Back to Life Recovery LLC. While on scene, Back to Life Recovery employee Mark Warner arrived and advised the center was tracking the vehicle with its installed GPS. He advised Daloisio was an employee with the detox center and was supposed to be enroute to their facility for a staff meeting. When she failed to show up, they became worried and began tracking the vehicle. Warner confirmed Daloisio had permission to drive the vehicle and was supposed to drive it for work purposes. Warner agreed to sign the Potential Liability Form and the vehicle was turned over to him. Warner advised he would meet with police at PAB to take custody of Daloisio once she was done being processed.

Due to CHPD's Alcotest machine being out of service, Pennsauken PD was notified and they advised CHPD could use their machine. I transported Daloisio to Pennsauken PAB while P/O Radetich and P/O Bill followed to assist. Upon arrival, Daloisio was secured in their processing area. We began the 20 minute observation, during which Daloisio vomited. The 20 minute observation was restarted during which she did not regurgitate and/or introduce anything into her mouth. She was read the Standard Statement for Operators of a Motor Vehicle and ultimately refused to provide breath samples. Daloisio then attempted to lie down and no longer spoke with police. Due to her actions, police did not attempt to speak with her further regarding this incident and as a result she was not informed of her Miranda Rights. P/O Radetich logged the refusal into the alcotest machine. Pennsauken PD was provided a case number and copy of the refusal.

I transported Daloisio back to PAB without incident. Warner responded and was provided a copy of the signed potential liability form. Daloisio was issued numerous motor vehicle summonses, including 39:4-50 and 39:4-50.4A, and was released to Warner without incident. A DUI packet was completed for this incident.
