78. Narrative On Wednesday, January 8, 2025, at approximately 23:20HRS I was traveling East on the Belleville Turnpike in the far left lane. When I passed the intersection with Prospect Avenue, a white Dodge Durango (NJ REG. [REDACTED]) which was traveling West on the Belleville Turnpike, began crossing the double yellow line and almost struck my vehicle. I performed a U-turn and began traveling West on the Belleville Turnpike, one vehicle behind the Durango. I was able to see the vehicle did not have any rear lights on and was crossing the double yellow line again. At that time, I activated my vehicle's (V7) emergency lights and got behind the Durango. He slowed down at the intersection of the Belleville Turnpike and River Road and appeared to stop in between the double yellow line, in the middle of the road. The vehicle then began driving again at a slow rate of speed and went through the red light at the intersection of the Belleville Turnpike and Main Street in Belleville. My audio siren and emergency lights were still on and he again appeared to pull over near Stephens Street, but after pulling to the side of the road, he continued on. I advised dispatch of this, at which point he again pulled to the right of a vehicle which was driving on the road and appeared to stop near Cortland Street. I advised dispatch that we were going approximately 6 mph, at which time he took off at a high rate of speed West across Washington Avenue. Due to his high rate of speed and reckless driving, I did not pursue the vehicle. Belleville PD was notified.

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I continued on to Hornblower Avenue, where I last saw the vehicle, to see if it was still in the area. A citizen in a vehicle near Van Houten Place flagged me down and advised me that a White Dodge Durango had almost just struck his vehicle and was driving erratically.

Paterson PD was contacted and they stated they would be dispatching units to the registered owner, Mr. Rider J. Zambrano-Garcia's residence to gather furthering information. It was later determined that the vehicle had crashed at a later time, in Belleville (Case # 25-002455) and the driver and passenger fled the scene. The passenger, Mr. Jorge Santana-Martinez, was latter apprehended by Belleville PD and made a statement on body worn camera that the registered owner, Mr. Zambrano-Garcia was the driver and he fled because he was scared.

Due to this, complaint warrant #: 0239 W 2025 000004 was issued for 2C:29-2B (Eluding) (A Second Degree Crime) by Court Administrator Marshall. As an absentee defendant, the warrant was activated and entered into NCIC.

78. Narrative On Friday May 3rd, 2025, at 0154 hours, I was stopped at a traffic signal (Ridge Road and Arlington Boulevard) facing east on Arlington Boulevard. As I waited for the traffic signal to turn green, I heard what I recognized as a motorcycle (Street Bike) approaching the intersection from the south. I observed as the traffic signal turned green for Arlington Boulevard traffic. At that time, I also observed a yellow motorcycle (identified as a 2006 Honda registration VIN # go through the intersection traveling north on Ridge Road at a high rate of speed. During this time, I estimated that the motorcycle was traveling at a speed of 48 miles per hour. Ridge Road traffic had a red signal from the traffic light, which I was able to see from my current location. I immediately made a left turn on to Ridge Road (Northbound) and activated my vehicle's (V2) Emergency Lights to initiate a motor vehicle stop. In response, I then observed the motorcycle accelerate to a speed that I estimated at 120 miles per hour. I alerted Dispatcher Hrubes that I was attempting to stop the motorcycle, its current direction of travel, and its speed. At this point, the motorcycle was multiple blocks ahead of me when I observed it cross over the double yellow line and pass a vehicle (which was stopped for a traffic light) on the left at the intersection of Ridge Road and Canterbury Avenue. The motorcycle then went through the intersection, disregarding the traffic signal which indicated red for Ridge Road traffic. The motorcycle continued to accelerate and was well out of my view when I decided to discontinue my attempt to stop the motorcycle and disengaged my vehicle's emergency lights. I reported to Dispatcher Hrubes that the last known location of the motorcycle was north on Ridge Road just before Valley Brook Avenue in Lyndhurst NJ.

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After discontinuing the attempt to stop the motorcycle, Officer Perez indicated to me that he knew the motorcycle that I was attempting to stop. Officer Perez informed me that he was driving south on Ridge Road near the intersection of Ridge Road and Melrose Avenue when he saw the motorcycle driving north on Ridge Road. Officer Perez said that he recognized the motorcycle as the same motorcycle that he instructed to move earlier in the shift as it was improperly parked in front of 23 Ridge Road, North Arlington, NJ. Officer Perez said that he was in the process of turning around in order to make a motor vehicle stop on the motorcycle when it began traveling at a high rate of speed. Officer Perez also indicated to me that Lt. Stec did a registration inquiry of the motorcycle before asking him to move it and discovered that the registration was expired (4/25). I was with Officer Perez and Lt. Stec in front of 1Republik when the owner (Mr. Gavin Zapata) was asked to move the motorcycle earlier in the shift. I recall asking the employee of 1Republik to get the owner of the motorcycle from inside the establishment, to which Mr. Zapata then walked out of the front door of 1Republik. I recalled that Mr. Zapata made comments in regards to why he failed to register the motorcycle "Inflation is hard, I don't have the money right now". Followed by, "You're not going to arrest me for DWI while I move my bike, are you?". I recalled that Mr. Zapata was wearing a black and white leather motorcycle jacket as well that had the words Alpine on it. I issued Mr. Zapata a verbal warning for the violations, to which Mr. Zapata resolved the parking violation by moving his motorcycle to a proper parking spot.

While I was speaking with Officer Perez, I was informed by Dispatcher Hrubes that Lyndhurst Police Department found the motorcycle abandoned on Newark Avenue directly across from 321 Newark Avenue. They also discovered a black and white leather motorcycle jacket and a helmet abandoned on the street near the motorcycle. I responded to the scene and made contact with Lyndhurst Police Lieutenant Holicki #101 (Lyndhurst Case #2025-08511). Lt. Holicki indicated to me that Officer Walker #132 was in the area when I was attempting to stop the motorcycle and found it shortly after I abandoned my attempt to stop the motorcycle on New Jersey Avenue. Lt. Holicki said that Officer Walker then lost the motorcycle on the side streets of Lyndhurst. Officer Walker continued to check the area where he found it parked facing the wrong way of Newark Avenue. Officer Walker also indicated that there was damage to the motorcycle which appeared to be fresh. Lyndhurst Police deployed their K-9 who performed a scent track from the motorcycle. When I observed the motorcycle, I was able to immediately identify the motorcycle as the same motorcycle that I attempted to stop. I was then brought over to the leather jacket and helmet that was found near the motorcycle. I immediately recognized the black leather jacket as the jacket that was worn by Mr. Zapata when I saw him exit 1Republik. I specifically remember the white and black letters of "Alpine" which stood out to me because I recalled thinking about the town of Alpine NJ at that time. I secured the jacket and helmet from the location and brought it back to police headquarters as evidence. Photographs of the jacket and helmet were taken and uploaded to evidence.com. Sgt. Feola also entered the property into the B.E.A.S.T. and then stored in the temporary locker. Lyndhurst Police advised me that they were going to impound the motorcycle (Nick's Towing) as the registration was expired.

While I was on scene in Lyndhurst, Officer Perez responded to Mr. Zapata's home address (116 Daniel Avenue, Rutherford, NJ). Officer Perez spoke with Mr. Zapata's mother who stated that Mr. Zapata was not home and did not know where he was. Rutherford Police stayed near the residence to wait for Mr. Zapata to return back to his residence. While Rutherford Police was at the location, they thought they observed someone in the rear of the residence, as well as a light come on inside the house a short time later. This information was relayed to Dispatcher Hrubes who informed Lt. Stec. Officer Perez returned back to 116 Daniel Avenue and spoke to the mother again. The mother insisted that Mr. Zapata was not home, and attempted to call Mr. Zapata on his cell phone, which went to voicemail 3 times.

Narrative On Tuesday May 13th, 2025, at 1939 hours, I was advised by Dispatcher Hrubes that Kearny Police (Case #25-18836) attempted to stop a motorcycle (NY registration [REDACTED] Vin: [REDACTED], 2024 ZhiLo Exp: 04/2025), which eluded a motor vehicle stop. Dispatcher Hrubes advised me that Kearny Police discontinued the attempt to stop the moped as it entered our jurisdiction going north on Schuyler Avenue. Dispatcher Hrubes was provided with NY registration [REDACTED] by Kearny Police Department. I was on Ridge Road when the call went out and proceeded to Schuyler Avenue using Canterbury Avenue. As I turned south on to Schuyler Avenue from Canterbury Avenue, I observed a motorcycle approaching me (Traveling north on Schuyler Avenue), that matched the description of the vehicle given by dispatch. I observed as the driver of the motorcycle was not wearing his helmet and his face was completely visible. As the motorcycle passed me, I observed a dark-skinned male with facial hair and bald/short hair. I also observed the operator of the motorcycle was wearing a black hoodie or jacket. As the motorcycle passed me, I quickly checked the back of the motorcycle and observed that it had New York Registration. I turned around and caught up with the motorcycle on Schuyler Avenue just before Canterbury Avenue. I confirmed that the motorcycle in front of me displayed the same registration that was given to me by Dispatcher Hrubes. I activated my vehicle's (V2) emergency overhead lights and siren in order to initiate a motor vehicle stop. In response, the motorcycle drove over the double yellow line and into oncoming traffic to pass 3 vehicles. I observed as the operator the motorcycle (Later identified as Mr. Lookenso Volmar of [REDACTED] East Orange, NJ 07017), took his left hand off the handlebar of the motorcycle, extended his left arm away from his body, and with a fist displayed, extended his middle finger outwards making it stiff and obvious at my observation point. I acknowledged this as Mr. Volmar's understanding that I was attempting to make a motor vehicle stop, and his refusal to comply with my signal to stop his motorcycle. I advised Dispatcher Hrubes that I located the motorcycle and was attempting to perform a motor vehicle stop. I was still behind the motorcycle, but at this point about a block behind it (Due to navigating traffic). As

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I approached the intersection of Schuyler Avenue and Kingsland Avenue in Lyndhurst, I disabled my emergency lights and siren to discontinue my attempted motor vehicle stop. I observed as Mr. Volmar approached the intersection of Schuyler Avenue and Orient Way. Mr. Volmar then made a right turn on to Orient way, still driving northbound. I advised Dispatcher Hrubes that I was discontinuing my attempt to stop the motorcycle and told him that I last observed him at the intersection of Orient Way and Valley Brook Avenue in Lyndhurst. At that time, I began returning back to town.

As I was returning to town, I was advised by Dispatcher Hrubes that Lyndhurst Police Department had located the motorcycle on Valley Brook Avenue and was attempting to stop it (Case #25-09251). Lyndhurst continued to attempt to stop the motorcycle when they asked for assistance once the motorcycle entered Hillside Cemetery (742 Rutherford Avenue, Lyndhurst, NJ 07071). I immediately made my way over there to assist Lyndhurst. As I arrived on location, I was advised that the motorcycle was now on 5th Avenue traveling westbound. After hearing this information, I decided to return back to town and advised Lt. Stec.

When I arrived back at police headquarters (214 Ridge Road, North Arlington, NJ 07031) Dispatcher Hrubes had a DL picture up of Mr. Volmar. I immediately recognized Mr. Volmar as the driver of the motorcycle and said that was him. I was advised that Mr. Volmar had received motor vehicle summons from Newark Police Department recently while operating that exact motorcycle. Lt. Stec was advised that I was able to identify the operator of the motorcycle. A complaint-warrant was generated (0239-W-2025-000041) charging Mr. Volmar with 2C:29-2B - Eluding. I also issued the following motor vehicle summons:

Motor vehicle summons were mailed to his address listed on his driver's license. Dispatcher Hrubes entered the warrant for Mr. Volmar in NCIC (NIC #W451876987). I was also advised that Kearny Police Department and Lyndhurst Police Department (NCIC NIC #W951905389) also issued complaint warrants for this incident. I also completed a motor vehicle pursuit reporting for using the Benchmark Analytics website.

I cleared the call, and no further police action was taken at this time.
