On Wednesday 2/23/22, at 0915 hours, I responded to 730 Lynnwood Ave. (Visitation Church) for a criminal mischief report. The caller [REDACTED] reported his church had been vandalized sometime overnight.

I met with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] reported that an unknown suspect had broken three frames of plexiglass located on the front porch of the church. [REDACTED] believes the damage occurred between 2200 hours on 2/22/22 and 0800 hours on 02/23/22.

Each frame damaged was approximately 3' x 5' and valued at approximately \$150.00 each. It appears the damage was from the inside to the outside, as broken pieces of the plexiglass were located on the ground outside of each frame. Access to the front porch is opened and easily accessed by walking up stairs and under an overhang.

Two bricks were located on the steps, under the overhang, near the damaged plexiglass frames. They were neatly placed next to each other and appeared to have been taken out of nearby landscaping located in front of the church porch. It's possible they were used to cause the damage on the plexiglass.

In addition to the damaged plexi glass frames, [REDACTED] reported locating a storm drain lid that was lifted and removed from the drain. That drain is located on the west side of the church, between the church and the parking lot.

[REDACTED] and I were able to place the storm drain lid back onto the storm drain. I also placed the two bricks back into the nearby landscaping that they were removed from.

[REDACTED] advised me that there were peaceful protestors marching in front of the church on 2/22/22. He also stated news channels had interviewed him on 2/22/22 in reference to a real estate deal the church may be acting on. He was unsure if the damage was related to the ongoing real estate transaction that so many neighbors are upset with.

[REDACTED] requested additional patrols of the church.

A case number was provided to [REDACTED].
