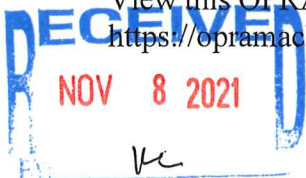

A 30-day selective enforcement plan was developed for Wescott Road as a result of the complaint of speeding vehicles by several residents near the Bills Lane intersection. The plan consisted of the following:

- The traffic counter device was placed on Wescott Road for a period of (4) weeks. (2) weeks the counter was located on the south portion of the road near Bills Lane. (2) weeks the counter was located on the north portion of the road near Erindale Drive. Results are documented under Special Report 2021-1127.
- Patrol conducted radar enforcements (2) times per day on weekdays. The first post took place from 7am-9am. The second post took place from 2pm-3pm.
- A marked decoy police vehicle was placed on Wescott Road. The vehicle was moved to a different location on the roadway (3) times per week.

Crime Analyst Kyle Moyer conducted an analysis of the detail with the following results:

- 61 incident reports were completed for individual radar enforcement details.
- 13 motor vehicle stops were conducted.
- 3 summonses were issued.
- 73.8 officer-hours were utilized on the event.
